2 JIM: -- be able to get back with him in a
3 little while.

4 RACHEL: Okay. All right.

5 JIM: All right. You want to go ahead and
6 tell him? I'll --

7 RACHEL (to Koresh): He said just wait on
8 that for now because he needs to work on that. He
9 doesn't want, you know, them to get excited, so just
10 wait and he'll let us know when he can do it.

11 RACHEL TO JIM: He said okay.

12 JIM: Okay. Yeah. I understand that's --
13 the problem and we'll see if we can help you out on
14 that.

15 RACHEL: Well, Cyrus has been bugging me for
16 about the past -- I don't know how long I've been on
17 the phone with you, but he's been bugging me ever since
18 I've got on the phone to talk to you.

19 JIM: Well, let me talk to him.

20 RACHEL: So I will let him talk to you.

21 JIM: Okay.

22 CYRUS: Hi.

23 JIM: Hi, Cyrus.

24 CYRUS: Hi.

25 JIM: Do you know who this is?

CYRUS: What?

1 JIM: Do you know who this is?
2 CYRUS: Yes.
3 JIM: Who?
4 CYRUS: Jim.
5 JIM: Yeah. How are you doing?
6 CYRUS: Fine.
7 JIM: What are you doing today?
8 CYRUS: Nothing much.
9 JIM: Nothing much?
10 CYRUS: No, because there's no room to play
11 in here.
12 JIM: There's no room to play? Well, you
13 better get some room.
14 CYRUS: The bed's on the floor.
15 JIM: Uh-oh. You got any good toys in there?
16 CYRUS: No.
17 JIM: You don't? What's your favorite toy?
18 CYRUS: I'd say what thing is -- I don't
19 know.
20 JIM: You don't know? Don't you have like a
21 truck or --
22 CYRUS: A motorcycle is my favorite thing.
23 JIM: Oh. I bet it's a little yellow Suzuki.
24 Is it?
25 CYRUS: And swimming.
JIM: Yeah? Swimming?

1 CYRUS: Yeah.

2 JIM: You can swim?

3 CYRUS: Yes.

4 JIM: Boy, you must be pretty big. How old
5 are you? Seven?

6 CYRUS: What? Yeah, I'm seven.

7 JIM: You're seven and you can swim already?

8 CYRUS: Yeah.

9 JIM: Do you like horses?

10 CYRUS: Not that much.

11 JIM: No?

12 CYRUS: No.

13 JIM: Not that much? What do you like the
14 most, what kind of animals? What's your favorite
15 animal?

16 CYRUS: Toy guns and stuff. That's not
17 cheap.

18 JIM: Toy guns?

19 CYRUS: Yeah.

20 JIM: That's the ones you like?

21 CYRUS: Yeah. At Wal-Mart?

22 JIM: At Wal-Mart. What's your favorite
23 kind, a cowboy six-shooter?

24 CYRUS: Yeah.

25 JIM: You like those cowboys, huh?

 CYRUS: Uh-huh.

1 JIM: That's good. That's good. Well, is
2 everybody doing okay in there?

3 CYRUS: Yeah.

4 JIM: Okay. You're going to come on out and
5 we're going to see you soon, I hope.

6 CYRUS: Yeah.

7 JIM: Are you? You're going to walk out and
8 see us soon?

9 CYRUS: Yeah.

10 JIM: Mark and Kevin and everybody got some
11 ride in those big --

12 CYRUS: Tanks.

13 JIM: -- tanks, yeah. You like those?

14 CYRUS: Yeah.

15 JIM: Yeah. We want you to come out, you
16 know. Cyrus?

17 CYRUS: What?

18 JIM: We want you to come out and bring all
19 your friends, all the kids and everybody.

20 CYRUS: Yeah.

21 JIM: And your moms and stuff and everybody
22 can stay together. Come on out. You know, we're going
23 to have you come out so you can all be together.

24 CYRUS: Jim?

25 JIM: Yeah.

CYRUS: I sprained. my foot.

1 JIM: You spanked your foot?

2 CYRUS: I didn't spank it. I sprained it.

3 JIM: Oh, you sprained it.

4 CYRUS: I can walk a little, though.

5 JIM: How did you do that?

6 CYRUS: I went to -- I just fell and it
7 sprained it.

8 JIM: Is it swollen up?

9 CYRUS: It's not that bad now.

10 JIM: Yeah. We have a doctor out here and
11 when you come out, we'll have him look at it. Okay?

12 CYRUS: Yeah.

13 JIM: Make sure you're all right.

14 CYRUS: Can I talk to Kevin?

15 JIM: No. He's not here right now.

16 CYRUS: Oh. Is Mark?

17 JIM: No. They're, they're together, but
18 they're not right where I am. They were here earlier.

19 CYRUS: They're my cousins.

20 JIM: They are?

21 CYRUS: Yeah.

22 JIM: They came out and we gave them some
23 Coke and candy and they got a ride in that tank and
24 they really thought it was neat. They said it was
25 bumpy, though.

CYRUS: They thought what was bumpy?

1 JIM: That tank.

2 CYRUS: Oh.

3 JIM: They thought it was a bumpy ride, but
4 they liked it. They're having fun. They're doing
5 good.

6 CYRUS: How come they took them in the tank?

7 JIM: Well, that was just to give them a ride
8 in it.

9 CYRUS: Oh, they wanted a ride in it?

10 JIM: Yeah. Do you want a ride? Have you
11 ever ridden in a tank?

12 CYRUS: No.

13 JIM: Yeah. I think it would be neat. Don't
14 you?

15 CYRUS: How come they didn't go in a car? We
16 didn't know they went in the tank.

17 JIM: Yeah. They went in that tank. They
18 walked down and got in it and drove away. Then they
19 came over here to see me.

20 CYRUS: How come they didn't go in a car?

21 JIM: Oh, because we didn't have a car over
22 there.

23 CYRUS: Oh.

24 JIM: Yeah. They did later. The tank just
25 drove them to a car and then they got in the car. Then
they came over here.

1 CYRUS: Oh, the tank drove it -- the tank
2 drove them to where?

3 JIM: It just drove them down the street, a
4 way, so they could have a ride, and then --

5 CYRUS: And then dropped them off into the
6 car and then the car took them to your place?

7 JIM: Right. That's right. Um-hum, exactly.
8 And I'm over here at the airport with all these
9 airplanes and stuff and we're in a big hangar out here.

10 CYRUS: I like, I like airplanes.

11 JIM: Do you?

12 CYRUS: Yeah.

13 JIM: When you come over you can see all
14 these. Okay?

15 CYRUS: Yeah.

16 JIM: I'll let you see all of them. There's
17 even helicopters over here. Do you like helicopters?

18 CYRUS: Yeah.

19 JIM: They got helicopters, airplanes, you
20 know, all kinds of stuff.

21 CYRUS: Jets?

22 JIM: Jets? Yeah, they got jets. And I'm
23 inside this big giant hangar. You wouldn't believe how
24 big it is.

25 (Cyrus speaking to Rachel in background.)

 CYRUS: Yeah.

1 JIM: Yeah. Well, I want to see you come
2 over here.

3 CYRUS: Could I come over in the car?

4 JIM: Yeah, if you -- come on out. Tell your
5 mom you want to come and I'll arrange it for you.

6 CYRUS: Oh.

7 JIM: You got to tell your mom.

8 CYRUS: What did you say?

9 JIM: You got to tell your mom you want to
10 come out and see Jim and ride in the tank, and I'll,
11 I'll call, I'll call that tank and have him waiting for
12 you if you want to.

13 CYRUS: I want to go in the car. Tanks are
14 kind of bumpy.

15 JIM: Yeah, I know, but just for a little
16 while they're all right, just for a few minutes. All
17 right?

18 CYRUS: Yeah.

19 JIM: And then at least you get to see the
20 inside, see what that looks like. I'll bet there's not
21 too many kids you know that have seen the inside of a
22 tank anyway.

23 CYRUS: I know. I never been in a tank
24 before.

25 JIM: I know. Yeah. We take your picture
and show you what it looks like with you in that tank.

1 That's what soldiers use, don't they?

2 CYRUS: Yeah.

3 JIM: Yeah. They have tanks like that.

4 (Cyrus whispering in background.)

5 CYRUS: Did you know what they did to Mark?

6 JIM: What?

7 CYRUS: Well, what did they do?

8 JIM: Oh, where did they take him? Cyrus?

9 CYRUS: Why did those people make, make him
10 take his jacket off and everything?

11 JIM: Oh, I don't know. I didn't see him do
12 that. I don't know.

13 CYRUS: Well, that's what they did.

14 JIM: Oh, they did?

15 CYRUS: Yeah. They shouldn't because it
16 makes you kind of nervous.

17 JIM: Yeah. I know that. I can understand
18 that. It's okay, though. Mark was fine when he got
19 here and he was real happy. He talked to his mom and
20 he was fine.

21 CYRUS: He was real happy when he got there
22 and he talked to his mom?

23 JIM: Yeah. He's real happy and he was
24 sitting right next to me in this chair and he was
25 eating a candy bar and a Coca Cola. And I said, "How's
that tank?" and he said, "It's fun, but it's bumpy."

1 CYRUS: Yeah. Did the tank drive him all the
2 way there?

3 JIM: No, just a little ways and then he got
4 in the car. Then he was able to get in a car, a police
5 car, one with lights on the top. You ever ridden in a
6 fire truck?

7 CYRUS: A what?

8 JIM: A fire engine or police car?

9 CYRUS: No.

10 JIM: Well, that would be fun, wouldn't it?

11 CYRUS: Yeah, maybe, but I wouldn't want to
12 drive in one. I'd rather go in a tank than one of
13 those.

14 JIM: Yeah? Tanks are big. Airplanes are
15 really neat, though.

16 CYRUS: I know.

17 JIM: Well, let me talk to your mom.

18 CYRUS: Okay. Here she is.

19 RACHEL: How come you didn't let the children
20 have those puppies?

21 JIM: Rache?

22 RACHEL: Yes.

23 JIM: I'm sorry. I didn't hear you.

24 RACHEL: How come they didn't let the
25 children have those puppies?

 JIM: What we did, we took them to a vet, a

1 veterinarian.

2 RACHEL: Um-hum.

3 JIM: And he said they needed some vitamins
4 and some kind of formula or something. He said they
5 were a little bit sick and they were so newborn, you
6 know?

7 RACHEL: Yeah.

8 JIM: And so he was taking care of them.
9 That's the last I heard.

10 RACHEL: Well, we heard it on the radio that
11 they are --

12 JIM: I can't hear you barely.

13 RACHEL: We heard that they already have new
14 homes, all of them.

15 JIM: Well, I think what -- the vet had told
16 us that each one of them had to be inoculated,
17 vaccinated and hand bottle fed for a few days to get
18 their strength up.

19 RACHEL: Um-hum.

20 JIM: I guess, you know, maybe -- was the
21 mother killed or something?

22 RACHEL: Yes.

23 JIM: Okay.

24 RACHEL: They killed all, all those of
25 David's dogs.

JIM: Okay. Well, that's the reason they

1 | were weak, so the vet had to give them out for -- you
2 | know, to be actually bottle fed and, you know, to get
3 | their strength up. They're cute little things.

4 | RACHEL: Um-hum.

5 | JIM: When they -- what are they, malamutes
6 | or something?

7 | RACHEL: Well, actually we weren't too happy
8 | about the cross-breeding.

9 | JIM: Oh.

10 | RACHEL: We wanted a pure breed and we had
11 | the dogs in the front yard blocked off so that, you
12 | know, they wouldn't get out and -- to get to the other
13 | dogs and so the dogs on the outside wouldn't get to
14 | them but, anyway, a male dog from the outside -- I
15 | don't know how he got in, jumped over --

16 | CYRUS IN BACKGROUND: Jumped in.

17 | RACHEL: Jumped over. Oh, yeah, he jumped
18 | over because the female dog was in heat, so he jumped
19 | over and he was not a malamute, so he's the one that
20 | got her pregnant.

21 | JIM: Oh, I see.

22 | RACHEL: He was a brown -- he was totally
23 | brown. I don't know what kind of dog he was. He was
24 | kind of a husky looking dog.

25 | JIM: Yeah.

 RACHEL: And so they're not full breeds.

1 JIM: Oh, I see.

2 RACHEL: But the malamutes were.

3 JIM: Yeah. I saw -- they kind of -- don't
4 they kind of have like a little black face or
5 something?

6 RACHEL: You know, they're from Alaska, those
7 type of dogs, and they have black and white in them.

8 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Did they have grey at all?

9 CYRUS: Part wolf.

10 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Do they have grey? Do they
11 have grey in them? Did the dogs have grey in them or
12 is it just black and white? Malamutes.

13 RACHEL: I think it's just black and white,
14 but they're -- they get -- in the wintertime they get
15 really furry. Not just black and white, maybe, maybe
16 have some brown and different colors in them, you know.
17 It's --

18 JIM: Right.

19 RACHEL: It's, it's just a kind of a mixture,
20 but they're real -- they get real furry and husky type.

21 JIM: Yeah.

22 (Cyrus talking to Rachel in background.)

23 JIM: I love dogs. They're, they're cute.
24 Those are -- they're well cared for.

25 RACHEL: Um-hum. Yeah. We just wanted to,
you know, get them out of here because they did need

1 | some special attention.

2 | JIM: Well, I know you, you did and in any
3 | case we got them to the vet and --

4 | RACHEL: The kids were having to feed them
5 | out of baby bottles.

6 | JIM: Well, hey, that's exactly what the vet
7 | said, yeah. He said they had to be like hand fed, you
8 | know.

9 | RACHEL: Um-hum.

10 | JIM: And he gave them some vitamins and he
11 | said they were just fine except they're just so little
12 | that, you know, without their mother they had to have
13 | the vitamin boost and the, and the hand feeding, so I
14 | think that was why they did it that way. Is there some
15 | other dogs out there?

16 | RACHEL: Other dogs?

17 | JIM: Yeah. Is there any other dogs?

18 | RACHEL: I don't know. I don't know if they
19 | killed them or not.

20 | JIM: They -- of course, we know there's some
21 | dead. That's the ones the guys want to bury, you know.

22 | RACHEL: Yeah. Well, those are right in the
23 | front yard. The other -- we had some others and they
24 | were just roaming around. They're all just stray dogs.
25 | I mean, people like to drop off dogs in the country, I
 | think.

1 JIM: Oh, yeah.

2 RACHEL: And we'd get dogs and we'd try to
3 get rid of them and after awhile we just stopped trying
4 to get rid of dogs.

5 JIM: Um-hum, I understand.

6 RACHEL: Because sometimes you get rid of
7 them and they come back.

8 JIM: Yeah.

9 RACHEL: But I don't know if we have any more
10 or not because I don't know if they -- they may have
11 killed them.

12 JIM: Yeah. Well, how's David doing?

13 RACHEL: Let's see. I can't really tell.
14 There's -- I can't even see him.

15 JIM: You know, we're ready if you want to
16 send some other children out.

17 RACHEL: Just a minute. Let me see if I can
18 talk --

19 JIM: Yeah, talk to him. You know --

20 CYRUS: Jim?

21 JIM: Hey, Cyrus.

22 CYRUS: Are we going to be able to get -- go
23 to our grandma?

24 JIM: Well, we'll try. Where's your grandma
25 at?

CYRUS: She's in --

1 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Is she in Tyler?
2 CYRUS: She lives in Chandler.
3 JIM: Where?
4 CYRUS: Chandler.
5 JIM: Chandler, Oklahoma?
6 CYRUS: Huh?
7 JIM: Chandler, Texas? Oh, yeah. Okay.
8 Yeah. Well, we can, we can give them a call and see if
9 we can get in touch with them, you know.
10 CYRUS: It's Chandler and it's by Tyler.
11 JIM: By Tyler. Okay.
12 CYRUS: We really want to be with our grandma
13 than with someone we don't know.
14 JIM: Hey, let me check on that for you.
15 Okay?
16 CYRUS: Yeah.
17 JIM: Okay? Do you like your grandma?
18 CYRUS: Yeah.
19 JIM: Okay. Yeah.
20 (Cyrus whispering in background.)
21 JIM: Give me her name, Cyrus, so I can check
22 on it.
23 CYRUS: Cyrus --
24 JIM: No, not your name, your grandma's name.
25 CYRUS: Oh, Bonnie.
 JIM: Bonnie what?

1 | children were all in one place.

2 | JIM: Right. Yeah, I heard him say that and
3 | I know that's not right.

4 | RACHEL: No, it's not true. They were
5 | scattered all over the whole building --

6 | JIM: Yeah, I know that's not --

7 | RACHEL: -- in their own rooms.

8 | JIM: Yeah, I know that. I mean --

9 | RACHEL: Well, can you correct it?

10 | JIM: Yeah, I'll pass the word on,
11 | absolutely.

12 | RACHEL: Thank you.

13 | JIM: Absolutely. Okay. Hey --

14 | RACHEL: Just a minute, just a minute.

15 | JIM: All right. Hello?

16 | MR. KORESH: Good morning, Jim.

17 | JIM: David.

18 | MR. KORESH: This -- hello?

19 | JIM: Hello, how are you?

20 | MR. KORESH: This guy is full of it isn't he?

21 | JIM: Yeah, Rachel just told me. I

22 | understand that's not right, that I know the women and
23 | children were all around in there, you told me that.

