JIM: Uh-huh. 4 5 DAVID: He reserveth wrath and reserves means he's holding it, right? 6 7 JIM: Uh-huh. 8 DAVID: For his what? 9 JIM: His enemies. 10 DAVID: His enemies, yeah. Now, you know, like I told you, I said the Lord told me to wait, 11 12 right? 13 JIM: Uh-huh. 14 The Lord is slow to anger and great 15 in power and will not at all acquit the wicked. like you, there's no way you would ever acquit me, 16 17 okay. So, likewise --18 JIM: Well, you --19 DAVID: Likewise. Those who do wickedly, God 20 is not acquitting them even though they're still allowed to be free as it seems. The Lord hath his way 21 in the whirldwind. In Jeremiah 31 it says the fierce 22 anger of the Lord shall not return until he's performed 23 the intents of his heart. That's Psalm 45, right, my 24 heart is inditing a good matter. Remember that? 25 JIM: Uh-huh.

1 So, in the latter days you shall 2 consider it perfectly. That's what you, you guys are 3 That's what everyone that heard the radio program the other night were given a chance to do, they 5 were given a chance to consider, to consider what I was 6 saying which is what God says in the book. Now, okay, 7 and in the storm of the clouds of the dust of his feet, he rebuketh the sea and maketh it dry, dried up all the 8 rivers. Bashan, languiseth, Carmel, the flower of 9 10 Lebanon languisheth. 11 The mountains quake at him and the hills The earth is burned at his presence. Yea, the 12 13 world and all that dwell therein. So, it's a worldwide event, isn't it? 14 15 JIM: Yeah, I suppose. 16 Pretty hot, right. So, the prophet says who can stand before his indignation. Who can 17 18 abide in fierceness of his anger. His fury is poured 19 out like fire and the rocks are thrown down by him. 20 So, you know, that's one aspect of God, isn't 21 it? 22 Uh-huh. JIM: 23 DAVID: But it says that the Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble and he knows them 24

that trust in him. But with an over running flood, he

will make an utter end of the place thereof and

25

darkness shall pursue his enemies. See, his enemies won't know about this, will they? Right? The enemies 2 3 won't know the meaning of this prophecy, will they? 4 No, I don't guess they will. 5 DAVID: No. So, God questions by saying, 6 what do you imagine against the Lord? Now, what do you guys think you're doing? He will make an utter end. 7 8 Affliction shall not rise up the second time. 9 yeah, okay, come on, come on out, Dave. Let's go up 10 here to the, to the modern day, present day, you know, 11 politicians, right. Well, see, God's gathering the 12 people together, isn't he? There's some enemies in this vision. For while they be folden together as 13 thorns and while they are drunken as drunkards -- these 14 15 people are out of their mind -- they shall be devoured 16 as stubble fully dry. 17 There is one come out of thee that imagineth evil against the Lord, a wicked counsellor. 18 Now, who 19 are they imagining evil against? 20 JIM: The Lord? 21 DAVID: The Lord. And what's their counsel? 22 It's wicked, isn't it? 23 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Thus saith say the Lord, though they 24 be quiet and likewise many -- even though there's a 25 bunch of these guys, right --

JIM: Right.

DAVID: -- yet thus shall they be cut down when he shall pass through. God is going to knock them out, isn't he?

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: Though I have afflicted thee, I will afflict thee no more. He's talking about God's people now.

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: For now will I break his yoke from off thee and will burst thy bonds asunder. So, in this vision, there's a people that trust in God and yet they kind of have a yoke on their neck, don't they?

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: This belligerent power here, though there's many of them, they have to be dealt with by God, don't they? And the Lord hath given commandment concerning thee, that no more thy name be sown out of the house of thy gods will I cut off thy graven image and the molten image. I'll make thy grave for thou are vile.

Now, here comes the prophecy of Messiah.

Behold upon the mountains the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace. O Judah, keep thy solemn feasts, perform thy vows, for the wicked shall no more pass through the, he is utterly cut off.

1 So, the Gospel, the good news is to who, the 2 wicked or to the people that trust in God? Okay. what about these people that trust in God? Chapter 2 3 4 begins to explain. He that dasheth in pieces -- right? 5 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Which is the belligerent power, has come up before thy face. What does God say for these 8 9 people to do, keep the what? 10 JIM: Munition. 11 What's munition? It's ammunition, isn't it? 12 13 JIM: I'm sure it is. 14 DAVID: Watch the way, make thy loins strong, 15 fortify thy power how? Mightily. The Lord hath turned away the ecstacy of Jacob. You know, God's people, 16 17 they don't look too good, do they, as the excellency of Israel, for the emptiers have emptied them out, and 18 marred their vine branches. 19 20 The shield of the mighty men is made red. 21 You know, people use shields, don't they? 22 JIM: Uh-hum. 23 DAVID: And the valiant men are in scarlet. 24 So, you know, people got hurt the other day, didn't 25 they?