24 | MR. KORESH: Now, what are you, what are you
25 | going to do about that agent that, that confessed that,
that they fired first, which is what happened?

1 JIM: Yeah, well --

2 MR. KORESH: You, you all guys are going to
3 be really in hot, hot water.

4 JIM: Well, I, I think so. I mean, I think
5 you, you have a side here that needs to be heard and --

6 MR. KORESH: Yeah, and another thing is --

7 JIM: I mean, I think that's the facts that
8 need to come out.

9 MR. KORESH: It's kind, it's kind of strange
10 that I didn't get -- I didn't, I didn't fall down dead
11 right there in the door isn't it?

12 JIM: Well, I, I -- that's true.

13 MR. KORESH: Do you know, do you know how
14 many bullets came through the walls and that door?

15 JIM: Geez, I don't know. I think, you know,
16 that's a point we talked about yesterday.

17 MR. KORESH: It sounded, it sounded like
18 popcorn.

19 JIM: Oh, I know it. I, I think that, David,
20 that's something you need to be --

21 MR. KORESH: And they also said, they also
22 said that, that, that, that they, that they heard me
23 say, you know, you know, get back, there's women and
24 children in here, let's talk about this -- then blap.

25 JIM: Well, see, David, you can see that
there's a lot of people that are going to support your

1 position in the court.

2 MR. KORESH: Oh, well, the thing of it is,
3 you know, like I say, it's, it's above and beyond that.
4 There's, there's a, there's a lot of -- oh man, I mean
5 --

6 JIM: Well, listen, it's going to be a big
7 investigation. Everybody's going to be interviewed and
8 --

9 MR. KORESH: Oh, I know that. It's, it's a
10 big one right now.

11 JIM: Well, I think, you know, when you, when
12 you walk out --

13 MR. KORESH: Because, you know, you know,
14 there's another -- there's, there's a lot of these
15 films and stuff that we already, you know, got ready to
16 set up called, The BATF Breaking the Law in the Name of
17 the Law?

18 JIM: Um-hum.

19 MR. KORESH: You know, National Gun Owner's
20 Association and all that?

21 JIM: Yeah, the gun owners?

22 MR. KORESH: Yeah.

23 JIM: Um-hum, um-hum. Yeah, that's what I'm
24 saying. There are some --

25 MR. KORESH: And --

JIM: -- there's other similar situations and

1 I think that, you know, you can tell your story.

2 MR. KORESH: And, you know, like I, like I
3 told Robert, Robert could have -- those guys could have
4 arrested me anytime they wanted to.

5 JIM: Um-hum.

6 MR. KORESH: And the Sheriff's Department and
7 stuff like that could have -- you know, you all guys
8 just wanted to play cowboys. That's just the way the
9 impression is.

10 JIM: Um-hum.

11 MR. KORESH: And that guy was down there at
12 the bar in Waco and he heard those -- and you all, you
13 all aren't supposed to be drinking anyway, you know?

14 JIM: Um-hum.

15 MR. KORESH: And you all out there and
16 bragging and shooting your mouth off about coming and,
17 and, and cleaning us out out here at this compound. I
18 mean --

19 JIM: Yeah.

20 MR. KORESH: -- you know, people heard that.

21 JIM: Well, David, I think, you know, that
22 it's important, and you and I realize it, and I can
23 tell you that --

24 MR. KORESH: Isn't it, isn't it sad that,
25 that, that, that people are, are that --

JIM: I, I --

1 MR. KORESH: -- foolish?

2 JIM: -- I agree. I think --

3 MR. KORESH: And, you know, answer me another
4 thing. Is -- why, why is it that, that there's these
5 young men that are supposed to be old enough to know
6 better --

7 JIM: Um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: -- dare get on a ladder and try
9 to climb up on a roof of a place and try to break
10 through some windows?

11 JIM: Um-hum.

12 MR. KORESH: I mean --

13 JIM: Well, you know, there's always a lot of
14 unfortunate comments from ill-informed people and, and
15 the media is very interested in your side of the story.

16 MR. KORESH: Yeah, I understand that.

17 That's, that's why you all have locked me off from the
18 outside. But, but the thing of it is is that --

19 JIM: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: -- it's just another
21 bureaucratic way of showing the oppression of this
22 nation.

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 MR. KORESH: You know, that's what you guys
25 play. You know, you want it all one-sided now.

JIM: Um-hum. No, David, I, I don't want to

1 suppress your side. I -- you know that Henry and I
2 don't. I think you --

3 MR. KORESH: Well, I --

4 JIM: -- you should tell your side.

5 MR. KORESH: What did he say, what did he
6 say?

7 (Indiscernible voices in background.)

8 MR. KORESH: No, they never gave us the phone
9 yet either like we've been asking for the past two
10 days.

11 JIM: Hey, we're, we're working on that.

12 MR. KORESH: This guy's telling the, the
13 media -- of course, like I say, you know, remember,
14 Jim, it's -- we're not really involved on this side of
15 it but --

16 JIM: Um-hum.

17 MR. KORESH: -- it's, it's -- you know, he's
18 saying that you all call all the time and we don't
19 answer the phone for --

20 JIM: Oh, he doesn't know. That's not the
21 case.

22 MR. KORESH: Well, I mean that's what he's
23 telling the news.

24 JIM: Yeah. Well, you, you know what the
25 hell those things are, goes through ten people and it's
all mixed up. But, you know -- you know, they're

1 ad-libbing. They don't -- might know all the facts or
2 they've got it through three different levels and they
3 say, oh, well, you know -- that might have been from
4 two days ago or something when, you know, you --

5 MR. KORESH: One guy looks like he worries
6 too much.

7 JIM: Worries too much?

8 MR. KORESH: The older man?

9 JIM: (Laughter) He probably does.

10 MR. KORESH: I sure wish you'd let Robert
11 give me a call, I really want to talk to that young
12 man.

13 JIM: Yeah, I know you do. How are you
14 feeling today?

15 MR. KORESH: Well, I've, I've been trying for
16 an hour to get up on the toilet.

17 JIM: Oh, really?

18 MR. KORESH: And I've been having to, to
19 figure out a way -- we're trying to figure out a way of
20 maybe building something to where I can like use my
21 right arm to pull up.

22 JIM: Do, do you want me to talk to the
23 doctor for you?

24 MR. KORESH: Wait a second. Let me -- they
25 keep referring back to 1988 --

JIM: Oh, man --

1 MR. KORESH: -- which in -- that was when
2 Harwell -- look --

3 JIM: Yeah, I know about Roden and them,
4 yeah.

5 MR. KORESH: No, no, but you don't understand
6 the whole story, and I explained it to, to Henry last
7 night.

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 MR. KORESH: You know, here, here's eight
10 guys and here's George Roden standing out in the open
11 and all of a sudden all, all these guys are blasting
12 off guns. How come the guy didn't drop dead?

13 JIM: Oh, I know, and of course you were
14 acquitted on that.

15 MR. KORESH: No, no, no, but, but how come he
16 didn't drop dead?

17 JIM: Yeah. You mean Roden?

18 MR. KORESH: Yeah.

19 JIM: I don't know. I don't know.

20 MR. KORESH: Because nobody fired at him.

21 JIM: Yeah.

22 MR. KORESH: They were, they were, they were
23 standing still in the position that -- of the night
24 before when we originally went into the church to find
25 the casket.

JIM: Um-hum.

1 MR. KORESH: The weapons were taken only as a
2 diversion. We fired in the ground in case --

3 JIM: Yeah.

4 MR. KORESH: -- George came -- come -- came
5 out after me and the other two guys.

6 JIM: Right.

7 MR. KORESH: They were trying to take the
8 pictures of the church.

9 JIM: Um-hum.

10 MR. KORESH: There was a group of guys at
11 the, at the dump ground and a group down at the, at the
12 lake by the dam and that's what they were for and
13 that's why that day --

14 JIM: Um-hum.

15 MR. KORESH: -- when George came out and
16 stood there in the middle of the road and fired at Stan
17 and, you know, the bullet ricocheted and hit Stan in
18 the pocket --

19 JIM: Um-hum.

20 MR. KORESH: -- but that was all used as
21 evidence. I mean, you know, the guy would have been
22 dead --

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 MR. KORESH: -- if we had wanted him dead.

25 JIM: I know that, I know that.

MR. KORESH: But there, there was no question

1 | on it. Now, the Sheriff's Department had nerve to tell
2 | me that I'd been better off if I'd shot him. Now,
3 | that, now, that -- someone's going to be judged on a
4 | statement like that.

5 | JIM: Yeah, that, that's not right. But --

6 | MR. KORESH: But if you had shot him and
7 | killed him you, you ought to have gotten off easier.

8 | JIM: Well, let, let me make a point with you
9 | that you'll appreciate, okay? And that is that your
10 | side of this that you have told to me and Henry and,
11 | and Rachel and, and the others have told us in the last
12 | few days, okay? The reporters need to get it and you
13 | need to tell it --

14 | MR. KORESH: Well, why don't you --

15 | JIM: -- to the court.

16 | MR. KORESH: No, no, no, no, no. Why
17 | don't -- look, like I said, my God, the one I've been
18 | trying to tell you about --

19 | JIM: Um-hum.

20 | MR. KORESH: -- there's decisions being made,
21 | big decisions, based upon people are, are, are, are
22 | jumping and making judgments off of what they've been
23 | hearing which is, you know, all one-sided. This guy
24 | here is on TV answering all these questions as if he's
25 | an authority.

 JIM: Um-hum.

1 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Bonnie what?
2 CYRUS: Wait a minute, okay?
3 CYRUS TO RACHEL: Momma? Mommy? Mommy, is
4 Grandma's name Bonnie what? He might get us -- we
5 might get to be able to go to Grandma's house. Her
6 name is Bonnie what?
7 RACHEL TO CYRUS: He'll put you in a foster
8 care home.
9 CYRUS TO RACHEL: No. He's going to -- me,
10 but he needs Bonnie's -- and then her last name.
11 RACHEL TO CYRUS: Haldeman.
12 CYRUS: Bonnie Haldeman.
13 JIM: Haldeman?
14 CYRUS: Yeah.
15 JIM: Okay.
16 CYRUS: Here's my momma.
17 JIM: Okay. Rache?
18 STAR: Hi.
19 JIM: Hi. Hey, is Rachel there?
20 STAR: No.
21 JIM: Who is this?
22 STAR: Star.
23 JIM: Star? Oh, okay. How are you doing?
24 STAR: Fine.
25 JIM: Are you going to come out and see me?
 STAR: Hum?

1 JIM: Are you going to come out and see me?

2 This is Jim.

3 STAR: Yes.

4 JIM: Okay. Good. I want to see you later.

5 Okay? All right? Would that be good?

6 STAR: Okay.

7 JIM: All right. Let me talk to your mom.

8 STAR: What?

9 JIM: Is your mom there?

10 STAR: My dad is.

11 JIM: Oh, is he there?

12 STAR: He's talking to her.

13 JIM: Oh, your dad's talking to her?

14 STAR: Yes.

15 JIM: Okay.

16 STAR: But now she's here.

17 JIM: Okay. Let me talk to her.

18 RACHEL: Jim?

19 JIM: Hey, Rache, Bonnie Haldeman, is that
20 Cyrus' grandmother?

21 RACHEL: Yes.

22 JIM: They told me that she was already here
23 in Waco.

24 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

25 JIM: And she was supposed to be going with
the Health and Human Services people to some hearing on

1 Tuesday --

2 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

3 JIM: -- to get custody of the kids.

4 RACHEL: Oh, really?

5 JIM: Yeah. That's what they told me.

6 RACHEL: Of which ones?

7 JIM: Well, apparently -- no, they didn't
8 tell me. All of them. All of them or all of them she
9 wants. I don't know how many grandchildren she has
10 there.

11 RACHEL: Oh, okay.

12 JIM: Do you know?

13 RACHEL: Well, I don't know what she's doing,
14 so --

15 JIM: Okay. I mean, do you want the kids to
16 be with her?

17 RACHEL: Yeah, because I mean, I'd rather
18 have them with somebody close, you know.

19 JIM: Okay. Well, I mean --

20 RACHEL: Anyway, Steve wants to talk to you.
21 Okay?

22 JIM: Okay.

23 RACHEL: David said to tell you he'll be
24 having a baby here in a little bit.

25 JIM: Oh, no, no.

RACHEL: Not --

1 JIM: I know what you mean.

2 RACHEL: Not him. It's someone else.

3 JIM: Oh. Is one of the ladies really having
4 a baby?

5 RACHEL TO DAVID: He said is one of the
6 ladies having a baby?

7 RACHEL: Two of them.

8 JIM: Two of them?

9 RACHEL: Um-hum.

10 JIM: Yeah. That's not today, is it?

11 RACHEL TO DAVID: He said is that today?

12 RACHEL: No, not today.

13 JIM: Okay. I'm saying if they're that
14 close, though, do we need to send them out?

15 RACHEL TO DAVID: He said they're that close,
16 we need to send them out.

17 RACHEL: We might let someone come in like a
18 midwife or something.

19 JIM: Oh, we can't let anybody come in.

20 RACHEL: Well, then we'll just have to do it
21 ourselves, won't we?

22 JIM: Okay. Rache?

23 RACHEL: Yeah.

24 JIM: Okay. Sure you don't want to let them
25 come out? I mean, we'll get them to the hospital.

RACHEL: They don't -- you know, if they

1 | don't want to, they want to.

2 | JIM: Well, I understand.

3 | RACHEL: So if you don't want to let a
4 | midwife come in, then we'll just have to do it
5 | ourselves.

6 | JIM: Okay. All right.

7 | RACHEL: I mean, yeah, I've had three
8 | children and I've had --

9 | JIM: That's your decision.

10 | RACHEL: I had all my three children at home.

11 | JIM: Yeah. I understand.

12 | RACHEL: You know?

13 | JIM: That's your decision. If you need
14 | anything, medical supplies --

15 | RACHEL: Can I ask you something?

16 | JIM: Yeah.

17 | RACHEL: Why is it that you'll let a doctor
18 | come in to help David, but you won't let a midwife in
19 | to deliver a baby?

20 | JIM: Well, we won't let a doctor in to help
21 | David.

22 | RACHEL: I thought that's what you said to
23 | me.

24 | JIM: No. I have a doctor here --

25 | RACHEL: Oh, okay.

 JIM: -- with me at the airport and what I

1 | will do is you tell me about his wounds --

2 | RACHEL: Okay.

3 | JIM: -- and I will advise you that the
4 | doctor says this or if you do this. You see, that's
5 | what I meant. If he comes out he can see the doctor.
6 | We can't send anyone in, you know.

7 | RACHEL: Okay.

8 | JIM: Because, you know, they wouldn't go.
9 | They'd be afraid, you know.

10 | RACHEL: Right. Steve wants to talk to you.
11 | Okay?

12 | JIM: Okay.

13 | STEVE: Hello, Jim.

14 | JIM: Steve, how are you doing?

15 | STEVE: Not too bad. Yeah. I was listening
16 | to that on the radio. I didn't see it actually on T.V.
17 | about the, the press conference that was given and --

18 | JIM: Yeah.

19 | STEVE: -- it's always entertaining to see
20 | what some of the ATF agents or the FBI agents are going
21 | to say, how they say it, the implication of it, the
22 | connotations used.

23 | JIM: It's not very accurate, I know.

24 | STEVE: Number one, you know, I don't -- like
25 | yesterday, I mean, like we were talking, how they gave
the information out that guys here had a gun battle

1 with the Sheriff's Department in '87. I mean --

2 JIM: Well, that's not right.

3 STEVE: Well, you mean to tell me these
4 agencies with all the evidences, all the different
5 equipment at hand and everything else, they can't get
6 the facts together before they go on national,
7 international?

8 JIM: Well, they should.

9 STEVE: I mean, yeah. Well, that sounds
10 nice, you telling me that they should, but you're in a
11 position where you -- you know, I'm cut off. I can't
12 talk to anybody but yourself, so you can sympathize
13 with me and say nice things to me like this, but when
14 it keeps on coming out on the T.V. and like what was
15 said about David in this conference earlier today,
16 "Well, he's miraculously recovering," and then, of
17 course, all the laughter. If you got to see what you
18 guys did to him -- I did. I thought -- he thought I
19 thought he would have been dead within hours of that.
20 He was laying on the floor. We dragged him along.
21 He's never moved from that place.

22 JIM: Well, I know that.

23 STEVE: That's the truth.

24 JIM: I know that.

25 STEVE: And when -- you showed concern
because you thought like yourself as there may be Gary

1 and Henry that he would die and I tell you the truth,
2 we thought more than likely originally he would.

3 JIM: I'm glad he's better.

4 STEVE: Well, yeah, I am too, but, you know,
5 it's the way it was stated even to the press like, you
6 know, it's a, it's a sarcasm to his -- you know, the
7 lamb and the seven seals. Only the lamb can open up
8 the seven seals. And then he's never claimed to be
9 Jesus Christ. He never said he was.

10 JIM: I agree. He's never said that.

11 STEVE: He did state that only the lamb can
12 open the seven seals and he offers to show people all
13 throughout the scriptures the seven seals.

14 JIM: Right. Steven, I know that and the
15 only thing that they --

16 STEVE: That way -- see, that way, Jim, God
17 says who this person is. You see what I'm saying?

18 JIM: I understand.

19 STEVE: But, I mean, well, what -- do you
20 have any kind of -- probably no influence, but you
21 probably can at least communicate. Can't -- what about
22 these conferences?