JIM: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Now, it says something funny here about these certain chariots that these men will be 2 riding in. 3 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 It says the chariots shall be with 6 flaming torches. Flaming torches? What's that? 7 JIM: Well, what is that? 8 DAVID: Huh. In the day of his preparation, the fir trees shall be terribly shaken. Hum. 9 I guess, I guess that's what their knocking over out here across 10 the property, there are fir trees, huh? 11 It says the chariots shall rage in the 12 streets, they shall justle one against another in the 13 broad ways, they shall seem like torches, they shall 14 run like the lightnings. These things can go pretty 15 16 fast, can't they? Huh? JIM: I don't know, David, I've never been in 17 18 one. 19 DAVID: Well, the thing of it is is that these flaming torches are guns, you know that? 20 21 JIM: Oh, I see. 22 The prophet is trying to explain to DAVID: you when these prophecies meet their fulfillment when 23 they fight against the Lord. Now, what happens is the 24 belligerent power kind of loses one round, a simple 25 round, but then it says, he shall recount his worthies,

you know. They reorganize. 2 JIM: uh-huh. 3 DAVID: But they shall stumble in their walk, they shall make haste to the wall thereof, and the 4 5 defence shall be prepared. 6 And then it goes, the gates of the rivers 7 shall be opened, and the palace shall be dissolved. 8 And Huzzab shall be led away captive. Now, I 9 know you don't realize what this is talking about, but 10 Huzzab means that which is established. And she shall 11 be brought up, and her maids shall lead her with her voice of doves, tabering upon their breasts. 12 13 But Ninevah is of old like a pool of water, 14 stale, stagnate. Yet they shall flee away. stand, shall they cry, but none shall look back. 15 16 What happens? How come this power who seems to be so well outfitted with jostling chariots and 17 flaming torches and all that, that can make trees 18 shake, how come all of a sudden they end up having to 19 20 run for. 21 And then all of a sudden it says, take ye the 22 spoil of silver, take the spoil of gold. There is no 23 end to their store and the glory out of the pleasant furniture. 24

She is empty, and void, and waste, and the heart melteth, and all knees smite together. Who's

25

scared now? Much pain is in all loins, and all faces 2 of them gather blackness. 3 I mean these guys must be really terrified. 4 What happens? - Where is the dwelling of the lions and the 5 feeding place of the young lions. You know, these, 6 these, these, people, wicked people, they thought 7 they're tough, didn't they? You know, how people have 8 9 this lion character and all that? 10 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Where is the lion, even the old lion 11 that walked, and the lion's whelp, and none made them afraid? 13 The lion did tear in pieces enough for his 14 15 whelps, and strangled for his lionesses. I mean isn't that what most people do, is provide for their 16 17 families? 18 JIM: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: Isn't it? 20 JIM: Uh-huh. 21 Filled his holes with prey, and his DAVID: dens with ravin. Huh. See, God uses symbols sometimes 22 to reveal natures of men. What does God say about 23 24 these people with flaming torches? Behold, I am against thee, saith the Lord of 25 hosts. Remember the father in heaven?

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And I will burn her chariots in the smoke, and the sword shall devour the young lions. You know, these big tough guys. And I will cut off thy prey from off the earth, and the voice of my messenger shall be heard -- no more be heard.

Woe to the bloody city. It is full of lies and robbery and the prey departeth not.

Noise of a whip, and the noise of the rattling of the wheels, prancing horses, and of the jumping chariots.

The horseman lifteth up both the bright sword and the glittering spear. You know, what, what, what is all this? You know, these prophecies don't make much sense, do they?

JIM: Well, I'm trying to understand. Go ahead.

DAVID: The great number of carcases. There is a number, a multitude of slain, and a great number of carcases, and there is no end of their corpses, they stumble upon their corpses. Why, why do these people lose for?

Because of the multitude of the whoredoms of the well favoured harlot, the mistress of witchcrafts, that sell nations through her whoredoms and families through her witchcraft.

Have you ever heard of Babylon the Great? 1 2 JIM: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: Yeah, that's what this prophecy is 4 talking about. Behold, I am against thee, saith the Lord of 5 hosts, and I will discover thy skirts upon my face, and 6 I will show the nations thy nakedness and the kingdoms 7 thy shame. 9 You know, there's no nation that's been given greater privileges than the United States of America. 10 It's supposed to protect its people. It's supposed to 11 have an ear to listen and to learn. It's supposed to 12 have freedoms to be able to know the word of God and 13 what God states. You know, In God We Trust, it says on 14 the currency, doesn't it? 15 16 JIM: Yeah. 17 DAVID: But if they don't really know what God states, they're going to misunderstand. 18 19 And I will cast abominable filth upon thee and make thee vile, and I will set thee as a gazing 20 stock. 21 22 And it shall come to pass, that all they that look upon thee shall flee from thee, and say, Nineveh 23 is laid waste, who will bemoan her? Whence shall I 24 25 seek comforters for thee?

Art thou better than populous No. No was an

ancient city. 2 JIM: Uh-huh. 3 DAVID: Populous means it's just highly populated. 4 5 - JIM: Uh-huh. 6 DAVID: This place was situated among the 7 rivers, that had the waters round about it, whose 8 rampart was the sea, and her wall was from the sea. 9 You know, it was really highly fortified. 10 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Ethiopia and Egypt were her strength. 11 They were their allies. And it was infinite. 12 Put and Lubim were thy helpers. But what happened? 13 14 Yet was she carried away and went into 15 captivity. Her young children were also dashed in pieces at the top of all the streets and they cast lots 16 upon the honourable men and all her great men were 17 bound in chains. 18 19 So, you know, a lot of empires think they're 20 really tough, don't they? 21 But it says here, by Nineveh, it says, thou also shall be drunken. You know, they're out of their 22 23 minds. 24 JIM: Uh-huh. 25 DAVID: Thou shall be hid, thou also shall seek strength because of the enemy.

Do you know who the enemy is? God. 1 make God their enemy. 2 3 JIM: Huh. 4 DAVID: All thy strongholds shall be like fig trees with the first ripe figs, if they be shaken, 5 shall even fall into the mouth of the eater. 6 7 That's easy, isn't it, to knock all their 8 power out, huh? 9 Behold, thy people in the midst of thee are women, and the gates of thy land shall be set wide open 10 unto thine enemies, the fire shall devour thy bars. 11 12 You know who brings that fire, don't you? God does. Remember in Psalms 18 where it talked about 13 Messiah saying that his enemies were too strong for 14 him? 15 16 JIM: Uh-huh, yeah. 17 They start -- they, they, they destroy him. And it says that they prevented me the 18 day of my calamity. And it says, the heavens depart 19 20 and God comes down and hits them with fire and 21 brimestone. 22 Uh-huh. JIM: 23 DAVID: But that's not the end of the world, It takes place before the end of the world. 24 though. 25 Draw thee waters for the siege, fortify thy strongholds, go into the clay and tread the morter,

make strong thy brickklin. 2 There shall the fire devour thee, the sword 3 shall cut thee off. It shall eat thee up like the cankerworm, make thyself many as the cankerworm, make 4 thyself many as the locusts. 5 6 In other words, you know, it's kind of like, oh, they can multiply as much as they want to, right? 7 JIM: Uh-huh. 8 9 DAVID: This, this harlot here, it says, thou 10 hast multiplied thy merchants above the stars of These, these people got so much -- don't 11 Hum. 12 they? The cankerworm spoileth and fleeth away. 13 Thy crowned are as the locusts, and thy captains as the grasshoppers. 14 There's too many people in charge, isn't there? A lot of leaders in this 15 16 country, huh? 17 Uh-huh. JIM: 18 DAVID: Called Ninevah in prophecy. Which camp in the hedges in the cold day. I mean, you know, 19 they're, they're all out there in the fields and 20 21 everything. They're all out there hiding and creeping down behind the bushes, right, trying to stay warm. 22 But when the sun ariseth. 23 24 You ever heard of the day spring, Jim? 25 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Peter says prophecy will be a light

that shines in a dark place until the day dawn and a day spring arise in your heart. Not unless you know the mystery of the God, that God declared to service the prophets, will you understand these mysteries.

Yet when the sun ariseth, they shall flee away and their place is not known where they are.

Thy shepherds slumber, O king of Assyria.

You think all these preachers and teachers of this
country can show you the Seven Seals? Uh-uh. They're
sleeping.

And thy nobles shall dwell in the dust, thy people are scattered upon the mountains and no man gathereth them.

There is no healing for thy bruise, thy wound is grievous. All that hear the bruit of thee shall clap the hands over thee, for upon whom hath not thy wickedness passed continually?

You know, a person read a prophecy like this and they say to me, they say, Dave, I don't understand that prophecy. Well, naturally, because, first of all, we have to figure out how this is good news. You know, people always talk about the Gospel, Jesues' good news, right?

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And they emphasize and magnify one point. But on the other hand, they deny that the good

news is that if we are with God, God is the one that finishes the battle. If we are not with the God that's foretold this things, then we're the ones who end up being destroyed. All the prophets talk about an event in latter days where someone is to bring good tidings to publish his peace. But that peace and those good tidings are found in one book, the Revelation of Jesus Christ -- of the time when Christ will return again.

Now, who are this heathen that rage? Who are the ones that bring the jostling chariots with flaming torches? Who are they? Well, we know they're not God's people, right? They're the people of the world, the people that know not God. Okay.

That being the case, then, is there any hope at all for maybe them to reconsider their position? It may be obvious, according to the judgment of the eye that a person may be crazy or a person may be a cult leader. We know what the world said about Christ for the longest time, don't we? No one 2000 years ago believed in Christ, did they? And the Book of Acts, the Jew says to Paul, yeah, we've heard of this act, for everywhere it is evil spoken of. But when the truth or the -- truth is lost sight of, then after awhile even the little simple controversies of old time become traditional.

I mean, you know, bang, bang, bang. 6 7 In the presence of his preparation. The fir trees be 8 mind, terribly shaken. I mean, you know, don't you 9 think a tank can make a big boom? 10 JIM: Yeah, but it would have to have a gun on it, though. We don't have guns on those. 11 12 DAVID: What are those things sticking out 13 the front, Jim? Are you sure you're getting complete 14 communication with these guys? 15 I'll tell you what, I'll double check. JIM: 16 DAVID: Okay. 17 JIM: Okay. Go ahead. 18 The chariots shall rage in the DAVID: 19 streets, they shall jostle one against another in the 20 broad ways. That's what they sound like. You see, the prophet can only tell you what he saw. He'd never seen 21 22 one of these things in his days. He can only explain it, you know, from the way he saw it in his day. They 23 seem like torches. They shall -- I mean they look like 24 -- I mean they're not really torches with fire but they 25 have a fire that comes out of them, don't they?

1 Yeah, uh-huh. JIM: 2 They shall run like the -- they're 3 fast. 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 DAVID: You know, like the prophet is trying to tell you, he said like this is what I saw in vision. 6 7 He shall recount his worthies. In other words, you have to sometimes gather up your men. And 8 it says, they shall stumble in their walk. 9 happens? Generally, when people stumble in their walk, 10 11 it means they kind of fall, don't it? 12 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Oh, Jim. Like I say, I usually give 13 -- people say that don't want to hear me, they say I 14 brainwash, but I give, I give two weeks of study to 15 most of my students, just to get them familiar with the 16 17 prophetic terminologies. 18 JIM: Uh-huh. 19 DAVID: And there are prophecies that are very, very clear to understand which did not give as 20 thorough detail. There are prophecies that, that do 21 22 not give as much detail but, but the keynote of all of this is that when there's time no longer, there's a 23 24 mystery of God, something God has hid, that's to be 25 finished. I mean there's something God's going to do,

right?