23 JIM: I promise that I will and let me tell
24 you that what we have communicated up there, Henry and
25 I, is that -- and I'm sorry and I apologize for that
comment on the T.V. that was made that way. If that

1 man made it, it shouldn't have been done that way, but,
2 but we have passed up, okay. I want you to know.

3 STEVE: Okay.

4 JIM: And that was that Sunday David was
5 hurting. Okay?

6 STEVE: Um-hum.

7 JIM: That was Sunday evening. You remember?

8 STEVE: Oh, yeah, for sure.

9 JIM: And --

10 STEVE: But it's these kind of sarcastic
11 comments, the way they're, you know, put out.

12 JIM: I think, I think that was very
13 inappropriate for them to do that and I will pass that
14 up and I think it is inappropriate.

15 STEVE: I mean, this is really -- I really --
16 to tell you the truth, I'm really teed off. I hate to
17 see how this country of America has digressed and your
18 type of agencies are one of the biggest causes for it.
19 You -- some of you young guys like yourselves, you have
20 a job. You've become a professional in an area. At
21 the same time there is getting to be a Big Brother.
22 You're part of it. You do your job right and you may
23 have a family and so forth, but there's still a
24 vigilance of freedom that needs to be kept up. Read
25 the writings on the statements of people like Abraham
Lincoln or Jefferson or Madison, the great principles

1 laid down, so things that are happening now
2 that -- which you are more a part of than anybody,
3 would never take place. Like I can't talk to the
4 outside world. You've taken care of that, your kind of
5 people.

6 JIM: I understand.

7 STEVE: The press are so far back that you
8 guys could come and blow us away and they wouldn't --
9 and you could write -- give any kind of a story you
10 wanted.

11 JIM: We're not going to blow you away.

12 STEVE: I don't care if you -- let me tell
13 you something, Jim. I really don't care if you did or
14 didn't. In the first place, the point being, there is
15 a God that you and I stand before whether you and I
16 believe it or not and on one day all of us give an
17 account. And I mean, we, this group, does fear God
18 first over man.

19 JIM: I believe that.

20 STEVE: I know you believe that.

21 JIM: I know this.

22 STEVE: But, you know, it's starting to
23 become annoying after all these days of sitting here.
24 When I see this kind of stuff and you hear it on the
25 radio, I mean, I've known for years what's been
happening.

1 JIM: Well, Steve --

2 STEVE: No, no. Listen to me, please. I
3 just want to get something off my chest --

4 JIM: Okay.

5 STEVE: -- because, you know, after awhile it
6 gets very annoying.

7 JIM: I understand.

8 STEVE: For years and years as a young person
9 I was into the study of history because one does not
10 want to repeat the mistakes of others. I've always
11 wanted to see why there was a first World War, why a
12 second World War, so I've taken a lot of history
13 classes through high school and so forth. Many
14 questions were raised, but few answered and the answers
15 that were given never really made a lot of sense.
16 There was not a lot of logic or sense to those answers.
17 Then I started hearing about a group called the Council
18 on Foreign Relations, a group called the Trilateral
19 Commission.

20 JIM: I've heard -- hey, I've heard of that.

21 STEVE: I know. The Illuminati. Come to
22 find out, they're real organizations with the
23 Rockefellers and all these great merchants behind all
24 of these politicians, all of these puppets.

25 JIM: Is it --

STEVE: But your, but your agency and all

1 | those are part of that whole thing, taking away the
2 | freedoms of America and using innuendos and all sorts
3 | of the ways to go about doing it, more legislation,
4 | more regulations, more laws, so that ultimately a
5 | person has no freedom. So taxed to death that you
6 | never have a choice with the hard earned money you make
7 | to choose to where it should be paid.

8 | JIM: Yeah.

9 | STEVE: I mean, think of this whole thing.

10 | JIM: I understand.

11 | STEVE: But here you're a part of an agency,
12 | a part of the government, that has done some of the
13 | most -- I saw that Gun Owners of America, that video.

14 | JIM: Um-hum.

15 | STEVE: I don't know if you ever got to view
16 | that one that talks about your agency, how you're law
17 | breakers and what you did to those two policeman that
18 | were good cops all their li-- all those 20 years out in
19 | New Jersey.

20 | JIM: Right.

21 | STEVE: I mean, that -- I mean, if that
22 | doesn't tee off an American that's into freedom, and
23 | I'm for your freedom also, for your freedoms of choice.

24 | JIM: Right.

25 | STEVE: But what you guys have already showed
me, what you did with the Weaver case, I mean, that

1 | already bothered me and here now I'm involved in
2 | something like this.

3 | JIM: Yeah.

4 | STEVE: Whatever happens to me I hope that
5 | you have yourself right with God, that you're not part
6 | of an organization or part of something that -- I mean,
7 | God condemns that kind of thing. You might think he
8 | condemns a lot of things we're doing and from what
9 | you've heard about us, but you've gotten to hear a lot
10 | of things out of the mouth of David here.

11 | JIM: Yeah.

12 | STEVE: And you go find your greatest
13 | theologian in the world. If there -- if there's some
14 | truth to that Bible -- I think you said your background
15 | was Catholic?

16 | JIM: Well, when I was a little boy and then
17 | now I'm a Christian.

18 | STEVE: Whatever that means. You know, I
19 | mean, I'm not a Christian. I've always wanted to be a
20 | Christian, but a Christian is something I have not seen
21 | in my whole lifetime. But, anyway, aside from that --
22 | but, you know, I'm again concerned about what's going
23 | on. All my years in this country of American I've
24 | always loved the Constitution and the statements of men
25 | like Abraham Lincoln and Jefferson, some of these men,
but this country is no longer what it was then. Now

1 there's men that have -- very powerful men that, that
2 -- those guys that do get into office. I mean, when
3 you look at someone like Bush and Clinton, both
4 associated with the Trilateral Commission, who are you
5 voting for? Just like in '80 you had what's his name,
6 Anderson and Carter, Carter being the first member, the
7 first one to become President in '76, handpicked by
8 Rockefeller in '73. Every cabinet member belonged to
9 the Trilateral Commission. What on earth is this?
10 What's happened to this country. But you don't read
11 about it in the press. Is it controlled, is the
12 question? Well, how come you don't get a broader view
13 of things?

14 JIM: Yeah.

15 STEVE: And those men that are on these talk
16 shows even, right away if there's someone in there that
17 starts speaking logic or sense or if they raise a
18 question about your agency or anything else, who's
19 watching the watchdog. You understand?

20 JIM: Right.

21 STEVE: Who's watching the watchdog? Right
22 away they get -- usually are taken off or the time is
23 out. I mean, I've watched this all my life. I've
24 always considered myself to be a conservative, someone
25 who is not into taxes, who's into the freedom of people
so that they can express themselves. They can create.

1 They can do -- as long as they're not hurting their
2 fellow man, they're doing the best. But, I mean,
3 that's not the way this country is degenerating to and
4 this is what the Bible shows in advance.

5 JIM: Right.

6 STEVE: But, you know, me watching this --
7 you know, like you hear this on the, on the radio and
8 so forth. Here we go again. But maybe, if we're
9 right, what we're telling you through the Bible and
10 David's showing you, there's going to be a one last
11 time. People are going to be answering. There's going
12 to be someone that's going to open up a book that has
13 to do with your eternal salvation, my eternal
14 salvation. If it's not him, it's going to be somebody.

15 JIM: Right.

16 STEVE: And I could give you enough chapters
17 and verses right now where you can go back to the Old
18 Testament. It talks about a man that comes in the
19 final days that can open up and show information of the
20 future pertaining to one's salvation, and they can't
21 controvert it. That's what all these prophets talk
22 about. Yet you've got all these theologians,
23 ministers, priests that are totally unaware of it,
24 totally unaware.

25 JIM: Yeah.

STEVE: Because I've met with them myself and

1 they're quiet. They don't know how to answer you.

2 They can't.

3 JIM: Well, you know, it's hard to get into a
4 debate, Steve, with you for those ministers. I mean,
5 you're a pretty bright guy and you know your --

6 STEVE: No. I'm a person that has always
7 loved truth.

8 JIM: Right.

9 STEVE: Whatever I am or not. You know, some
10 said I can speak and this, that. I -- there's many
11 that can speak ten times better than myself. But,
12 besides that, I don't care about that. I'm a, I'm a
13 being that has awareness, that experienced good things,
14 bad things. We all want to experience the good. We
15 want fulfillment. We want joy, happiness. We all do.
16 There's something wrong with a being that does not want
17 that. So I've always tried to understand what it is
18 that could ensure that you could have it forever. Why
19 do we have to die? Why is there the problems that
20 there are with and between people? So I've always
21 wanted to find a way out of all of this, so my whole
22 life has been one of looking for the truth of my own
23 awareness, my own being and direction and trying to
24 help -- once obtaining as much as I can, always looking
25 for more, trying to help others see the same thing if
they have an honesty of heart.

1 JIM: Well --

2 STEVE: But, you know, and --

3 JIM: I know, Steve. You and -- in fact,
4 Henry and I talked about this this morning before he
5 left and you and David have impressed both of us with
6 your, your knowledge and --

7 STEVE: Well, you know --

8 JIM: And I --

9 STEVE: But if the knowledge is only air, if
10 it's only words in the air by a little cultic group
11 that's weird and, you know, you listen with one ear and
12 pass it off with the other, I mean so what. You know,
13 I don't want to -- I want to try to be honest with you.
14 I don't want to play any games with you.

15 JIM: Well, you have been honest.

16 STEVE: You're right, I have been, but I'll
17 be -- you know, I don't know -- you know, I've seen so
18 many men like Gonzalez come in and listen and I -- to
19 tell you the truth, I was -- right from the beginning I
20 thought that he was just -- I didn't think he was
21 honest, but I hoped that there might be something in
22 him where he could be.

23 JIM: Well --

24 STEVE: I really did. But, I mean, not to
25 even say that there isn't. Maybe, maybe he is somewhat
convicted but, like I told you, I hold nothing against

1 the man. In fact, I still like the guy. I really do.

2 JIM: Well, I can see how that bothers you,
3 you know, the deception, and I can appreciate that.

4 STEVE: Well, no, it -- that part doesn't
5 because, you know, I can understand that there are
6 times that if there's something that seems volatile or
7 there's a dangerous situation. No, that's why I say,
8 that's not, that's not a problem.

9 JIM: Yeah.

10 STEVE: But what was a problem -- if you've
11 been listening to the news, I'm glad there's Americans
12 that have good minds, that are raising questions, basic
13 questions, of human freedom and realities with the
14 Constitution like why you guys did what you did, why
15 wasn't the sheriff who we've invited out here --
16 they've come out on their own. They've never had harm
17 from us.

18 JIM: Yeah.

19 STEVE: But why didn't they come and serve
20 him with a warrant and he said he would have -- but now
21 you -- there is no question. If you were on the
22 grounds or in an airplane watching, you will know for a
23 fact you guys start firing on us.

24 JIM: Well, that needs to come out. You need
25 --

STEVE: Yeah. What about Weaver? What's

1 | happening with the Weaver trial? Let me see how you
2 | guys do and what kind of freedom and access he has to
3 | defend himself of that case.

4 | JIM: Okay. But, Steve, let's talk about
5 | Weaver. He walked out of there safely, right?

6 | STEVE: Well, what -- how come his wife got
7 | killed? What about -- wasn't it the boy and --

8 | JIM: That was a tragedy.

9 | STEVE: Yeah. Well, why did you guys do
10 | that?

11 | JIM: Well, a U.S. Marshal was killed, wasn't
12 | he?

13 | STEVE: Yeah. I heard that they shot his --
14 | the dog first and the kid. Anyway, it sounds from all
15 | --

16 | JIM: I agree with you. I mean, it was
17 | tragedy on both sides. It was terrible and I --

18 | STEVE: I don't -- I just wonder about BATF.
19 | I've heard not that many good things about it. I just
20 | know that --

21 | JIM: I understand.

22 | STEVE: Huh?

23 | JIM: I understand. I've heard -- I know.
24 | I'm familiar with --

25 | STEVE: But at the same time I know there's
good people in every organization in everything. I

1 mean, the same with religion. There's more bad people
2 in religion than there are good and I could even be
3 one. I mean, you know. So it's not that it's just one
4 organization or one agency or anything else.

5 JIM: Right. I mean, there's good people in
6 an organization and there's bad people. I agree with
7 --

8 STEVE: But obviously, you know, after
9 hearing all this, you know, one becomes very concerned.
10 Here we go with the same old stories we've seen and
11 heard all the time and the truth always gets buried.
12 Does one really get an opportunity to speak out and to
13 try to defend themselves?

14 JIM: You know --

15 STEVE: I've seen -- I don't know if you
16 have, but I've seen in a court of law many times judges
17 cut off someone that was trying to speak to bring out
18 information.

19 JIM: I don't disagree with you. I don't
20 disagree with you, but I've also seen the other side
21 where judges --

22 STEVE: Rare and few between.

23 JIM: -- force the truth. Well, they'll
24 force the truth and they want the truth. I think your
25 side needs to be heard and --

STEVE: Oh, it will be heard but, you know, I

1 believe that it will be heard the way God has said. I
2 mean, hopefully it can be heard, you know, the way I
3 would like also, the way you're speaking about, but
4 whether you believe it or not, I believe that the whole
5 world will get to see and hear the issues that have
6 begun here, that have come by that tape.

7 JIM: Right.

8 STEVE: If we had an open access which you
9 guys cut off on us to, you know, the press, we'd be
10 speaking about these issues of the Bible and, and
11 bringing up the issues that many ministers have tried
12 to close off for years like -- I've been -- I was a
13 Seventh Day Adventist for a lot of years and my mother
14 first was a Catholic. That was her background. My dad
15 was a Lutheran. My dad became an Adventist. My mother
16 then became and it was quite a process before she came.
17 She took my dad to a meeting where a priest was leading
18 out. My dad was asking so many questions the priest
19 couldn't answer. That started raising questions in her
20 own head about her religion, Catholicism.

21 JIM: Yeah.

22 STEVE: So -- but in the process one day -- I
23 mean, I'm raised as an Adventist, but then in high
24 school I got away from it. I wanted to try worldly
25 things.

JIM: Well, Steve, you know, I just want to

1 | tell you this. I really appreciate all the time you
2 | spent with me in the last few days and you've been
3 | straight and I -- and through this hard time -- you
4 | know, it's been a hard time for all of us -- you have
5 | been straight and I just want to tell you that I
6 | appreciate that. I really do. I really do. I mean,
7 | you always, you know, come out and tell me like it is
8 | and --

9 | STEVE: But I just wanted to make a point,
10 | though, because you see it in all things in life and
11 | that is once become an Adventist, then because I saw
12 | more truth with that religion than any other because I
13 | sat down and compared Buddhism, Hinduism, Shintoism,
14 | Zoroastrianism. All these world religions I studied
15 | them, compared all the denominations, their challenges,
16 | their statements, back and forth, back and forth, and
17 | the one that held the most clarity and it would seem
18 | substance, had the strongest, strongest foundation was
19 | the Seventh Day Adventism, but then once joining that
20 | church and seeing the corruption in it, as any other,
21 | and that really they were doing nothing with the little
22 | bit of truth they had, one day someone starts showing
23 | me a little more. Well, it raised questions in my
24 | mind. I took it back to the church. That church
25 | immediately shut me off from speaking to the people I
 | was part of. I had given tithes, offerings, thousands

1 of dollars. I'd spent \$60,000 on education.

2 JIM: I always wonder what some of those
3 churches do with that money, don't you?

4 STEVE: Well, yeah. We'll, I'll tell -- like
5 the -- all these churches are worth billions of
6 dollars.

7 JIM: They buy a bunch of gold statues and
8 --

9 STEVE: Well, that's some of them. You know,
10 like the Eastern Orthodox, Catholicism, they're into
11 the ornate and all the rest and beautiful furnishings
12 where say somebody like the -- some of the Protestants,
13 the Adventists, for instance, which I was part of, have
14 billions of dollars from tithes and offerings that they
15 put into money orders, into the stock market and so
16 forth and --

17 JIM: I'll tell you, there's some, there's
18 some people controlling that stock market.

19 STEVE: Well, I don't know a whole lot. I
20 mean, I've read a lot of books about it, but at the
21 same time, you know, I'm --

22 JIM: You don't think that's kosher, do you?
23 I mean, you don't think that's right?

24 STEVE: Well, of course, it isn't. Of
25 course, it isn't.

JIM: I mean, there's --

1 STEVE: Anyway.

2 JIM: That's manipulated.

3 STEVE: See, what I was saying, though, is
4 how I finally got involved in such a thing as this was
5 I was actually removed from the Seventh Day Adventist
6 church because of raising questions they could not
7 answer. Even when they kicked me out, the very day
8 they did, I stood at their pulpit and I says, "Why are
9 you kicking me out?" I says, "All I wanted to do was
10 raise questions about some of these scriptures you do
11 not know anything about or, if you do, show me or tell
12 me." They removed me, not because I was an adulterer,
13 because I smoke or drink because I didn't do things
14 anyway or because I didn't go to church or whatever
15 else because there were people in that church that did
16 do all the things that were against their varied views
17 and their laws and so forth. But Satan is not -- isn't
18 bothered by anybody, what they do, unless you raise
19 issues to do with something that is true, the realities
20 of God. So ultimately my wife and I and many others
21 were removed, about almost -- about somewhere around 20
22 of us from one church alone, about 20 from one church
23 alone.