1 JIM: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: Right? 3 JIM: Uh-Huh. DAVID: And he declared it to who? Well, you 4 know, the next book over there is Habakkuk, right? 5 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 Then it says, it says right here, it DAVID: says the prophet sees, in Verse 2, he says, Lord, how 8 long will I cry, and thou will not hear even crying to 9 10 thee of what? 11 JIM: Violence. 12 DAVID: And thou wilt not what? 13 JIM: Save. 14 DAVID: Why dost thou shew me iniquity, and cause me to behold grievance? For spoiling and 15 violence are before me. I mean this, this sounds --16 this is violence, you know. The prophet sees a 17 terrible event, don't he? 18 19 JIM: Uh-huh. 20 DAVID: For there are that rise up strife and 21 what? Contention. 22 JIM: Uh-huh. 23 DAVID: I mean there's some people involved in this prophecy that are given some real hell, aren't 24 25 there?

JIM: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Therefore the law is what? Slacked. And judgment doth never go forth, for the wicked doth 2 3 compass about the what? 4 JIM: Righteous. 5 DAVID: So, the righteous are in one situation. Who's gathering around them? The wicked. 6 7 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Now, the people on the outside that 8 are watching this, they're being, you know, -- the good 9 guys are on the inside. The bad guys are gathered 10 around them, and the people around them, which are the 11 -- of the world, they're judging this. And it says, 12 13 therefore wrong judgment proceedeth, right? 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Huh. It's kind of like we're on the 16 inside, you boys are on the outside, you know, and everyone else is beyond you all. They're, they're 17 having to -- trying to figure out what's going on, 18 don't they? 19 20 Behold ye among the heathen and regard and wonder marvelously. Yeah, see, you don't know what's 21 going on, Jim. You're wondering what this is all 22 about, aren't you? 23 For I will work a work in your days, which 24 you will not believe, though it be told you. 25

Now, what's this all about?

1 For I raise up the Chaldeans, that bitter and 2 hasty nation. Hasty, oh, boy, they move quick. Who are the Chaldeans? Ancient Babylon. Let me tell you 3 about the Chaldeans. It's the same spirit that was --4 remember that image, the well favoured harlot? 5 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 The world and the spirit thereof? DAVID: 8 JIM: Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: Huh. Well, you see, if God punishes 10 a man for being a certain way 5000 years ago, he'll punish a man today for being the same way. So, you 11 just transfer the same spirit. 12 13 JIM: Hum. DAVID: But in the days of the -- that's when 14 Babylon is going to fall -- revelation, Babylon the 15 Great, the real harlot. That's why the image is --16 17 see, it brings the fall of the real Babylon. 18 Anyway, it says, they shall march through the breadth of the land, to possess the dwellings that are 19 20 not their's. 21 They are terrible and dreadful. judgment and their dignity shall proceed of themselves. 22 23 You think these people fear God? Do you think they judge after God's judgment? Do you think 24 they care about God's judgment, the Book? Do you think 25

they care about the one who brings that Book? Do you?

1 JIM: No. 2 DAVID: No, they don't. They don't know nothing about it, do they? 3 JIM: Uh-huh. 4 DAVID: They're supposed to wonder, aren't 5 they? Now, it says, their horses are swifter than 6 leopards. Now, these aren't real horses. 7 remember, the prophet is trying to explain to you 8 9 something, right? 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And he's never seen any of these things before, has he? 12 13 JIM: Right. 14 DAVID: I mean he sees men -- he recognizes 15 He sees men traveling and things but I mean like their moving with great speed. In the days of 16 Habakkuk, they were using horses, mules, things like 17 18 that, right? 19 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: But he says, their horses are swifter 20 than leopards. I mean leopards are fast. And are more 21 fierce than the evening wolves. Now, horses aren't 22 23 fierce. 24 JIM: Uh-huh. 25 DAVID: But it depends on if we're talking about some kind of vehicle that's dangerous.

1 JIM: Uh-huh. 2 DAVID: And their horsemen shall spread 3 themselves and their horsemen shall come from far and they shall fly as the eagle that hasteth to eat. 4 5 They all come for what reason? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Violence. Their faces shall sup up as the east wind, and they shall gather the captivity 8 9 as the sand. 10 They scoff at the kings. The princes are a scorning to them. They shall deride every strong hold. 11 They shall heap up dust and take it. 12 13 Then shall his mind change, and he shall pass over and offend. Who does he end up offending? 14 big tough person here offends God because he thinks 15 that his God has power to offend the God he's offended. 16 17 Imputing this his power unto his God. Well, what happens, I wonder. Let's see 18 The prophet says, art thou not from everlasting, 19 here. O Lord my God, mine Holy One? We shall not die. O 20 Lord, thou has ordained them for what? 21 Judgment. 22 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: O mighty God, thou hast established 23 them for what? They're fixing to get what? 24 25 JIM: Correction. DAVID: A big whooping from who? From God,

1 right? 2 JIM: Right, uh-huh. 3 DAVID: Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil, and canst not look on iniquity, wherefore look or 4 why do you look upon them that deal treacherously, and 5 holdest thy tongue when the wicked devoureth the man 6 that is more righteous than he? 7 8 Wonder who this man he is. Huh. like one group is devouring this one guy, huh? 9 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And he's more righteous than they, 12 right? 13 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: You know, there's nothing more 14 righteous than the truth that God sits on the throne 15 and that's your father, Jim, do you know that? 16 17 JIM: Yes, uh-huh. DAVID: And your father gave the lamb, your 18 19 brother, a book with Seven Seals. 20 JIM: Uh-huh. 21 DAVID: Right? 22 JIM: Right. 23 DAVID: And he's going to come in latter days. And the only way you'll know him is if he can 24 show you the seals out of the book, right? 25 JIM: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Anyway, the prophet complains that 2 God has allowed it to where he makes men as the fishes of the sea, and as the creeping things -- there's a lot 3 4 of them, isn't there? 5 JIM: Uh-huh. 6 That have no ruler over -- they all 7 do their own thing, right? 8 JIM: Right. 9 They take up all of them with the DAVID: angle and they catch them in their net, and gather them 10 in their drag. Therefore, they rejoice and are glad. 11 12 He says the nature of men is kind of like everyone's got like a hook for everybody else, right? 13 14 JIM: Right. Wait, show me where you are. I, 15 I lost --16 DAVID: The verse is 15. 17 JIM: Okay, yeah, I got it. 18 DAVID: He talks about, you know, about Verse 19 14 --20 JIM: Right. 21 DAVID: -- makes men as, you know, --22 JIM: Fishes of the sea. 23 And everyone is out to get something 24 from somebody else, right? 25 JIM: Right, uh-huh. DAVID: And they're all with a fishing hook

and an angle. That's what an angler lure is, you know, 1 he's got a fishing hook and a drag is a net. 2 3 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Therefore, they rejoice and they're 4 5 glad cause they get, they get gain from this. Therefore, they sacrifice unto their net and burn 6 incense unto their drag. Because by them, by these 7 tools, they're portion is fat. In other words, they 8 get rich, don't they? 9 10 JIM: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: And their meat plenteous. It's kind of like today, you know, when you're going to high 12 school. You buy your nice new car, right? 13 14 JIM: Right. DAVID: Why? So, you can get nice pretty 15 16 girls, right? 17 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: So, you'll sacrifice for things that 18 19 you want to get other things. Shall they therefore empty their net and not 20 21 spare continually to slay the nations? 22 You see, God contends that Babylon -- that 23 the merchants are the -- of the earth. 24 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: Can buy their sorceries nations of 25 In other words, always trying to get, get,

get, get, get. They don't have time to think about what really is at hand.

Well, the prophet of Hababbuk says, I will stand upon my watch. So, you know, supposed to way the way, Nahum says, right?

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And set me upon the tower, and will watch to see what he will say unto me, that is this belligerent power, the Chaldeans, the Babylonians, and what I shall answer when I am reproved.

Because, you know, these people, their dignity proceeds from themself. They're big shots. They're of the world. They don't nothing about God or his seals. So, you know, the prophet says that he's going to probably be reproved by them.

The Lord answered me, and said, write the vision and make it plain upon tables. Why? That he may run that what? Readeth it.

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: In other words, for instance, if you really understood these prophecies and all these, you know, young men and stuff driving around in all these little buggies around here, you know, with those flaming torches and stuff, if this country really knew what was fixing to happen, they would run.

JIM: Uh-huh.

DAVID: For the vision is yet for an 1 appointed time, but at the end it shall speak and not 2 lie. So, we're here. 3 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 DAVID: Though it tarry, wait for it because it will surely come. It will not tarry. 6 7 JIM: What, what will happen? DAVID: Well, let's find out. 8 This is to bring down the pride of the last nation that's apart. 9 You see, God is going to resurrect all the men that have ever lived on the face of the earth. You know 11 12 that, don't you? 13 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: And those who neglected to take heed 14 to God's warnings through our prophecy, have in their 15 day been able to live their lives with no retribution 16 17 from God. 18 JIM: Uh-huh. DAVID: But their sins are still marked 19 20 against their name. 21 JIM: Uh-huh. 22 DAVID: So, God, likes to take the wicked and their pride so that when they are resurrected, guess 23 who they get to face? The one that came to save him is 24 25 the one that's going to destroy him.

JIM: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Wickedness will not rise up in the second time. No more affliction this time. Okay, now, 2 here's the key. 3 4 Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not 5 upright in him. 6 The proud and the arrogant, those who are always just doing something for their personal gain and 7 not -- are looking to God and to his word and to this 8 throne, they are going to be punished. 9 10 But the just shall live by his what? Faith. 11 Now, my faith is in God who sits on a throne. And my father gave me Seven Seals. Now, I do 12 everything that I can to try to teach them in these 13 Seven Seals. 14 15 But there are other people in the world -yes, also, because he trangresseth by wine. He is a 16 proud man, neither keepeth at home, who enlargeth his 17 desire as hell and is as death and cannot be satisfied 18 but gathereth unto him all nations -- he would -- all 19 20 people. 21 You know, you know who the real prince in 22 this world is? Satan. That's what Isaiah 14 tells 23 you. 24 JIM: Uh-huh. 25 And you know how Satan rules the Through men. What did Satan promise Christ if

Christ would worship him? Promised him the kingdoms, 2 didn't he? Uh-huh. 3 JIM: 4 DAVID: Promised him authority. Promised him 5 power, right? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: And Satan does this to all men. These people are considered in the scripture as drunk. 8 They're out of their minds. Because, you see, 9 transgressing God's law and denying God's offers of 10 mercy is worst than anything a man could ever do 11 12 because God's above Satan. 13 Shall not all these take up a parable against him and a taunting proverb against him and say, woe to 14 him that increaseth that which is not his. How long 15 and to him that ladeth himself with thick clay. 16 These people make themselves little idols, 17 18 don't they? 19 Shall they not rise up suddenly that shall bite thee. 20 21 Now, on the front of our property out here, there's a flag. Have you heard about it yet? 22 23 JIM: Yeah, uh-huh. 24 DAVID: Okay. Now, on that flag, there's a star of David and there's a silver serpent. 25 There's Seven Seals there. There's a snake there.