24 JIM: Is that right?

25 STEVE: Yes. All because of raising
questions that were in the Bible which they could not

1 answer. So from that day to this the ones that have
2 given us more hard times than everybody, not the
3 government, mind you -- Jim, it's not been the
4 government. It's been religious ministers with
5 doctorate degrees, Ph.D.s, D.D.s.

6 JIM: Well, do you think they -- those --
7 some of those people provide this wrong information to
8 the government?

9 STEVE: I don't know. I know that Marc
10 Breault has. I know that he's been an adversary since
11 he left, about six months after he left.

12 JIM: You know, I --

13 STEVE: I'm sure the rest because they
14 couldn't contend with David in places like London.

15 JIM: Right.

16 STEVE: When they can't do it -- here's what
17 -- well, let me give you an example real quick. I met
18 a -- when I was removed from that church in Hawaii,
19 temporarily I stayed with a friend, Paul Fatta, my wife
20 and I, and he had another roommate and we were staying
21 there because we were getting rid of our place, and in
22 the process we'd raise every day the issues because he
23 was a member of the same church, this man by the name
24 of Bob Garcia. And the guy couldn't contend with the
25 information we had. It was just too overwhelming what
we had gotten from David. So in the process then he

1 | kind of stayed away from us because he just knew he
2 | couldn't handle it and he knew that we had things that
3 | were right. So months and months went by and guess
4 | what -- about a year goes by and then that shootout
5 | happens in Texas. Well, then he had a reason why he
6 | never joined us or became part. He says, "Well, look
7 | at what this guy finally went and did. He was involved
8 | in some shootout and so forth. That's why I never came
9 | in because I could tell that ahead of time."

10 | JIM: Well, then they are judging you when
11 | they don't even know the facts.

12 | STEVE: Oh, no. I mean, he couldn't do it
13 | by the Bible is what I'm saying, so he waits and an
14 | issue comes about later of something he reads not
15 | knowing what it was about. But the whole thing is from
16 | the Bible he could not contend with what we had, but at
17 | the same time when he brought that up, what happened, I
18 | says, "Well, look at Luke 22, verse 36 through 8, when
19 | Christ told his own disciples to take swords with
20 | them."

21 | JIM: Wait. Hold on, Steve.

22 | STEVE: Sure.

23 | JIM TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: What did you
24 | say? Okay.

25 | JIM: All right. He wants me.

 STEVE: Pardon?

1 JIM: All right. I'm sorry. They're calling
2 me for -- hold on.

3 JIM TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: I was talking to
4 Steve. Okay.

5 JIM: Hey?

6 STEVE: Yeah.

7 JIM: Can I call you in a little while?

8 STEVE: Sure. Call me back.

9 JIM: Okay. And I'm working on two things.
10 Okay?

11 STEVE: Okay.

12 JIM: One is a phone.

13 STEVE: All right.

14 JIM: And the other is those dogs.

15 STEVE: Will it be bugged?

16 JIM: No, it's not going to be bugged. And
17 those dogs.

18 STEVE: Yeah. Okay.

19 JIM: Okay? Because --

20 STEVE: Jim, you're really telling me that
21 the phone that we would get from you would not be
22 bugged?

23 JIM: Hey, if you think it's bugged, treat it
24 that way.

25 STEVE: I mean, can you tell me for a fact
ahead of time, though, that it won't be? I want you to

1 | tell me that and then I won't even have a problem.

2 | JIM: I'm not fixing the phone.

3 | STEVE: Okay. But I want you to -- you're
4 | the negotiator now.

5 | JIM: Right.

6 | STEVE: All the world -- I mean, all the
7 | press world, everybody, it all comes down to you
8 | talking to me.

9 | JIM: Right. Right.

10 | STEVE: Whatever you tell me, I'm going to
11 | take.

12 | JIM: Right.

13 | STEVE: And there are ways for --

14 | JIM: Well, I'll tell you what --

15 | STEVE: -- us, of course, to get messages out
16 | to the world anyway.

17 | JIM: I know that.

18 | STEVE: We're just waiting to give you guys
19 | an opportunity to show your honesty and so forth --

20 | JIM: We're not going to bug the phone.

21 | STEVE: -- and you've done well so far.

22 | JIM: Yeah. Well, we won't bug it.

23 | STEVE: Okay. All right.

24 | JIM: I can't. I mean, I'm not going to even
25 | see it probably, so --

 STEVE: Right, but I want your word in behalf

1 | of all the agents.

2 | JIM: Okay. You got it.

3 | STEVE: Okay, good.

4 | JIM: And if you feel differently, don't use
5 | it.

6 | STEVE: No, no, because I -- when I tell you
7 | -- the only reason why we're receiving it, accepting
8 | it, is because we want to -- this phone here, your
9 | agencies keep on saying that we -- you take our calls
10 | but you'll call us. A lot of times the phone rings and
11 | we don't answer it. That's not -- any time it's ever
12 | rung we've picked it up at least within about three,
13 | four rings.

14 | JIM: No. We know that, Steve. We know
15 | that.

16 | STEVE: Well, why -- whatever -- whoever the
17 | guy is, I think it's Jamar or whatever the guy's name
18 | is, get it straight. I mean, I don't -- that's bad,
19 | those little things like that because there's no truth
20 | to it.

21 | JIM: Yeah, right and I'll pass that on.
22 | And, listen, if we were trying to send you some bugged
23 | phone, you know, we'd have sent it in the first day and
24 | tried to force it on you. You guys asked us for a
25 | phone --

 STEVE: I know. That's what I'm saying.

1 JIM: -- for a week. I mean, we're not
2 trying to trick you.

3 STEVE: No, no, of course not. That's what
4 I'm, that's what I'm agreeing with you.

5 JIM: Right. We'll take care of that. I'll
6 check on it. The other thing is let me square away
7 the, the thing with the dead dogs.

8 STEVE: Okay, and then get back to me.

9 JIM: Yeah, and don't let those guys walk out
10 because I don't want to, you know.

11 STEVE: No. I'll tell them.

12 JIM: I mean, we want to tell them -- tell
13 those armored cars that he's going to come out and do
14 that, you know.

15 STEVE: Right. No, I'll tell him not to.

16 JIM: Okay, Steve.

17 STEVE: I'll tell him not to.

18 JIM: Hey, I'll talk to you in a little
19 while.

20 STEVE: Okay. Thanks, Jim.

21 JIM: Okay, Steve.

22 STEVE: Okay, bye.

16 you, says it's really important. He says stop and talk
17 to Steve for a minute, he kind of nodded his head, he's

19 JIM: Okay. Well, look --

20 RACHEL: I'll let you talk to Steve first, I
21 guess.

22 JIM: Hey, just, you talk to me for just a
23 minute while he's getting up, okay?

24 RACHEL: Okay.

25 JIM: Let me tell you another issue you had
asked about earlier. Cyrus and his grandmother?

1 RACHEL: Um-hum.

2 JIM: We contacted the Child Services about
3 that.

4 RACHEL: Um-hum.

5 JIM: And they said that what, what they're
6 doing there is that all the kids are being kept
7 together.

8 RACHEL: Um-hum.

9 JIM: For their own security and comfort, you
10 know, until everybody walks out.

11 RACHEL: Um-hum.

13 turn over the children, you know, to relatives, in
14 those cases where parents are not available.

15 RACHEL: Um-hum.

16 JIM: But what they said, Rachel, was that
17 since they don't know which parents, you know, will be
18 immediately released and which ones will not, you know,
19 they're just going to hold all of the children until
20 everyone walks out. And we asked them about the
21 grandmother, and they said, you know, they didn't see
22 any difficulty with that. That would be their normal
23 policy anyway.

24 RACHEL: Um-hum.

25 JIM: And, you know, they were real positive
about it.

1 RACHEL: Okay, that's good.

2 JIM: And, you know --

3 RACHEL: They're just going to keep them
4 there at their, at their -- they don't keep them at the
5 social workers' office, do they?

6 JIM: I didn't hear you, I'm sorry.

7 RACHEL: So they just have a place, I guess
8 them keep them, huh?

9 JIM: I didn't, I can't --

10 RACHEL: Is it a foster home or --

11 JIM: Move, move your phone a little, I'm --
12 foster home, you say?

13 RACHEL: You said that they're keeping them
14 together. Is that at a foster home or something?

15 JIM: Oh. I'm not sure where.

16 RACHEL: Oh, okay.

17 JIM: I think it's still at Child Protective
18 Services, where they have the, you know, the ladies
19 that take care of them.

11 | RACHEL: Um-hum.

12 | JIM: So I just wanted you to know, like
13 | they're all together, and they --

14 | RACHEL: Okay, that's good.

15 | JIM: I think that's good for them, don't
16 | you?

17 | RACHEL: Yes, definitely, that's good.

18 | JIM: I mean that they see each other, they

1 RACHEL: It was altogether --

3 RACHEL: Okay.

4 JIM: That's, that's, you know, that's good.
5 He's probably not bleeding in there badly. Didn't hit
6 any intestines or --

7 RACHEL: (Indiscernible) (Unidentified
8 child's voice in background not discernible.) Cyrus
9 was telling me that you asked him if he had any good
10 toys?

11 JIM: Yeah.

12 RACHEL: I said what did you say, he goes,
13 no. I said Cyrus, I cannot believe that told him no.
14 You have -- you know, sometimes when kids get too much,
15 they don't appreciate it.

16 JIM: They don't have any.

17 RACHEL: He has a motorcycle, you know, a
18 real motorcycle.

19 JIM: Yeah.

20 RACHEL: He has a bicycle. They have these,
21 these, these big trucks that you buy at Toys R Us that
22 have -- they play with them in the sandbox, you know.

23 JIM: Right.

24 RACHEL: And they have a sandbox. We had a
25 swimming pool in the summer. They have these big
trucks, like a couple dozen of them, you know, for all

1 the kids to play with. I mean, he's got blocks, he's
2 got so many -- as a matter of fact, he had so many toys
3 I had to pack them away, because --

4 JIM: Yeah.

5 RACHEL: You know, they have so many toys.
6 You know how kids are.

7 JIM: Yeah.

8 RACHEL: They have so many toys that they
9 just get bored of them after a while.

10 JIM: Yeah.

11 RACHEL: He like, he's really an outdoor
12 child, he loves to be outside.

13 JIM: You don't have to explain that to me,
14 Rachel, kids are all like that. My little boy's the
15 same way. I'll say, Matthew, I'll say, you know --

16 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

17 JIM: Do you need anything, Matthew? Oh,
18 yeah, Dad, I don't have any toys. Yeah, right, you
19 know. That's all we do.

20 RACHEL: He, he heard me telling you, he
21 goes, he goes Mom, I forgot about that. He's telling
22 me that right now.

23 JIM: Hey, oh, I know what I wanted to tell
24 you while I got you.

25 RACHEL: What?

JIM: I sent a message up to the commanders

1 on what you told me about that, two things on that
2 press briefing, okay?

3 RACHEL: Um-hum.

4 JIM: One was about the shootout in '88.

5 RACHEL: Um-hum.

6 JIM: I corrected them on that. It was not
7 the sheriff's department, okay?

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Indiscernible)

9 JIM: Hello? Hello? It's a radio or so--

10 RACHEL: What was that?

11 JIM: It's somebody on a ham radio.

12 RACHEL: That was loud.

13 JIM: Yeah. Well, we're here at the airport,
14 so there's a lot of, a lot of radios, you know. Hey,
15 anyway, remember what you were telling me about where
16 the -- remember the thing with Roden and the shootout?

17 RACHEL: Yeah.

18 JIM: And the agents, agents said it was the
19 sheriff's department?

20 RACHEL: Yeah. Um-hum.

21 JIM: Well, I corr-- sent it up and corrected
22 that, told them that was wrong, okay?

24 JIM: And then, also, about the saying all,
25 that all the women and children are at one place?

RACHEL: Right.

1 JIM: And we went back and looked at that

3 RACHEL: Uh-huh.

4 JIM: And apparently he said, well, that was
5 the information.

6 RACHEL: Uh-hum.

7 JIM: You know what I mean? He said that was
8 the information that they would be at one place, but,
9 you know. I told him, well, they were at one place,
10 so. Anyway, cleared that up.

11 RACHEL: All right.

12 JIM: At the 3:30 -- they're going to have
13 one at 3:30.

14 RACHEL: At 3:30?

15 JIM: And hopefully they'll -- I don't think
16 they'll mention about the, the placement of the women
17 and children, because they said well, we know that,
18 we're, you know, it was intelligence.

19 RACHEL: Okay.

20 JIM: Is David up?

21 RACHEL: His eyes are closed again, but Steve
22 is here now. So.

23 JIM: Well, I need, I got to talk to David.

24 RACHEL: Well, let me talk, let you talk to
25 Steve first, okay?

JIM: Okay.

1 STEVE: Hello, Jim.

2 JIM: Steve.

3 STEVE: What's happening, now?

4 JIM: Well, I'm working on the --

5 STEVE: With the dog thing?

6 JIM: Yeah, that's, that's still in the
7 telephone.

8 STEVE: Look, we're about ready to go do it
9 anyway, so, you know, you make up your mind what you
10 want to do about that, because we're, you know, we're
11 not going to allow those bodies to be laying around
12 there. You know, it's not a, it's a problem, so --

13 JIM: No, okay. It's just for your safety,
14 it's nothing --

15 STEVE: Right, but I was annoyed, because I
16 had a lot of the people come tell me that different
17 parts of the night toward the morning, you had guys

20 they watched them in and on the property and --

22 STEVE: You know, you and I had come to an
23 agreement long -- Henry --

1 and all that, but we, you and I, you and I have had
2 problems before that even, with the telephone cord,
3 getting a telephone five days ago, and a lot of little
4 things like that, that no one would come on past the
5 perimeter of the property, and yet we constantly see it
6 happening all the time. They ran over the guard shack
7 last night while I was watching.

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 STEVE: Hours before that they ran over
10 another place out by the back building. I mean, I
11 watched them do it, they're right on our land, you know
12 what I mean?

13 JIM: All right. I understand.

14 STEVE: Yeah, I know you understand, but I'll
15 tell you what. I don't know.

16 JIM: Listen, Steve. As soon as I talk to
17 David, I'll square the thing about the dogs, and you
18 can do it. But I need to talk to him.

19 STEVE: What do you want to talk to David
20 about? He's sleeping right now.

21 JIM: Well, well, I know but I got to talk to
22 him. I need to. About a couple of issues that are
23 important.

24 STEVE: Just hang on one minute, let me see.
25 [gap] He's barely being able to talk to me. He says
it'd take him a lot of energy right now to get on that

1 | phone and talk. And it's true, because --

2 | JIM: I understand. Well, I can wait a
3 | minute, but I really need to talk to him. As soon as I
4 | do --

5 | STEVE: For the first -- it took him a lot to
6 | get onto the toilet.

7 | JIM: Oh, I know.

8 | STEVE: Believe me.

9 | JIM: Well, I was glad to hear, Rachel told
10 | me that he, he was able to, you know have a bowel
11 | movement and everything was okay, no blood or anything,
12 | so --

13 | STEVE: Right. Right.

14 | JIM: Can you take the phone over to him?

15 | STEVE: I could, but he's, he just told me,
16 | he just peeped out. He hasn't, you know, since he, he
17 | went --

18 | JIM: Okay, just take your time, it's not
19 | that -- I mean, just take a few minutes, and, and --

20 | STEVE: No, but he just told me what to do,
21 | Jim.

22 | JIM: What?

23 | STEVE: You're not -- I mean, he's not even
24 | talking to me right now. He just said to him, right
25 | now it's taking too much -- since I went to the
bathroom, he says, I just want to say it's taking me

1 | too much energy for right now.

2 | JIM: Yeah.

3 | STEVE: He says, give me a little time. And
4 | that's what happened yesterday. He, you know, he
5 | talked for awhile, then he had to get a little rest,
6 | then he'd recover.

7 | JIM: Okay.

8 | STEVE: What's happening?

9 | JIM: Well, I just -- you know, take a few
10 | minutes and I'll, I just want you to -- and I'll talk
11 | to him. I mean --

12 | STEVE: You didn't hear me. I mean, it's not
13 | up to me. I mean, if you wanted to talk to me, I've
14 | got my own choice, you've got your choice, whether you
15 | want to talk to me. He just said not right now.

16 | JIM: Yeah.

17 | STEVE: He can't. I mean, I'm looking, I can
18 | see him from where I am, he is real weak.

19 | JIM: Okay.

20 | STEVE: I saw him make the attempt to, you
21 | know, go to the bathroom and all that. I'm telling you
22 | it -- well, you know yourself the guy should be,
23 | probably be dead.

24 | JIM: Um-hum.

25 | STEVE: To be -- hello?

 JIM: Yeah, I'm still here.