It says here, shall they not rise up suddenly 1 2 that shall bite thee. 3 Remember when the children of Israel were doing wrong, how that serpents were sent throughout the 4 5 camp and bit them? 6 JIM: Uh-huh. 7 DAVID: Remember that story? 8 JIM: Yeah, uh-huh. 9 DAVID: Okay. That Moses was told to raise 10 up our brazen serpent --JIM: Uh-huh. 11 12 DAVID: -- and he held him. Okay. So, 13 Christ is that snake, isn't he? 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Well, in Isaiah 14, God says, for the 16 heathen not to rejoice because he's going to bring 17 forth a cockatrice, which is a snake. And his fruit shall be a fire flying serpent, which talks about 18 little children. 19 20 Now, it says here that there are those that want to step on property that's not their's, right. 21 JIM: Uh-huh. 22 23 DAVID: They want to increase that which is not theirs. How long? And it says, shall they not 24 rise up suddenly that shall bite thee and awake that 25 shall vex thee, and thou shall become booties unto

them. Just like Nahum says. Nahum says that finally what happens is this belligerent power of the world finally steps on somebody's toes that they shouldn't step on. God's given them the whole world. He's given them all the power and glory that man could afford unto them. But, finally, there's one little group, one little remnant, and all they do is talk about Seven Seals, which is the knowledge of the authority of the heavens, you know.

JIM: Right.

DAVID: And it says that the heathen will regard and they'll wonder. They won't know what's going on. The prophets say the heathen will not understand. Daniel foretold the same event in the latter days. Daniel says, and there's a small remnant. Daniel says, the wicked will be doing wickedly and none of the wicked will understand but the righteous, they shall understand.

Now, it says here, thou shall become booties unto them.

In other words, everything in this great empire becomes the possessions of somebody else.

It says here, because thou hast spoiled many nations, all the remnant of the people shall spoil you because of men's blood and for the violence of the land, of the city, and of all that dwell therein.

to view is that the prophet sees that although it's powerful and dreadful, it still portrays the image of a 2 lamb, though it speaks as a dragon. 3 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 DAVID: And the Bible begins to explain to us 6 that there will come a time in the latter -- see, we are subject to the laws of our nations. 7 8 JIM: Uh-huh. 9 DAVID: As God told Israel to Jeremiah that when you go in amongst the heathen nations, you shall, 10 you know, you shall keep their laws and you shall obey, 11 you shall pray for the blessings of the city where the 12 Lord scatters you. Okay. So, you might have peace. 13 14 JIM: Uh-huh. 15 DAVID: Okay. But there comes a time when in the finality of all the empires a truth comes into the 16 world that determines or demands us to either keep 17 alliance to God and truth or to the dictates and laws 18 19 of man. We hear 3 about a person that has good tidings, you know. 4 JIM: Uh-huh. 5 It's kind of like in Jeremiah 50 and DAVID: It seems like it -- the fall of Babylon takes 6 7 place, when in Jeremiah 50 God says, that I have laid a 8 snare for thee, Babylon, and you will be taken unawares, for you will strive against the Lord. 9 10 That's just like Psalms 2 says. JIM: But there's been a lot of people now 23 saying, well, but he didn't do what he said, you know. 24 They starting to doubt, you know, that he didn't do 25 what he said. It's not even hardly a 10 beginning at all. I mean --11 Right. But, but, but out here, I mean, JIM: he's, he's the most sought after man in the country 12 from these reporters and the whole world out here 13 wanting to see when he comes out. 14 RACHEL: Yeah, good and bad, both. 15 16 JIM: Well, you know, some of them are just press hounds but if he comes out, you know, he's going 17 to be able to deliver his message. Everybody wants to 18 hear what's he got to say. 19 20 RACHEL: Oh, they do that kind of stuff in 21 jail, huh? 22 Well, they do it everywhere. Are you JIM: kidding? He's the biggest story in the world. 23 24 RACHEL: Well, tell me, what kind of -- I mean I heard there are, you know, a lot of reporters. 25 From what countries do they come? I know some come

from London. JIM: Well, there are, there are London, 2 Australia, New Zealand. I mean, I never saw so many --3 did you see that press conference at noon? I let David 4 -- I told -- did you see it? 5 6 RACHEL: Uh-huh. Yes. 7 JIM: Did you see all those people? 8 RACHEL: Well, how many do you think were in 9 there? 10 JIM: Oh, hundreds. 11 RACHEL: Well, I couldn't -- I didn't see that many then because, you know, they, they just show 12 shots of a big group of people, you know, they don't --13 I didn't see how many were in there, total. 14 15 JIM: It was hundreds. RACHEL: Cause what I saw was just a close-16 17 up. So, --JIM: CNN -- I mean NBC, ABC, CBS, BBC. 18 mean it, it was unbelievable. I've never seen that 19 20 many, many reporters. 21 RACHEL: Uh-huh. 22 And they were all out there on the JIM: 23 highway down there. 24 RACHEL: Uh-huh. 25 JIM: You know, waiting for you guys to walk It's, it's a major event for them, you know.