1 STEVE: What's that -- what, what are you
2 doing right now with the clicking?

3 JIM: Oh, I just bumped the phone, that's
4 all.

5 STEVE: Oh, okay. But I mean, I'm telling
6 you the truth --

7 JIM: Oh, I know you are, I know you are.

8 STEVE: He'll get back to you, or you, we can
9 -- I'll keep an eye on him.

10 JIM: Okay.

11 STEVE: Okay, he's, he's trying to muster it
12 together right now. He says, let me try and talk to
13 him now.

14 JIM: Oh, okay.

15 STEVE: Hang on, hang on.

16 JIM: Okay. Here he comes.

17 DAVID: Hey, Jim.

18 JIM: Hey, David.

19 DAVID: Oh.

20 JIM: Hey, listen, I know you're tired,
21 buddy, but Rachel told me you were able to go to the
22 bathroom there.

23 DAVID: Well, what happened was -- I tell
24 you, this is weird. It took me, I don't know, probably
25 about, I don't know, 15, 20 minutes to make it up.

JIM: Oh, shoot, yeah.

1 DAVID: And then, this, this bucket that I
2 went in -- how tall is this bucket, Rach?

3 RACHEL: About a foot.

4 DAVID: About a foot. And I -- oh, boy,
5 talking about a, you know --

6 JIM: Yeah.

7 DAVID: I used to do gymnastics, you know.

8 JIM: Yeah.

9 DAVID: So I was pretty strong in my arms and
10 stuff.

11 JIM: Yeah.

12 DAVID: But, oh man.

13 JIM: Well, we, I need to get you out of
14 there.

15 DAVID: I tell you.

16 JIM: I need to get you to the doctor.

17 DAVID: Look --

18 JIM: But listen, let me tell you why I
19 called. I got some important things. I didn't want to
20 discuss them with Steve, okay?

21 DAVID: Okay.

22 JIM: And I love Steve, but I want, I want to
23 be straight up and discuss them with you, okay?

24 DAVID: All right.

25 JIM: And I don't want any mixed signals,
okay? The first thing is, the tactical teams out there

1 | have recovered a body out in the ravine.

2 | DAVID: Have what?

3 | JIM: They found a body in the ravine.

4 | DAVID: Where's the ravine?

5 | JIM: Well, it's way out behind the compound,
6 | past those buildings out in the back. Be near the
7 | dairy barn.

8 | DAVID: Okay.

9 | JIM: You know where I'm talking about?

10 | DAVID: Uh-huh.

11 | JIM: Way out near the orchards out there?

12 | DAVID: Uh-huh.

13 | JIM: And then it was a man that was in a, a
14 | gun battle with agents Sunday, and they don't know his
15 | identity. I don't have his identity, okay?

16 | DAVID: Huh.

17 | JIM: And they picked him up, they picked the
18 | body up a little while ago, okay? And he had, he, the
19 | man had a gun with him, and we don't, I don't have his
20 | identity. When I get it, I will let you know, okay?

21 | DAVID: Huh.

22 | JIM: And, you know, I'm, I --

23 | DAVID: No.

24 | JIM: This is tragic news, and I'm sorry if
25 | he's one of your people. I don't know who -- his
identity, okay.

1 DAVID: Now this was Sunday?

2 JIM: Yeah, he -- yeah. He's been, he was
3 there, he's been there since Sunday.

4 DAVID: He's not, he's not one of us.

5 JIM: Okay, well, that's fine, I don't know
6 who he is. You know, I -- yeah, I don't know who he
7 is, you know. But anyway, we found him, and the
8 airplane spotted him the other day, I guess, or --

9 DAVID: A guy that was in there, and he had a
10 gun.

11 JIM: He's a man, he had a gun, he was a
12 white male, I believe.

13 DAVID: Uh-huh.

14 JIM: I may be wrong about that. Anyway,
15 I'll get you more details, okay?

16 DAVID: Huh.

17 JIM: Hey now, let me tell you something
18 else. Let's see.

19 DAVID: The only, the only, the only guys
20 that, that we know --

21 JIM: Maybe it was somebody trying to come
22 in, who knows.

23 DAVID: Huh.

24 JIM: You know.

25 DAVID: Couldn't, could be some people we
don't know that --

1 JIM: Yeah, it could be. Yeah.

2 DAVID: Guess you don't know about the
3 messengers, but not -- no, they wouldn't have brought
4 no guns, I mean, no.

5 JIM: Yeah. Well, listen, here's one thing.
6 This is a reason I'm calling also. Because we're
7 talking about, Steve wants to go out and bury the dogs,
8 okay?

9 DAVID: Oh, we got to get rid of -- the dogs
10 are, they're, they're smelling --

11 JIM: I know, okay, so Steve wants to move
12 them, right?

13 DAVID: Just pull them out, yeah, away from
14 the building, yeah.

15 DAVID: Okay, so I've talked to the tactical
16 teams, and here's the deal, and I want you and I to be
17 clear on this, 'cause I don't want any --

18 DAVID: Oh, but I -- yeah, did -- see, that's
19 another thing that we was telling to Henry last night,
20 is that, you know, these guys out here that think
21 they're sneaking around, you know, don't realize that,
22 you know, they, they think they've got their snipers
23 and all that and their, their, their infrared and
24 everything, you know.

25 JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: You know, you know, an infrared unit

1 | only costs 750 bucks.

2 | JIM: Well, you got them too, right?

3 | DAVID: And a starlight scope, you know,
4 | costs up to 45 to 7,000, you know?

5 | JIM: Right.

6 | DAVID: Specificity, PVS 4, you know.

7 | JIM: Um-hum.

8 | DAVID: You know, the good ones, the
9 | government spec.

10 | JIM: Right.

11 | DAVID: You know, I, I'm trying to tell you
12 | something.

13 | JIM: I know you got them, David.

14 | DAVID: And the thing of it is, is that, you
15 | know --

16 | JIM: Yeah.

17 | DAVID: You know, these guys, these guys
18 | don't need to keep pushing and pushing, I mean, you
19 | know, it's, it's, kind of cheeky when a guy thinks
20 | he's, or some guys think they're sneaking up and stuff
21 | like that, and they end up getting a bullet in their
22 | butt.

23 | JIM: Um-hum.

24 | DAVID: You know, it's not necessary. Of
25 | course, I told the guys last time, I said, just, you
 | know, they're out there in the front car snooping

1 around, you know.

2 JIM: Um-hum.

3 DAVID: It's, it's just not worth it right
4 now, you know?

5 JIM: Yeah, I agree with you. And --

6 DAVID: And, and as far -- now, another thing
7 is as far as -- like when they ran over that blue shed,
8 you know, there's thing, there's possessions in that
9 shed that do not belong to people on this property.

10 JIM: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: They belong to people outside this
12 property.

13 JIM: Right, I understand.

14 DAVID: You know, there's a lot of people out
15 there that have come to visit and have, you know,
16 learned a few things and you know, they're still like,
17 you know, in the decision of whether or not -- that's
18 interesting, but they still carry on their normal,
19 every-day lives. They're not, have not committed
20 themselves to actually full-time religion, so to speak.

21 JIM: Well, David, let me run a couple things
22 by you first, okay?

23 DAVID: Oh, okay.

24 JIM: The tactical people are reporting to me
25 that, that they think they see something with a scope,
maybe a rifle. I, you know, they're not saying it is a

1 rifle, but they think they see something with a scope
2 in one of the front windows near the front door, okay.
3 And, you know, they're just, they're just advising, you
4 know, that -- they, they want to make sure that
5 everyone in there knows the rules for your safety,
6 okay?

7 DAVID: Yeah, well the thing of it is, is
8 that be sure to advise them that whereas they have lots
9 of scopes zoomed in on us, especially when they're
10 projecting possibly as -- well, I don't if they've got
11 actually azimuth on their, on their, on their little
12 guns, their .25 millimeter gun they're pointing at us
13 all the time. You know, remember, you know, remember
14 whereas, whereas they have certain military tactical
15 abilities to zero in and scope in on certain
16 objectives, you know, likewise we have that same
17 ability.

18 JIM: Right.

19 DAVID: And, you know, when it, when it comes
20 down to, when it comes down to triggering in, it comes
21 down to triggering in. Now, now you all promised you
22 all were, you all were going to cease fire.

23 JIM: Right.

24 DAVID: Okay.

25 JIM: We have.

 DAVID: And so we have too.

1 JIM: Right.

2 DAVID: Whereas you have lied on your part,
3 in that you have not been honest in regards to keeping
4 your men off our property. I mean, you know, some --
5 if, if you think some of your men are, are, are, you
6 know, not vulnerable to, to, to flying, flying lead,
7 you know --

8 JIM: Oh, I know that.

9 DAVID: -- then -- Well, that's, that's
10 what's going on here. But like I say, you know, I
11 also, I also realize that, you know -- I, I can't
12 expect, you know, honesty a hundred percent from your
13 side, because like I say, you're a negotiator, you
14 know.

15 JIM: Well, David, you, you know --

16 DAVID: And you do not, you do not honor my
17 God and you don't understand what's going on, and you
18 don't understand what authority I'm under, you know,
19 whereas I do understand what authority you're under.

20 JIM: Um-hum.

21 DAVID: You know, you're allowed to
22 philosophically, sociologically, analytically,
23 politically say any and all things rationally,
24 irrationally, to, you know, achieve what you and the
25 system that backs you designs to achieve. Whereas, I
have to --

1 JIM: I'm just trying to achieve your safety,
2 is all I'm trying to achieve.

3 DAVID: -- tell you -- exactly. And I'm
4 trying to ensure your safety.

5 JIM: Um-hum.

6 DAVID: You know.

7 JIM: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: But you just do not fear God. And
9 you do not give glory to Him.

10 JIM: David --

11 DAVID: And you do not believe in the hour of
12 His judgement. You, you fail to avail yourself of the
13 knowledge --

14 JIM: What did you say? Wait, don't, don't
15 do that, no. Wait a minute. I'm talking to David.
16 Hey, David?

17 DAVID: -- of the knowledge --

18 JIM: Listen, let me, let me, let me run this
19 by you.

20 DAVID: -- of his seals, you see?

21 JIM: Okay, go ahead.

22 DAVID: So, so, so by, by, by denying
23 yourself an opportunity to hear any and all ones that
24 God has chosen to teach you God's word, I mean his
25 seal, by, by procrastinating and being a part of a
political system that says, "In God We Trust," --

1 JIM: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: -- and yet denying the God who has
3 seven seals of which when there's time no longer, you
4 are actually fostering politically a religious reality
5 that is a lie unto God. A nation that, that, that
6 shadows and covers religious observation which, in
7 itself, denies the very reason for the new covenant:
8 the revelation of the seven seals.

9 JIM: Um-hum.

10 DAVID: So that's why the Bible calls this
11 kind of system a whore or a harlot. I mean, she, she
12 professes affection and association to Christ, but the
13 thing of it is, is that she claims to be one with
14 Christ, but yet she doesn't even really totally know
15 the man.

16 JIM: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: And that's where the seals become a
18 means of judgement for the last phase. And so go
19 ahead, what were you gonna say, Jim?

20 JIM: Well David, thanks. Listen, just give
21 me a minute, because my, my commanders are wanting me
22 to tell you this, and what they're saying is, these are
23 the rules for your safety, okay, and I want you to know
24 them. They're just telling me no one will be allowed
25 to exit the building, okay, with a weapon. And that's
important. Now, I told --

1 DAVID: Oh, we, we, we knew that.

2 JIM: I, I told him, I told him you already
3 know that. I told him you already know that. But they
4 wanted me to ensure that I told you. I said, I've
5 already told David that. Just telling you that for
6 your own protection. They said if any of the agents
7 out there, you know, perceive that their lives or the
8 life of someone else is at risk, that they'll take
9 appropriate action to ensure their own safety.

10 DAVID: Okay, so in other words --

11 JIM: And I said David knows that, you know
12 -- wait, let, you just give me a minute, and then, and
13 then we'll discuss it.

14 DAVID: All right.

15 JIM: And they said that no one will be
16 allowed to aim a weapon from a window, as this may be
17 also perceived by our agents as a threat to their lives
18 or safety.

19 JIM: Well, yet they're allowed to aim them
20 at us, right?

21 JIM: Well, okay, let me get through -- and
22 compel them to act accordingly, that's what they say.

23 DAVID: Okay.

24 JIM: That any time you exit the building and
25 are approaching our agent, you must fully comply with
any verbal instructions to avoid exposing yourself to

1 | any potential risk, okay? So what they're saying is,
2 | don't come outside with any guns, don't point any guns
3 | out the windows, and if you walk out and they tell you
4 | to, you know, put your hands up or down or something,
5 | you just do it. Now, I told them you already knew
6 | that, but they said, well, we want to make sure that,
7 | you know, everybody does it.

8 | DAVID: So they're that close to do that,
9 | huh?

10 | JIM: Well, you know, in those, in those
11 | vehicles out there, you know.

12 | DAVID: Yeah.

13 | JIM: Listen now, let -- I got to --

14 | DAVID: So see, so see, all last night, you
15 | know, we're telling Henry this and Henry's denying it
16 | up and down.

17 | JIM: Yeah.

18 | DAVID: You know, and the thing of it is, you
19 | know, on one hand, you all are saying we have
20 | explosives here --

21 | JIM: Yeah.

22 | DAVID: -- which you know could turn one of
23 | those vehicles up 40 or 50 feet in the air.

24 | JIM: Well, we, we realize that.

25 | DAVID: Okay, if you realize that, you know,
and then you're talking all this, this, out of the, you

1 know, side of the mouth, you're just basically lying
2 and all that, I mean --

3 JIM: No, no --

4 DAVID: -- what happens when, when this all
5 gets heated and you get somebody mad and, and these
6 cars go flying, you know, 40, 50 feet in the air out
7 towards the lake.

8 JIM: Yeah.

9 DAVID: I mean, then you guys are going to
10 get mad, you know. Okay, you all been preparing eight
11 months for this.

12 JIM: Uh-hum.

13 DAVID: How long do you think we've been
14 preparing?

15 JIM: Um-hum. I understand. Well, we,
16 they're just trying to set up safely. They're not
17 coming in or anything.

18 DAVID: Hey, but you lied to me, my friend.

19 JIM: When did I lie? We, we never lied.

20 DAVID: You lied to me.

21 JIM: About what?

22 DAVID: You lied, and you have consistently
23 lied.

24 JIM: David, we told you everything we were
25 doing, every single thing we were doing.

DAVID: No. So, you know, it's been in my

1 | behalf and in my good favor that these gentlemen that
2 | have tried to, or thought they were sneaking in on the
3 | property --

4 | JIM: Um-hum.

5 | DAVID: -- you know, they --

6 | JIM: Well, let --

7 | DAVID: -- they, occupying these, these
8 | really poor, poor shelters of automobiles and, you
9 | know, things like that, the van and everything.

10 | JIM: Um-hum.

11 | DAVID: You know, it's a shame that --

12 | JIM: I think you're giving us more credit
13 | than we deserve, I don't, I don't think they're, any of
14 | them been that close to you, really.

15 | DAVID: Well, oh yeah.

16 | JIM: I mean, they, they haven't been that
17 | far. These guys don't want to get that close. I mean
18 | --

19 | DAVID: No, they're, they're close. That's
20 | why we have this problem with getting rid of these
21 | dogs.

22 | JIM: Yeah.

23 | DAVID: 'Cause --

24 | JIM: Oh, no, no, no, that's not it. You can
25 | go do the, you can do the dogs. I just wanted to tell
 | you that, not to carry a gun out. You can go do the

1 | dogs if you want to.

2 | DAVID: Okay.

3 | JIM: Go tell Steve to do them.

4 | DAVID: But not, you know, last night we, we
5 | saw, we saw the guys and stuff like that, but I, I told
6 | the people, I said look, you know, leave them alone,
7 | you know. That, you know, the tanks came around and
8 | went up, you know, behind our building here and started
9 | sinking in the mud, that was pretty funny to watch. So
10 | they had to move their position.

11 | JIM: Yeah.

12 | DAVID: And there's, there's certain parts of
13 | the property here that --

14 | JIM: I understand. Well, that was a good
15 | thing to tell them. I, what I would tell Steve is just
16 | go do the dogs before dark, and slowly walk out. You
17 | just have their hands in clear sight and don't worry
18 | about it. Go ahead and do it. You know, I think, you
19 | got to admit, David, that there could be some of the
20 | guys in there, and you and I both discussed it, that
21 | are somewhat apprehensive.

22 | DAVID: Oh, definitely.

23 | JIM: And, you know, I --

24 | DAVID: Especially when they can see what's
25 | going on.

 JIM: Yeah. We, you know, we don't have

1 ninjas out there, I mean, they can't get right up to
2 you, you know, it's --

3 DAVID: Well, they get, they get pretty
4 close.

5 JIM: Yeah. Well --

6 DAVID: And, and these guys that are putting
7 all these branches in their head and so on, that don't
8 work, you know. It doesn't really work.

9 JIM: I, I understand that. Well hey, tell
10 Steve to go ahead and do the dogs so I can tell them
11 he's going to do it.

12 DAVID: Okay.

13 JIM: All right.

14 DAVID: Steve --

15 JIM: Wait, hold on, hold on one second.

16 DAVID: Okay. Just have the dogs pulled out
17 towards the (Indiscernible) out in the open, okay.

18 JIM: Hey, Steve -- hey, David?

19 DAVID: Sir?

20 JIM: One second, before you tell Steve to do
21 that.

22 DAVID: All right.

23 JIM: I got a good idea, okay?

24 DAVID: Okay.

25 JIM: You tell me if this'll work for you.

They just told me the phone's ready. Okay?