But, anyway, I -- you know, we don't control those 1 T.V., newspapers, magazines, all those radios. You 2 3 know that. RACHEL: You know, I just want to say they 4 said that we got a telephone call that tipped us off to 5 that -- you were coming and that, that's not true. 6 7 JIM: No, I know. Yeah. Well, they have a lot of inaccuracies, I think. And that's something 8 that David has been bothered with and you got to 9 understand that they do that, you know. 10 11 RACHEL: Uh-huh. 12 JIM: And, and that's another --13 RACHEL: Well, they said a lot of things just ` like the other night -- I don't remember what night it 14 15 was -- the buses left, right? 16 JIM: Uh-huh. 17 RACHEL: And they said that -- we thought we were on them. They thought that we had gone from here. 18 19 I mean --20 I know it. I know -- hey, I, I saw JIM: I went -- I saw that, too, when I turned 21 the T.V. on that night. And I was pretty down that 22 night because, you know, you guys didn't come out. And 23 I turned the T.V. on and there's a reporter saying, and 24 all the people come out on this bus here. 25

RACHEL: Uh-huh.

STEVE: 3 JIM KAVANAUGH: Well, you know, some of the 4 Catholics are funny about that and --5 STEVE: That's true. 6 JIM KAVANAUGH: -- and the Christians --7 they've changed a little now as you know, but the Christians seem to be a little bit more accepting and 8 9 the Catholics seem to care about all the rules, you 10 know. 11 STEVE: Right. 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: But, you know, I mean, you got to believe, it's just the way it is. 13 STEVE: Well, you know, we don't judge 14 15 anybody whether they do or don't. I mean we love 16 people and in honesty if they can't see things, you know we give them that credit and believe according to 17 18 Romans 2 and 3 that (indiscernible--interfering noise) much like came to them and what they did with their 19 20 opportunities. I believe one day, an honest seeker, if 21 he was agnostic, a buddhist, if he did the best he could with the light he had, God will be merciful in 22 23 that manner. This is what we've always taught and believe that now. We also believe that as in the days 24 25 of Noah, God was going to bring a judgement upon the world and the majority of the world said "no, you

won't," so he did. And, after the flood, God says I'll never destroy the world with a flood again, and he says, well yes you will. They built the Tower of Babel to and get away from a flood that would never come. So Christ matched twenty forces in the final days, he says, it wasn't in the days of Noah, that's when it will be the final days.

So in the last days, there's a message for people. There's to be an ark of safety, but where is it to be moved, what kind of an ark of safety. No wooden boat is going to help you and I in this generation of course. So this is what the Prophets all talk about. What God is going to offer for a way out. We're all sinners. I'm no better than anybody else in this world [gap] I've tried to be a Christian, I've tried this, tried that, but I've always loved truth. I've never said that I know Christ because my lifestyle doesn't show it even though I've tried for years.

JIM KAVANAUGH: Well, that's honesty Steve. Some people try to fool you and tell you, that they, that's why they don't see him, but that can't be.

STEVE: Well, I see a very high standard in Christianity when you look at the writings of Christ and you look at the writings of the Prophets and the Apostles. Like even John says those that are born again do not commit sin. So, that brings up a

question, well, if we sin are we born again? And then 1 2 you have a lot of Evangelicals running around saying, 3 hey, are you saved? Are you born again? They look at 4 me and I say to them, "I'm not, I'd like to be, but God 5 requires something. He tells us in the final days how you can become born again." It's found in Ezekiel 36 6 7 [gap] and the Apostles themselves for twelve years and 8 they ran, I mean for three years and they ran around 9 with Christ. They were people that fought for 10 position and they argued amongst themselves, but the 11 time came when they all ran away when he died. But 12 then when they were gathered together they finally 13 obeved --14 JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): Tell them to get 15 As soon as he stops rambling, I'm going to try 16 to negotiate two more kids. (indiscernible) something that never 17 STEVE: 18 happened to me -- tongues of fire lighting on the heads of these individuals. They went out and raised the 19 20 dead, healed the sick, and you know, it's not happening 21 anymore.

STEVE: But the Prophets foresaw that it didn't work two thousand years ago. It did for awhile, but it says in the final days of Revelation 13, this time Satan is going to work the miracles, and will

cause fire to come down out of Heaven which Elijah did 1 2 three thousand years ago, but this time it's not God behind it. So the only way we'll know the truth from a 3 faulty is by what the Book says in its entirety and its harmonization. So this is why we like to have people 5 have an opportunity. We don't claim to be able to do 6 any miracles. We're not Pentecostal. We try to be 7 very factual, not go by feelings. Everybody in all 8 religions have feelings, but you know, God is not 9 against that or anything. But, we look at the sure 10 word, what God says he's going to do. 11 12 JIM KAVANAUGH: Okay. 13 STEVE: It's going to be hard for the flesh, of course, but we'll try to hang in there and try to do 14 15 the best we can with our fellow man. 16 JIM KAVANAUGH: I understand. 17 STEVE:

So, all these years that I've been with him and worked with him, you know, we've never harmed anybody, never touched anyone and, we've had a lot of threats. I was with him and went over to England and there were theologians that got a hold of me and warned me about my, you know, my life would be in danger and I--