1 DAVID: All right.

2 JIM: It's out there. I'll have one of those
3 armored vehicles bring that phone -- I'm looking at a
4 picture here, you know, up where the road curves on
5 your property, now, up where the road curves, right
6 behind that big bus, okay? I'll have them drop the
7 phone there and then go back out, okay? Gonna leave it
8 right in the middle of the road, of your dirt road.
9 And then you, then you tell Steve, after they do that,
10 that him and one other guy, no more than two, can go
11 outside and they can do what they want with the dogs
12 and they can retrieve the phone. Is that fair enough?

13 DAVID: Okay, Steve, here's what they want to
14 do. They want to bring a, one of the Bradleys in, and
15 they want to come up to the, to behind the big bus.

16 JIM: Right where it curves there.

17 DAVID: You know, right where the, right the
18 curve of the street is. And what happens is, they want
19 to drop the phone off, and then they say --

20 JIM: At the wire.

21 DAVID: -- and they say they want to leave,
22 they want to get out.

23 JIM: No, they'll leave.

24 DAVID: And --

25 STEVE: What's wrong with where the gate,
guard gate is, we walk up --

1 JIM: Yeah, you can watch them. We'll leave

2 --

3 DAVID: Well, here, Steve has a question real
4 quick.

5 JIM: Okay.

6 STEVE: Jim.

7 JIM: Steve.

8 STEVE: Yeah, what's wrong with that, we've
9 always walked up to the guard gate and come back again,
10 that's been no problem thus far.

11 JIM: Well, I mean, you got a heavy, you got
12 a whole lot of wire, they told me. And I, you know,
13 that's fine. I mean, we can arrange that.

14 STEVE: Okay.

15 JIM: But I, we, we --

16 STEVE: Let's do that.

17 JIM: What we -- you, you want to walk to the
18 guard gate?

19 STEVE: Yeah, sure. Need the exercise.

20 JIM: No? Wait a minute. Let me, I'll have
21 to clear it.

22 STEVE: All right.

23 JIM: You, you sure they can't just drop it
24 by the bus?

25 STEVE: What, what did you all -- I'm very
curious to know what you all told David about these

1 | guys sneaking around at night and all, running over the
2 | guard shacks and all that kind of thing.

3 | JIM: You can, you can tell him, I didn't
4 | tell him anything.

5 | STEVE: You didn't tell him anything?

6 | JIM: Uh-uh. I mean, I didn't, he told me.

7 | STEVE: Can I get someone on the phone that
8 | knows what in the, is happening here? I mean why these
9 | guys are allowed to do that?

10 | DAVID: (In background.) Why they're risking
11 | their lives.

12 | STEVE: Why are they risking their -- I'm
13 | going to tell you something. If we, if we really
14 | wanted to, you must know this, that's why I reminded
15 | you this morning or earlier in the day when I got on
16 | the phone.

17 | JIM: Right.

18 | STEVE: When they came there Sunday after you
19 | guys pulled what you pulled --

20 | JIM: Um-hum.

21 | STEVE: We allowed them to come in and take
22 | the wounded because we didn't want them dead in the
23 | first place.

24 | JIM: Right.

25 | STEVE: We could have opened the fire on so
many of those guys out there.

1 JIM: Um-hum.

2 STEVE: We, but we didn't start this thing.

3 JIM: Um-hum.

4 STEVE: That's, I mean, it'll be -- I don't
5 care if it's brought out in the court of the, the land,
6 the courts of this land or not, but one day, I mean,
7 it'll be brought out and the world will get to see it.

8 JIM: Right, I understand.

9 STEVE: Why, I know you say you understand --

10 JIM: Well, I do. I mean, what, what do you
11 want me to say? I'm trying --

12 STEVE: Well, I'd like to be talking to a guy
13 that really's got some authority or that means what he
14 says -- I mean, I know you do, but so far it doesn't
15 seem like, you know, what you've been telling me, like
16 what he's saying also, the same annoys me.

17 JIM: Yeah.

18 STEVE: That's why I must admit, I had a
19 little chagrin and a smile on my face the other day
20 when they said we didn't come out, he didn't keep his
21 word.

22 JIM: Yeah.

23 STEVE: But you guys have got it your one way
24 right now, because of course, we can't speak to the
25 press but -- I don't know if we can or can't yet.

JIM: Um-hum. I understand.

1 STEVE: I mean, you know, you guys, of
2 course, I don't -- what are you trying to hide, you
3 know. What are you got planned, what are you up to?
4 What are you gonna do? What have you done to people in
5 the past? That's why I raised those questions with you
6 about your agency earlier. I've heard -- anything I've
7 ever heard about that agency, it's not been too good.

8 JIM: Okay. I unders-- Can I talk to David?
9 I want him to talk about this phone thing. And then,
10 and then the dogs, so we can get it done.

11 STEVE: He wants to talk to you about this
12 phone thing and then the dogs. Well, you can talk to
13 me, why -- you can talk to him, it's --

14 JIM: Okay. What we'll do, how's this sound.
15 We'll have the --

16 STEVE: Wait, wait, just a minute.

17 DAVID: (In background) (Indiscernible) at
18 least 150 feet of --

19 STEVE: We need at least 150 feet of line.

20 JIM: Okay, let me talk to him a minute.

21 STEVE: Okay, just a minute.

22 JIM: He says, he'll let me talk to him.

23 Okay.

24 DAVID: Okay, Jim.

25 JIM: Okay, Dave, here's what we'll do.

 DAVID: Yeah.

1 JIM: We'll, we'll take, we'll have the
2 Bradley bring it up halfway up the drive, halfway to
3 the bus and drop it. They'll leave. Then you send
4 your two men out to get it, the wire, and then you do
5 the dogs. How's that?

6 DAVID: They, they want to bring it, they
7 want to bring it up close, Steve.

8 JIM: Not close, halfway to the bus, that's
9 all.

10 DAVID: They want to bring it halfway to the
11 bus.

12 STEVE: (In background.) That's, you know,
13 they're into mind games, they're into --

14 DAVID: You want to --

15 JIM: We, we'd bring it all the way, but
16 Steve said no, so I'm just telling them to bring it
17 halfway, we'll drop it, and we'll leave.

18 DAVID: They want -- I don't think they want
19 to go full, full. Our guys want to go full, full with
20 us, right?

21 JIM: Right. They don't want to -- yeah.
22 You don't want them to come in all the way in there.
23 We will have, but if you --

24 DAVID: No, no, no, no. What I'm saying is,
25 is that, is that you want to, you want to, you want to,
you want to, you want to go knuckles to knuckles now.

1 | You want to have an all-out, right? (Unidentified male
2 | voice in background not discernible.)

3 | JIM: No, no, no. We're just dropping off a
4 | phone.

5 | DAVID: No, you, no you're not. What you're
6 | doing is, is you're breaking a principle. First of
7 | all, we established, when I started releasing some of
8 | these children, that you would not be on the property.
9 | You lied. You have always been lying. They've been
10 | creeping up closer and closer. Now, you, you say
11 | you've got all this sophisticated tactical weapons, you
12 | know, okay, fine. And you believe that we have
13 | somewhat also, to a smaller degree, some also tactical
14 | weapons.

15 | JIM: Um-hum.

16 | DAVID: Okay. So, you know, there's on the
17 | telephone individuals saying, well, let's go, let's go,
18 | let's hit it in the ring, let's go head to head, you
19 | know. Okay. So what you're doing is, you're
20 | consistently stepping an inch by inch into our
21 | perimeter and trying to gain more territory on you, at
22 | the same time acting as if you're, you're, you're still
23 | abiding by the rules. It's like a Indian contract.

24 | JIM: But no, no one's taken any shots,
25 | aggressive action --

 DAVID: No, we haven't, we --

1 JIM: And we haven't either.

2 DAVID: We maybe should have.

3 JIM: Well, we haven't either.

4 DAVID: We maybe should have.

5 JIM: Look, what's at the --

6 DAVID: Because you have lied, Jim.

7 JIM: David --

8 DAVID: Your organization in this United
9 States of America is a liar. Oh, yeah, you're acting
10 lamb-like. You're saying peace, but you are lying.
11 But no, no, you won't let me have access to the outside
12 world and tell what we have been observing.

13 JIM: When you come out you will

14 DAVID: No, no, no. Here's the thing. What
15 you have been doing is, you have been proving to my God
16 --

17 JIM: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: -- and to the people that have heard
19 me speak plainly for seven years, that you are one who
20 speaks as a dragon. You're saying peace with your
21 mouth.

22 JIM: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: But your words are words of a dragon,
24 you know.

25 JIM: Hey --

DAVID: So now here you're saying, well,

1 Dave, let's just bring the Bradley right in there next
2 to the bus, you know, and you know, let's just drop the
3 phone off, and so again, here we go. We see another
4 delineation of the original purpose of our negotiation
5 and now -- what, what do you want do to next? Next
6 thing, you want to bring the cord and maybe drive the
7 tank right inside the building here and hand it to us?

8 JIM: Okay, hey, hey, David. It wasn't that
9 big an issue with us. I was just trying to save you
10 from carrying all the wire. We'll drop it out on the
11 driveway.

12 DAVID: It's only 150 feet.

13 JIM: Okay. Well, I haven't seen this thing.
14 I'll have them drop it right by the guard shack, okay?

15 DAVID: Well, that, that definitely shows
16 more realism on your part of sincerity.

17 JIM: Okay. I mean, it wasn't that big an
18 issue. I was trying to save the guy from, I was trying
19 to save your man from feeling like he had to be exposed
20 for 150 yards and carry it back, you know.

21 DAVID: Well, the thing of it is, you, you're
22 not going to fire upon him, you said you weren't.

23 JIM: Obviously, but I know he's, they're
24 somewhat apprehensive. It's not that big an issue with
25 me, I'll do it your way.

DAVID: Well --

1 JIM: Just put it there, and then, and then
2 do the dogs, no more than two guys, go ahead and do it,
3 okay?

4 DAVID: Okay, we'll go ahead and tell Steve
5 that so he knows you're not -- 'cause I'm still batting
6 for you guys, too.

7 JIM: Okay, what -- okay.

8 DAVID: You understand, they're --

9 JIM: I thought you were in charge.

10 DAVID: They're telling me, they're telling
11 all night about all these, you know, things that you
12 all guys are doing around here, contrary against what
13 you're saying.

14 JIM: I -- Dave, between you and me, between
15 you and me, now, I think some of the guys are getting
16 apprehensive in there, seeing --

17 DAVID: Oh, definitely.

18 JIM: -- seeing the bushes and the shadows,
19 because there's nobody been up that close.

20 DAVID: (Laughs.)

21 JIM: It's not true. I mean, we're, those
22 --

23 DAVID: Do you know the tank just, just last
24 night, came right out here and drove right beside us on
25 our, on our, on our power plant side of the building.
Maneuvered around and came right down and maneuvered

1 --

2 JIM: Well, that was a shift change,
3 probably.

4 DAVID: -- by the -- It's not supposed to be
5 on our property.

6 JIM: Yeah, well, yeah, I understand what
7 you're saying.

8 DAVID: You know, and they, and right out
9 here, they, they drove over our guard shack on our
10 property.

11 JIM: Um-hum.

12 DAVID: They drove over the blue, the blue
13 building.

14 JIM: David, while, while they're delivering
15 that telephone, can we talk about Cyrus for a minute?

16 DAVID: Sure we can talk about Cyrus.

17 JIM: Rachel asked about him going with his
18 grandmother.

19 DAVID: Well, that's, that's what, that's
20 what they want. But we already know what the law is.

21 JIM: Well, we called Child Protective
22 Services, okay? And we said look, this boy's in here
23 and his grandmother lives in Chandler, Texas.

24 DAVID: Um-hum.

25 JIM: And --

DAVID: She's a nurse.

1 JIM: Yeah, and said what a, you know, what's
2 the deal here. And they said well, it's, you know,
3 it's their policy to turn the children over to
4 relatives, and, and those -- and that's what they want
5 to do. And we asked them specifically about, is it
6 Mrs. Haldeman? Haldeman or something?

7 DAVID: Um-hum.

8 JIM: And they said yeah, we don't -- they
9 said they didn't think there'd be an objection to that.

10 DAVID: But they haven't done that so far
11 with any of the children.

12 JIM: No, no, all the children are kept
13 together, okay.

14 DAVID: No, the -- they said they were
15 putting them in foster homes temporarily.

16 JIM: No, no, they're still all together.

17 DAVID: Oh, okay.

18 JIM: Yeah. And they said that, you know,
19 they're kind of -- 'cause they know each other and, and
20 what they wanted to do was keep them together. And
21 then when you guys walked out safely, they, they said
22 that, you know, the parents that are released, they
23 want to be able to give their children back to them.
24 And then --

25 DAVID: Oh, Jim.

 JIM: Well, no --

1 DAVID: Okay, I'll be good, go ahead.

2 JIM: Hey, everybody -- you and I don't, both
3 know that everybody in there --

4 DAVID: No, you're right.

5 JIM: -- is not gonna be charged. You know,
6 you and I both know that. I think --

7 DAVID: Yeah, especially with, with the way
8 it's looking right now, especially like the ATF agents
9 and some of the film coverage in regards to actually
10 who shot first and --

11 JIM: Well, I --

12 DAVID: They just said it was actually an
13 accident. I mean, I was standing there in the door. I
14 was telling -- I was standing there in the door, they,
15 they did hear me say, you know, go back, there's women
16 and children here, let's talk about this. And, you
17 know, they, they did see me, you know --

18 JIM: Yeah, I know.

19 DAVID: They did see me fall back, you know,
20 when, when -- of course there's, all of a sudden
21 (Indiscernible) --

22 JIM: Right.

23 DAVID: And you all did fire first and
24 everything.

25 JIM: There's some film of that, and, and
that'll get out in the court.

1 DAVID: That's right.

2 JIM: And that'll get out in the courtroom.

3 But --

4 DAVID: But actually there's the agents who,
5 who admitted to it, that's the real important thing.

6 JIM: Well, that's, that's good for your, for
7 your side. And the truth needs to come out, I think,
8 don't you?

9 DAVID: Oh, it will.

10 JIM: All right. Well, how, how about Cyrus?
11 Now we've taken care of the telephone and the --

12 DAVID: Well, it's, you know, Cyrus --

13 JIM: -- and the dogs. I mean you --

14 DAVID: Cyrus -- look, here's the children
15 that need to go to that, to that side, okay?

16 JIM: Okay. Tell me who they are.

17 DAVID: I'm gonna, well, I'm just gonna give
18 you a few names at a time.

19 JIM: Okay. That's great.

20 DAVID: Okay?

21 JIM: Um-hum.

22 DAVID: Oh, see, you all ain't gonna do this.

23 I mean --

24 JIM: Yeah, we'll take care of it, come on.

25 DAVID: Okay. Cyrus, Star, and Bobby.

 JIM: Cyrus, Star, and Bobby, okay.

1 JIM: I want, I want to get you, I want to
2 get you --

3 DAVID: -- the, the shrink that he used just,
4 with just the parts that I could use without any pain.

5 JIM: Listen, when, when -- and I, and
6 listen, don't get me wrong. Don't get me wrong, I'm
7 not pushing you, but when you decide to come out, we're
8 going to make sure you get the best medical care and
9 get your strength back and get that fixed up, okay?

10 DAVID: Well, I'm drinking grape juice now
11 because, like I said, the loss of blood was a lot.

12 JIM: I know it.

13 DAVID: So as long as I'm in a prone
14 position, you know, my vital signs and all that are
15 good.

16 JIM: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: But it's like, it's just like any,
18 it's like it, it's probably a bit of anemia because of
19 the loss of blood, and I need, I need just to build up
20 blood content a little bit.

21 JIM: All right.

22 DAVID: So we're, we're utilizing the proper
23 juices to do that with.

24 JIM: Okay. Well, think about walking out of
25 there and getting some good medical care, and leading
all those people out. They need you.

1 DAVID: Yeah. Well, let's think about God on
2 the throne too now, Jim.

3 JIM: Okay, David, I will.

4 DAVID: I want you all in the, in your system
5 and all the men of this nation who have ears to hear
6 and eyes to see to have every opportunity --

7 JIM: I know.

8 DAVID: -- before you end up standing in
9 front of guns that you have no power against.

10 JIM: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: I mean honestly.

12 JIM: Okay.

13 DAVID: Okie-doke.

14 JIM: Hey, watch that thing at 3:30.

15 DAVID: I will.

16 JIM: And I'll talk to you later.

17 DAVID: Thank you now. Bye.

18 JIM: Bye.

19 * * * *

20 RACHEL: Hello?

21 JIM: Rachel?

22 RACHEL: Yeah.

23 JIM: This is Jim. Is David there?

24 RACHEL: Yeah, but we'll talk to you later
25 'cause he's listening, he's watching the TV.

 JIM: Well, but listen, this is an emergency.

1 The guys in tactical vehicles just told me that three
2 men walked out of the house carrying guns. This is --

3 RACHEL: No, I, I don't think that's true.

4 JIM: Well, they -- it is true. They just
5 told us.

6 RACHEL: Just a minute.

7 JIM: The red side?

8 STEVE: Hello?

9 JIM: Hello, Steve?

10 STEVE: Yeah.

11 JIM: This is Jim.

12 STEVE: Jim, okay.

13 JIM: The tactical guys just reported that
14 three men just walked out of your building with guns.

15 STEVE: With guns.

16 JIM: With guns.

17 STEVE: No, they didn't.

18 JIM: Well --

19 STEVE: That's not true.

20 JIM: Over on the --

21 STEVE: I can tell you their very names who
22 went out to get the dogs and drag the bodies of those
23 dogs --

24 JIM: What were then carrying? What were
25 they carrying?

STEVE: Probably shovels.

1 JIM: Okay, 'cause --

2 STEVE: Or were they -- wait, just, let me
3 find out.

4 JIM: Okay.

5 STEVE: I'll tell you the very names of --

6 JIM: Just confirm it. Just confirm it.

7 STEVE: Okay. Wait just a minute. Would
8 somebody go there for me and look to see who went out
9 to take the dogs?

10 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE SPEAKER: Cliff and Greg.

11 STEVE: Cliff and Greg did? Two guys did,
12 right? That's it, two?

13 JIM: Two? They said three. You check and
14 tell me.

15 STEVE: And they're unarmed, totally unarmed.

16 JIM: Okay. All right, let me tell them.

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 JIM: Totally unarmed. Yeah. What were they
19 carrying, they asked?

20 STEVE: What were they carrying? Well find
21 it, tell somebody right -- find out. Who's around
22 here? Okay.

23 JIM: Okay, maybe is it just shovels?

24 STEVE: I don't know yet.

25 JIM: Okay. Which door did they go out, the
front?

1 STEVE: The front.

2 JIM: Okay.

3 STEVE: That's where the dogs are, right --
4 in fact, as you look to the building, the dogs would be
5 to the left side of the entrance.

6 JIM: Okay. Yeah, that's --

7 STEVE: I'm waiting to hear back from them,
8 but they --

9 JIM: Still there? Steve.

10 * * * *

11 STEVE: Hello, Jim.

12 JIM: Hello. Yeah, Steve?

13 STEVE: Yes. You were right, there were
14 three guys out there. One guy took it upon --

15 JIM: Okay, hold, hold on a minute, Steve.
16 Hey, I'm sorry, go ahead.

17 STEVE: I was going to say, one guy took it
18 upon himself to go out there and collect the -- he was
19 going to go collect some things that he thought
20 belonged to some of the guys that were here to see --
21 he totally took it upon himself, though. We knew
22 nothing about it.

23 JIM: Okay. Okay.

24 STEVE: We just, in fact, just jumped all
25 over the place on top of him.

JIM: All right, good. I, you know, thank

1 | you, Steve. I'm just concerned about, you know, we
2 | know in advance. I don't want any --

3 | STEVE: Exactly.

4 | JIM: You know.

5 | STEVE: I know the, you know, what you're all
6 | going through just to get the thing worked out so
7 | there's no problems and --

8 | JIM: Well, I appreciate it.

9 | STEVE: I really am sorry for that.

10 | JIM: Don't worry. Tell them it's for their
11 | own safety.

12 | STEVE: Exactly.

13 | JIM: Did you watch the press conference?

14 | STEVE: Yeah, only got to see about half of
15 | it because I was trying to, you know, I lost the
16 | connection with you there, and that --

17 | JIM: Well, it's still on. Go watch the rest
18 | and I'll talk to you.

19 | STEVE: Oh, okay. Well, we only get Channel
20 | 2 there. Okay, I'll call you back or you can call me,
21 | then, when it's over.

22 | JIM: Okay.

23 | STEVE: Okay, thanks, Jim. Okay, bye.

24 | * * * *

25 | STEVE: Hello?

 JIM: Steve?

1 STEVE: Yes.

2 JIM: This is Jim. Did you call me?

3 STEVE: Yeah, I did.

4 JIM: Oh, I'm sorry. I was on the --

5 STEVE: Yeah, we got it all straightened out
6 with that, and the two, the two guys that did go out,
7 though, all they had was gloves on their hands.

8 JIM: Okay. Well listen, it's not -- I
9 already straightened it out with the tactical
10 commanders.

11 STEVE: Okay.

12 JIM: And appreciate you calling me back.

13 STEVE: Right.

14 JIM: No sweat. I mean, that's the kind of
15 communication we want.

16 STEVE: Right.

17 JIM: If something's awry, let's both look
18 into it.

19 STEVE: Okay, sounds good.

20 JIM: And, and make sure it's not, you know,
21 so. That's all. That's all.

22 STEVE: Okay. They're ready to go out there
23 then and start dragging those bodies out.

24 JIM: The dogs?

25 STEVE: Yeah, the dogs.

JIM: Yeah, okay. Okay.

1 STEVE: Okay?

2 JIM: Yeah, I think it's okay, but are they
3 going to dig a hole? Tell me what they're going to do.

4 STEVE: Oh, they say that -- there's also a
5 goose that apparently is -- what is he, penned up or --

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Yeah, he's penned
7 up.

8 STEVE: He's penned up and they want to leave
9 the thing loose.

10 JIM: I don't care.

11 STEVE: Okay, that's all right also. Oh, how
12 far away is that, though, just so --

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: On the left-hand
14 side of the --

15 STEVE: Left-hand side of the building, so
16 they're be walking over by the left-hand side of the
17 building and right by the fence there, there's a goose
18 that's been stuck there for days now.

19 JIM: A goose?

20 STEVE: A goose, a white goose.

21 JIM: A goose. Yeah, okay, let him out.

22 STEVE: Okay.

23 JIM: Yeah. And, and are they going to bury
24 the dogs or just drag them out?

25 STEVE: They're going to -- what are you
going to do with those dogs, drag them out or what are

1 | you doing? (Unidentified voices in background not
2 | discernible.) I mean, but are you dragging them or
3 | what? Picking them up? Okay.

4 | JIM: Are they going to bury them or not?

5 | STEVE: You're going to bury them?

6 | (Unidentified voices in background not discernible.) I
7 | guess just, what --

8 | JIM: Just drag them out away from the house.

9 | STEVE: Yeah, I think you're right.

10 | JIM: That's fine, where they don't bother
11 | you.

12 | STEVE: Okay.

13 | JIM: Okay, Steve.

14 | STEVE: Okay, that's what they'll do.

15 | JIM: Okay. Hey --

16 | STEVE: Yeah.

17 | JIM: Talk to David now, he, he was --

18 | STEVE: All right.

19 | JIM: -- going to send some kids out and --

20 | STEVE: All right.

21 | JIM: If we could do it before dark, I'd sure
22 | like to do it.

23 | STEVE: Okay, I'll talk with him.

24 | JIM: Kids get scared at night.

25 | STEVE: Okay.

 JIM: Yeah.

1 STEVE: Is that --

2 JIM: Hey, let me talk --

3 STEVE: Is that conference over or --

4 JIM: Oh, I don't know, I just came to answer
5 the phone.

6 STEVE: Okay.

7 JIM: I'll let you go so you can do the dog
8 thing.

9 STEVE: Right, and I wanted to see if
10 anything else was on there myself.

11 JIM: Okay, and, and then talk to David about
12 the kids and have David call me.

13 STEVE: All right, I'll do that.

14 JIM: Have the kids get ready, you know.

15 STEVE: Okay, I'll have him call you.

16 JIM: Okay, bye.

17 STEVE: Okay, bye.

18 * * * *

19 GREG: Hello?

20 JIM: Hello?

21 GREG: Yeah.

22 JIM: David?

23 GREG: No, this is Greg.

24 JIM: Oh, Greg. This is Jim.

25 GREG: Hi, Jim, How are you doing?

JIM: Pretty good, did you --

1 GREG: Hold on, hold on a second, here's
2 Steve.

3 JIM: Okay.

4 STEVE: Hello?

5 JIM: Steve?

6 STEVE: Yeah, Jim.

7 JIM: Did you get those dogs?

8 STEVE: Yeah, they just, they pulled them
9 away and did you get that goose also or --
10 (Unidentified male voice in background not
11 discernible.)

12 JIM: The goose?

13 STEVE: Yeah, well, that's where, remember?
14 That's what I mentioned to you --

15 JIM: Yes, yes.

16 STEVE: We were going to let that thing
17 loose? Yeah.

18 JIM: Yeah. Well, good, I don't want him to,
19 I don't want him to die in there. Did he get him out?

20 STEVE: Yeah, they got him out, they let him
21 loose.

22 JIM: Well, he'll have plenty to eat in the
23 fields, I guess.

24 STEVE: And there's a whole lot of chickens
25 in a pen too. I hate to keep, but what do you think?
I don't know.

1 JIM: Where, where is it?

2 STEVE: Where's, where's the chickens at?

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Over on the north
4 side.

5 STEVE: It's over on the north side, toward
6 like where the Bradley is.

7 JIM: The north side -- let's --

8 STEVE: I don't know, can they be, you can't
9 really see, though, from where you're at anyway, from
10 where they're -- unless someone flew over, I'd imagine.
11 But it's a pen with a whole -- I don't know, how many
12 chickens are there in there? About 50 chickens in
13 there.

14 JIM: Okay, let me, let me wait on it. Let's
15 just wait on the chickens for a minute and --

16 STEVE: Yeah.

17 JIM: See if we can --

18 STEVE: Wait on the chickens, yeah. It does,
19 it does sound funny to me too, I must admit.

20 JIM: Well, we -- I'm glad, you know, we
21 don't want them to be hurt, you know, so.

22 STEVE: Yeah.

23 JIM: How about some kids coming out, did
24 David -- did you talk to David?

25 STEVE: I just started to when we were
bringing something in on the TV station, then the thing

1 | went out again. We're trying to -- we don't, see, we
2 | don't have capability, I thought we did on this TV, for
3 | UHF.

4 | JIM: Oh, um-hum.

5 | STEVE: So I don't know what's wrong with it.
6 | What is it? (Unidentified male voice in background not
7 | discernible.) See there, the good TV that we did have
8 | was all shot up when, when they arrived.

9 | JIM: Oh, I see.

10 | STEVE: So that's what we're trying to make
11 | do and, like what you were telling us what you were
12 | watching, we -- but that must be Channel 25, maybe?

13 | JIM: Yeah, that was 25, yeah.

14 | STEVE: Yeah, see, we can't, well, the only
15 | thing we get is Channel 2.

16 | JIM: Oh, okay. Did you get the --

17 | STEVE: So he wants to know, did you come up
18 | with any names of anybody you wanted to send out or --

19 | DAVID: No, not yet.

20 | STEVE: Not yet, he said.

21 | JIM: Okay. Oh, he already gave us the
22 | names.

23 | STEVE: Oh, he did, okay.

24 | JIM: Yeah. Dailand (phonetic sp.), Pages.

25 | STEVE: All right.

 JIM: Cyrus, Star, Bobby. I just -- let's

1 see, who else. Chanelle.

2 STEVE: Uh-huh.

3 JIM: Catherine.

4 STEVE: Okay.

5 DAVID: When are we going to get

6 (Indiscernible)

7 JIM: I just want -- which ones he wanted to
8 send.

9 STEVE: Just a minute. Huh?

10 DAVID: When are we going to get a line

11 (Indiscernible)

12 STEVE: He says, when are we going to get a
13 line out to answer some of the media questions?

14 JIM: As soon as you come out you can do all
15 that stuff.

16 STEVE: He says, as soon as we come out we
17 can do all that sort of thing.

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKERS: Oh, yeah.

19 (Indiscernible)

20 STEVE: Man, I don't know.

21 JIM: Well, you know, we, we did that with
22 the Christian Broadcast Network and we kept our word.
23 You know, if you come out, those people all want to
24 interview you and I'm sure it can be arranged, so.

25 STEVE: He's sure it can be, if we all come
out, that, like the Christian station, they interviewed

1 us. I mean, they've -- Jim, you're funny.

2 JIM: Oh, hey --

3 STEVE: You're very funny.

4 JIM: Do you want me to check with them?

5 STEVE: Huh?

6 JIM: Do you want me to check with them?

7 STEVE: No, well, yeah, you mean about giving
8 us a line back out to the media?

9 JIM: No, I mean about giving you an
10 interview after you come out.

11 STEVE: About giving us an interview after we
12 come out?

13 JIM: Right.

14 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Everyone's
15 calling.

16 JIM: Every I mean, we get a million calls,
17 everybody wants to interview you. You know, if David
18 said he's coming out, I'd say if you want to interview
19 him when it -- if you want to talk to them when you
20 come out, you know, everybody wants to talk to you.
21 Yeah. I mean, you told them you were coming out, and
22 they're sitting there waiting for you, you know. It's
23 a big chance to, to deal with them, you know.

24 STEVE: Okay.

25 JIM: Well, anyway.

UNKNOWN: He's waiting on his God right now.

1 STEVE: He said he's waiting on his God right
2 now.

3 JIM: Okay, I understand.

4 STEVE: How long are you going to be there
5 till, Jim?

6 JIM: Oh, I don't know. I guess Henry will
7 probably come after a while.

8 STEVE: But I, I'll probably give you a call
9 here in a little bit.

10 JIM: Okay.

11 STEVE: You're going to be there how late
12 though, do you think?

13 JIM: Oh, I don't know. Can, can you get
14 any of the kids ready?

15 STEVE: That's what he just got done saying,
16 waiting.

17 JIM: He wants to --

18 STEVE: He gave you the names. He's, he --
19 to tell you the truth --

20 JIM: Uh-hum.

21 STEVE: He's been contemplating all that's
22 been going on for the last five days with the movement
23 of the Bradleys, these guys coming out sneaking around,
24 you know, all that kind of thing. They're running over
25 the shacks, all that.

JIM: Um-hum.

1 STEVE: I mean, it's not consistent with your
2 rapport, your, you know, the way you are, the way
3 you've been communicating.

4 JIM: Well, I know, I got a lot of bosses and
5 commanders here.

6 STEVE: He keeps on saying, you know, looking
7 like -- you sound like a lamb, but you know, the
8 actions are like a dragon.

9 JIM: But I haven't lied to you and that's --

10 STEVE: But you know, right from the
11 beginning you and I agreed. When you and I talked
12 together right from the beginning Sunday.

13 JIM: Right.

14 STEVE: We had agreed that nothing would --
15 these three vehicles would be on the perimeter, on the
16 edge of the property but not on the property.

17 JIM: Steve, Steve, I made mistakes and you
18 have made mistakes.

19 STEVE: I know. No, no, that's okay, that's
20 okay, but just since --

21 JIM: You know, we --

22 STEVE: No, no, no, no, no. No, no, no! But
23 yours continue. Do you call it encroachment, do you
24 call it intimidation, do you -- whatever you call it,
25 you're doing it, though, that's the point.

 JIM: Yeah.

1 STEVE: That is the point.

2 JIM: Okay, I --

3 STEVE: If you want to do what you want to
4 do, well then we would say, go ahead and do it.
5 Ultimately, we'll say go ahead and do it.

6 JIM: I understand. But there's no, no shots
7 are fired, no effort to attack.

8 STEVE: That's not a -- beside the point.
9 Ultimately, that, you keep on -- it's just like a lion
10 or something like that, just slowly creeping up to a
11 victim or something. Same thing. We're not doing
12 anything, I'm just smiling at you, I'm just smelling
13 the air. I mean it, you know, the whole thing is
14 contrary to the way it all began with you and I and
15 with you and David.

16 JIM: Well --

17 STEVE: What would you think, though, I mean,
18 after --

19 JIM: Well, you know, you know what I think?

20 STEVE: What, what, after agreements,
21 conclusions, and all of a sudden here is this Bradley
22 out here running over -- what was that -- did you find
23 out why they did that? Was that under your commanders,
24 did he give the order? Is that kids out there fooling
25 around, getting an opportunity to play with these
machines or what? What is that?

1 JIM: I mean, I think both of us share this.

2 STEVE: No, no, what, what -- tell me about
3 it? Go, you --

4 JIM: I'm trying to tell you, but you won't
5 let me talk.

6 STEVE: I'm going to leave you talk. Tell me
7 what that incident was about, why they did that up at
8 the guard shack there.

9 JIM: Well, I think they were just trying to
10 get that building out of the way so nobody would be
11 hiding behind it.

12 STEVE: Why didn't you say something to us
13 ahead of time about it?

14 JIM: Well, I think it happened when I wasn't
15 here.

16 STEVE: Well, why didn't Henry? Is he not,
17 is he not in your caliber, or can't he be trusted?

18 JIM: Well -- oh, yeah, sure.

19 STEVE: Well, why did he not say something?

20 JIM: Well he, he should have. I'm sorry if
21 he didn't, I apologize.

22 STEVE: And why did -- then in the back they
23 did the same thing. And here they're on the prop--
24 what are they doing when, you know, you both -- by the
25 way, you said the same thing as yourself.

JIM: But Steve, but Steve, listen. I mean,

1 I could say the same thing. Three men walked out of
2 the house, you didn't tell me. I mean, I'm sitting --
3 you know, it's the same thing.

4 STEVE: Yeah, that's a pretty big thing
5 though, to go riding over property and all that. Come
6 on, let me run your house over and you tell me that.
7 Let's you and I switch this around and you sit in a
8 position like this.

9 JIM: I'd walk out with my hands up and
10 surrender and go to court, that's what I would do.

11 STEVE: I don't believe so.

12 JIM: I would.

13 STEVE: Not if you had the same information
14 and knowledge, you would not.

15 JIM: You know we're not going to do
16 anything, that's what I would do. That's what I would
17 do, honest to God, if that was me, I'd walk out.

18 STEVE: Well, you know, I really -- that's
19 what I really actually thought, I really did. But I
20 mean, it's contrary to what one sees and what you're
21 hear around here, especially at night time. These guys
22 think they're cute or something.