JIM KAVANAUGH: Just for what you believe in? STEVE: Yes, because, you know, what was happening, we were offering information to a lot of

theology students, those that were paying about \$10,000 a year to become ministers. And, we didn't charge 2 3 anything. We raised questions that they could not 4 answer. If we can't show you the answer right in the Book, not give 7 8 an opinion and a theory, well then you've lost nothing 9 but an exercise of the mind and a little time. you see something there, you know, meditate on it, look 10 11 at it, go back on your own and wrestle with the issues, 12 and you know, it's between you and God. 13 Even when I first met David, I was, I thought 14 to myself, God, what is this, a Jim Jones, you know anything with a small group off in the middle of who 15 16 knows where, you know you've got to wrestle with the issues. And for six months, I went back and forth with 17 18 that Bible trying to prove him wrong. 19 JIM KAVANAUGH: I'm no theologian or 20 religious scholar and I certain --21 Well, you're almost better off STEVE: 22 because of that, Jim, because people like yourself that 23 have worldly experience, usually give a man more of They do more listening than those in the 24 break. religious world. 25 They already think they know God. You can't do anything for them, so if there's a message

of impending doom and a way out, they won't take the time out what that way out might be. You know, this 3 has been what the testimony of the Prophets all the way 4 through. You know, one law condemns us all. 5 Commandments, we don't keep it. It's a good law (indiscernible--interfering noise) God's character. 6 7 But there's another law, it's called the Law of the 8 Spirit of Life. It's from Romans 8, and in every 9 generation God sends warnings by Prophets, but there 10 are always people that are picked that are everyday 11 people, Hosea and Micah, these guys were sheep herders, 12 and fig pickers. They didn't wear three piece suits. 13 They didn't have a lot of doctor degrees. Not to say 14 that's wrong, but God picked people that were humble, 15 that he could work with and every generation these kind 16 of men were rejected. 17 So, you know, the last days, we believe we're in the last days as Christianity does at large, and the 18 19 word is very clear as to how it's all going to come to 20 an end. And we just want to make sure people have that 21 opportunity to take a look because it talks about in 22 all the Prophets about the Heavens departing as a 23 It's going to be a scary thing. If you ever 24 have the time, you know, write down Isaiah 24. God says he's going to turn this globe, this planet upside 25

down and shake the inhabitants. Says it's going to

reel to and fro like a drunkard. People are going to 2 be terrified. And, if they don't know information ahead of time, it says if they run they'll fall into a 3 pit. And those that escape out of the pit will be 5 taken in a snare. See the thing is to if we're to 6 stand still, but you can't without information, without 7 having an experience based upon trusting God's word, not by your feelings, because we're all bad. I mean, 9 bad in that we have tendencies to do things that we 10 don't even like ourselves, so this is what we've share with people all over, and you know, to this time we 11 still are. 12 13 But, of course, we hold nothing against 14 anyone. We just want to make sure that people have 15 that opportunity to understand if they want. If they 16 don't, we respect that too. Its between them, God, and 17 the Judgement. 18 JIM KAVANAUGH: I understand. 19 STEVE: He probably wanted to talk to you too, but he's still on with this guy. Okay. 7 What he said was he told the guy on the radio station that he would take the fact that I told the radio man 8 9 to let him talk as one of the scripture readings. 10 STEVE: Okay, right. 11 JIM KAVANAUGH: And that you would send out 12 two more children. 13 STEVE: Okay, I see. 14 JIM KAVANAUGH: Now that's what he just said, if you want to check with him, that's fine, but if we 15 16 could get two more kids, I think it would be great. 17 STEVE: Right, right. JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): They'll definitely do 15 it. You have Steve's word. 16 17 STEVE: That's right. There's no problem. 18 JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): No problem. They're 19 going to do it. 20 Just waiting for a break. STEVE: JIM KAVANAUGH (aside): And you can trust 21 him, I'm telling you. It's okay. I don't 7 know him myself, but of course David does. 8 JIM KAVANAUGH: Yeah, David knows him. 9 He likes him very much and he's 10 appreciated him. 11 JIM KAVANAUGH: He's a real gentleman. know, I talked to him at length and he just said hey, I 12 don't want anybody in there to get hurt. Let's work it 13 out. He's behind you, so I want you to feel good about 14 15 that. 16 STEVE: Well we do feel good about him. 17 David's met him apparently or talked to him and he 18 really appreciates him. JIM KAVANAUGH: Yeah, he's a good guy. I 19 20 really believe he is. I know you can size him up fast. 21 STEVE: I know that any of these guys that put their own life on the line not knowing what they're 22 getting into and hearing this and that information. 23 You can't help but have appreciation for these people. 24 25 JIM KAVANAUGH: Sure.

STEVE: I try to put myself in their shoes

and where they're coming from and try to understand and 2 I know it's not easy. 3 JIM KAVANAUGH: David's still talking to him. They didn't come from inside. 10 STEVE (aside): Jim thinks that there are some guys that are either approaching our place or 11 coming near the place, that are out there near the 12 guard shack, that might be ours, cause he says it's not 13 14 theirs. But isn't there an armored vehicle there also? 15 JIM KAVANAUGH: No, no, that's -- none of those armored cars are near there. They're down on the 16 2491 road. 17 STEVE: Can we check that out somehow or go 18 back, okay, he's going to see about our men and make 19 20 sure of the rest of it. JIM KAVANAUGH: Yeah, we've got to work 21 22 something out, I mean. STEVE: Oh, definitely. I don't like that at 23 24 all. 25 JIM KAVANAUGH: We can get you a bull horn You could call them. You could yell out the somehow.