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 STEVE: Apparently they don't fear the same
25 God I do. It's obvious they don't. No wonder all the
prophets talked about the way they did in the final

1 | days, about a little group and all that. You know,
2 | it's hard for even me to buy. But just by the things,
3 | the events that have taken place, transpiring here, you
4 | see it happening.

5 | JIM: Um-hum. Well, the solution is simple.

6 | STEVE: Okay, what is it, what do you think
7 | it is?

8 | JIM: Yeah. You come out like you said and
9 | this'll be over. And then the, then the final --

10 | STEVE: What'll, what'll be over?

11 | JIM: What will be over?

12 | STEVE: It will be over for what, you? For
13 | your part of this communication?

14 | JIM: No, I'm talking about all your people
15 | in there that are not in safety.

16 | STEVE: We will do you -- we will do like we
17 | told you we will, but the only element there that has
18 | not changed, and he's waiting, is he was told to wait.
19 | So even for me, I would -- it would have been no
20 | problem to walk right on out there, but it's that very
21 | God that showed him the information that have convinced
22 | and convicted us that the Bible is true, it can't be
23 | gainsaid, the information there.

24 | JIM: I'm not, I'm not disputing that, Steve.

25 | STEVE: No, no, but that's the reason why
we're still here. Otherwise, we would walk out right

1 | now. There would be no problem.

2 | DAVID: We're not afraid (Indiscernible)

3 | JIM: Well, again --

4 | STEVE: And like he's, he's telling me right
5 | now, like, we're not afraid of you or your law. That's
6 | not the problem.

7 | DAVID: (Indiscernible) fear God and his
8 | laws.

9 | JIM: Yeah.

10 | STEVE: And I -- that's right, we fear God
11 | and his laws. You know, as you and I have discussed
12 | before.

13 | JIM: I don't, and I don't dispute that.

14 | STEVE: I can't stress, I can't stress it any
15 | stronger. That's why your trying to coerce and,
16 | through salesmanship and all the rest to send out one
17 | more, one more, whatever, we'll go as fast as possible.
18 | In fact, he's already done more than I would have
19 | thought he would have done, just because he's been
20 | waiting on that word. He was already told, wait.

21 | JIM: Um-hum.

22 | STEVE: So that's exactly what we've been
23 | doing.

24 | JIM: Yeah. Well, I have no dispute over
25 | that.

 STEVE: One of these days I'd sure like to

1 | hear your reaction to -- he, he definitely had a lot to
2 | say to you yesterday, I mean spiritually speaking.

3 | JIM: Um-hum.

4 | STEVE: And now and then I'd come by and
5 | listen. I'm really interested in what you really, your
6 | response to that is.

7 | JIM: Yeah? Well, I, I felt a little more --

8 | STEVE: Apparently I don't, I really don't
9 | think there was one, because I can tell by how you
10 | continue with me, you continue with him. I, I really
11 | doubt that -- you're probably, on the contrary, you're
12 | not convinced, but if anything, you -- I know, you've
13 | got a job to do. Let's get us out there, get us in
14 | jail, go through the court system, and then the rest
15 | will be over. You can go back to living your life and
16 | doing the same with others.

17 | JIM: Well, I think everyone will go back to
18 | living their lives. You will too. I mean, this is,
19 | this is something you've got to get over. You've got
20 | to deal with it. You can't run away from it. You've
21 | got to deal with it.

22 | STEVE: Yeah, like David just said, let's
23 | process the fish.

24 | JIM: What does that mean?

25 | STEVE: Well, you tell me.

 JIM: I don't know.

1 STEVE: Let's process the fish.

2 JIM: You said it. I don't know.

3 STEVE: He doesn't, he says what does that
4 mean.

5 DAVID: Tell him I'm praying hard for him.

6 STEVE: David says he's praying hard for you,
7 Jim.

8 JIM: Okay, well, I, I'm praying for him,
9 too.

10 STEVE: I'd sure like to see what you look
11 like, I mean just to see who I'm talking to here.

12 JIM: Well, you'll see me when you come out.

13 STEVE: He says I'll see him when I come out.

14 (Laughs.) Jim, I tell you. You're something else.

15 JIM: Steve, we're going to work it out.

16 STEVE: I know we are. I really, I -- but I
17 want the best -- I'm not concerned for myself, Jim, I'm
18 concerned for you, I really am. That's why --

19 JIM: Aren't you concerned for those children
20 and those women in there?

21 STEVE: No, I really am -- I'm not concerned
22 for anybody within, in honesty, not in the least.

23 JIM: Well, I am. I'm concerned for every,
24 every one of them.

25 STEVE: They believe in a living God. You
know, the Bible separates the beliefs of the world from

1 | those that believe in the living God, as it says in
2 | Revelations 7. I mean, you would think that every,
3 | every god that everyone worships is a living God, but
4 | not so. The Bible shows clearly, not too many know
5 | that living God. But anyway --

6 | JIM: Steve --

7 | STEVE: Should I give you, should we give you
8 | a call back, or what do you want to do?

9 | JIM: I'll tell you what I'd like.

10 | STEVE: Okay.

11 | JIM: And you discuss it with David, okay?

12 | STEVE: Okay.

13 | JIM: What I'd like is for you to send a
14 | couple of children out before it gets --

15 | STEVE: I don't -- it's not possible. He
16 | just, I just asked him, he said no.

17 | JIM: Okay.

18 | DAVID: (Indiscernible)

19 | JIM: Well, he told me earlier it was, and
20 | that's the only reason.

21 | STEVE: To send a few children out.

22 | DAVID: No, I'm not going to send the kids
23 | out right now.

24 | STEVE: He says I'm not going to send them
25 | out right now, that's what he said.

 JIM: Okay. All right.

1 STEVE: I just, I mentioned it loudly enough
2 so he could hear.

3 JIM: Okay, that's fine. And maybe he'll
4 tell us later.

5 DAVID: Tell him I want to see, I want to see
6 these tanks and stuff out of my --

7 STEVE: He wants to see these tanks out of
8 his back yard, he wants to --

9 DAVID: These guys out of (Indiscernible)

10 STEVE: And these guys out of his yard and
11 out of the vehicles and things like that.

12 JIM: Yeah, I know.

13 STEVE: He wants to see what you guys will do
14 now.

15 DAVID: The original promise --

16 STEVE: The original promise.

17 JIM: Yeah.

18 STEVE: Actually, he told us, he said even
19 with that tape and with all that that was being sent
20 out, he wanted to see there right all the way up to,
21 how you were, and even after.

22 JIM: Um-hum.

23 STEVE: I mean, of course, you know --

24 JIM: But Steve.

25 STEVE: Yes.

 JIM: He broke his promise. He said --

1 STEVE: No, you did, from before it even
2 started with us. Before it started with us, you told
3 me that you would have those on the perimeter.

4 JIM: But, but --

5 STEVE: But contrary to that, you had, you've
6 had infantrymen, you've had personnel on the property,
7 you've done things that were totally -- I mean, never
8 talked to me about it.

9 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

10 JIM: But Steve, let me talk just a second.

11 STEVE: She's a cheap reconnaissance is
12 right.

13 JIM: Let me talk just a second.

14 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

15 JIM: I'm not disputing it, that truck/tank
16 thing.

17 STEVE: Well, okay, no, here's what David's
18 saying, though. Jim, let's just do it this way. We're
19 going to take --

20 JIM: Well, let, let --

21 STEVE: We're going to --

22 JIM: Well, let me talk to him.

23 STEVE: Wait, wait, wait, wait. We're going
24 to take a little break now.

25 JIM: Um-hum. Okay.

 STEVE: And what we wanted to see is what you

1 do with these guys that are on the property.

2 JIM: Um-hum.

3 STEVE: The three vehicles, the two Bradleys
4 behind the old garage building and the one in front.

5 JIM: And then what --

6 STEVE: The guys running around on the
7 property and all that.

8 JIM: But then what will you do? What will
9 you do it if I do something?

10 STEVE: Well, let's see. You try us,
11 because, you know, right now -- well, let's see.

12 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

13 JIM: Well, Steve, you told me you're not --

14 STEVE: Let's see how -- okay, here's what
15 David just said. Let's see how much you and those
16 people love these children. That's what he said.

17 JIM: Okay, now, can you listen to me for
18 just a second.

19 STEVE: I will.

20 JIM: Okay. You said you were going to come
21 out; you didn't. David said he was going to come out;
22 he didn't. Isn't that what happened?

23 STEVE: How long do you want to sit on the
24 phone, because what I just said is what it is.

25 JIM: Okay.

STEVE: Because you said what you said also.

1 That's what I'm telling you. You before me. Is that
2 not true, Jim? The first night, the first day you and
3 I began communication --

4 JIM: Um-hum.

5 STEVE: -- you stated some things to me. And
6 so finally I gave in and said okay. I didn't like the
7 idea of even these things sitting even on the very
8 perimeter.

9 JIM: Right.

10 STEVE: But finally I said okay, he said okay
11 also.

12 JIM: Okay, Steve --

13 STEVE: But it's never been that. So --

14 JIM: But give me just a second, now.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 JIM: I listened to you. The, the problem I
17 had, do you remember the day the commanders jumped all
18 over me?

19 STEVE: I do.

20 JIM: And that was the day that we played the
21 tape on the Christian Broadcast --

22 STEVE: I don't even know if that's true, of
23 course, but I'm going to take your word.

24 JIM: Well, you listened to them.

25 STEVE: I don't know why they would jump on
and you, and now you are as a negotiator in the first

1 | place.

2 | JIM: Wait -- all right, let me finish. We
3 | played the tape, as you requested, the Christian
4 | Broadcast Network for an hour. And on the tape, David
5 | said everyone was going to immediately come out.
6 | Nobody came out. The commanders were mad at me. It
7 | wasn't until after that, that there was any
8 | encroachment on your compound. It was all before --

9 | STEVE: No, no, that isn't true, Jim.

10 | JIM: Yes!

11 | STEVE: No, it's not!

12 | JIM: Yes, the only ones with --

13 | STEVE: You've got -- no, they actually had
14 | been moving around before then. That is the truth.

15 | JIM: They never came in.

16 | STEVE: I'll go get an, I'll get an
17 | eyewitness accounts by the people here. They watched
18 | them.

19 | JIM: Well.

20 | STEVE: Seriously.

21 | JIM: Well, I'm telling you, that was my
22 | recollection.

23 | STEVE: 'Cause I remember even raising the
24 | question to you even before the day that that was
25 | mentioned that we'd immediately come out. I even
mentioned to you, it seemed to be -- I thought you were

1 going to do something about it, nothing was. Nothing
2 was done about it.

3 JIM: Well, when did they, when did they --

4 STEVE: So it's just been left.

5 JIM: When did they crush that building?
6 Wasn't that last night?

7 STEVE: That was last night, that they
8 started going that far. They've been doing, diddling
9 around -- Pardon?

10 DAVID: -- the radio said, just like, you
11 know, when David comes out, shoot him in the head.

12 STEVE: The radio, like the radio said. When
13 David comes out, shoot him in the head.

14 JIM: What radio?

15 STEVE: One of the stations said that.

16 JIM: Oh. Well, that's crazy. That's not
17 going to happen. You know, it was a tough, a tough
18 sell for us to convince that Christian Broadcast
19 Network.

20 STEVE: You said it's not gonna -- I mean,
21 that's what has been said, though, on the radio, on the
22 waves.

23 JIM: It's not going to happen.

24 DAVID: (Indiscernible) that too, you know.

25 JIM: It's not going to happen, unless he
comes out --

1 STEVE: So how -- that's what I'm talking
2 about. One's got to consider all these things. One's
3 got to consider the, the history and the record of ATF
4 in the past, how they've dealt with others.

5 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

6 STEVE: Yeah, just a minute.

7 JIM: Um-hum. Well, it's not, it's not going
8 to happen.

9 STEVE: Wait, wait, just -- wait. I want to
10 pass something on to you, he's talking to me.

11 JIM: Okay.

12 DAVID: -- about the, the machine gun fire
13 from the helicopters, how it shot my room all up, more
14 than any other room in the (Indiscernible)

15 JIM: Hey, put him on the phone, Steve.

16 STEVE: Okay. Do you want to talk to him?
17 He wants to talk to you. No, he says no.

18 JIM: Okay.

19 STEVE: Okay, he says tell Jim --

20 JIM: Okay, well --

21 STEVE: -- how when the choppers came in, how
22 they shot up his bedroom --

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 STEVE: -- more than anyplace on the
25 perimeter.

 JIM: They didn't have any guns on them.

1 STEVE: They had. They guy saw him come and
2 they just started shooting up. You ought to see the
3 size of the holes in that, in that wall of the
4 building.

5 JIM: Uh-huh.

6 STEVE: Yes, they did, Jim.

7 JIM: Yeah.

8 STEVE: You ought to seen how many witnesses
9 watched that.

10 JIM: Okay.

11 STEVE: That, that didn't come out in the
12 press or in the news, did it, Jim. I don't see how it
13 ever will --

14 JIM: Hey, hey, Steve?

15 STEVE: -- unless God does something about,
16 do you? ((Unidentified male voice in background not
17 discernible.))

18 JIM: I think, I think those were outgoing
19 rounds through the wall.

20 STEVE: No, they were not outgoing rounds,
21 no, no. ((Unidentified male voice in background not
22 discernible.))

23 JIM: It's clearly shown on the TV tape.

24 STEVE: They are not, yes.

25 DAVID: Why do you think they were going
towards my room?

1 STEVE: Yeah, why do you think they were
2 going towards his room in the first place?

3 JIM: Yeah, but I think, and on some of those

4 --

5 STEVE: All right, yeah?

6 JIM: On some of those TV tapes, you're going
7 to see those rounds coming out.

8 STEVE: I'd like to see those TV tapes. I
9 never got to see them.

10 JIM: Well, come on out, you can see them.

11 STEVE: No, send us, send me a tape here.

12 We've got a VCR.

13 JIM: Send me some kids out.

14 STEVE: He wants, he says send me some kids
15 out.

16 JIM: And I'll send you a tape.

17 DAVID: We don't play that now.

18 STEVE: We don't play that now is right.

19 JIM: We'll send -- I'll send you all the
20 news coverage.

21 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

22 STEVE: We're, we're going to go back to the
23 first thing about you doing the first thing that you
24 said you were going to do.

25 DAVID: (Indiscernible)

 JIM: Well, you back away, Steve. We could

1 | have -- you want, you want it, but when we ask you for
2 | something, you back away. You don't want to follow
3 | through.

4 | STEVE: No, no, no. This was the first thing
5 | you and I agreed on. We want to go back to square one.
6 | We want to go back to square one. Let's resolve and
7 | take care of the very things that were stated then.

8 | JIM: Um-hum. Um-hum. Well, I think we need
9 | to, you know, set the record straight, and that is that
10 | there was no guns on the helicopters, and whether or
11 | not you want to believe ATF, there was National Guard
12 | officers on those helicopters.

13 | STEVE: He says there was no guns on those
14 | helicopters.

15 | DAVID: That's a lie! That is a lie. He's a
16 | damn liar.

17 | STEVE: Did you hear that?

18 | JIM: I, I know what he said, but it's, it's
19 | not true.

20 | STEVE: He says he wants to talk to you now.

21 | JIM: All right.

22 | DAVID: Now, Jim, you're a damn liar now.
23 | Let's get real.

24 | JIM: David --

25 | DAVID: You're -- No, you listen to me.
You're sitting there and telling me that there were no

1 | guns on that helicopter?

2 | JIM: I said they didn't shoot. There's no
3 | guns shot --

4 | DAVID: You are a damn liar!

5 | JIM: Well, you're wrong, David.

6 | DAVID: You are a liar.

7 | JIM: Okay. Well, just calm down.

8 | DAVID: And -- no, let me tell you something.
9 | When I am ready to cry unto my God, you are going to
10 | stand before a furious God who's gonna judge you from
11 | the time you were conceived. You don't fear God, and I
12 | understand that. And I've come to this world just like
13 | you, and I know the reasons why you don't.

14 | JIM: Um-hum.

15 | DAVID: But there comes a point where there
16 | has to be a bridge made between carnality and divine
17 | inspiration. There is a truth of a God, whether it's
18 | true or fictitious. Whether it's a Peter Pan story or
19 | not. The storybook for infidelity says there's a God
20 | who sits on a throne.

21 | JIM: Um-hum.

22 | DAVID: Now, if it's just a story of
23 | infidelity, it's a political matter, because this
24 | country, this nation states that in a God it trusts.
25 | Now, I want to know which God we're trusting in. I
 | want to know why bureaucracy allows men and women of

1 | this world to exercise a religion or a mental kind of
2 | sedition that allows them to go and sit
3 | congregationally and hear words of hope and words of
4 | peace, when in this world there is none. Now, if the
5 | Bible's a lie, then the system that allows such an --
6 | speech is a lie. But if the Bible's true, and there
7 | are those who will believe its witness, then it must be
8 | a judgement involved. Okay, so you say the Bible's
9 | true, Jim. All right. So you know the Bible now. So
10 | you say Christ, you believe in Christ. So you know
11 | Christ. Okay, well, show me the seven seals. That is
12 | gonna judge you and this whole nation. You don't
13 | believe me, I understand. And you don't fear me. But
14 | I have just laid here and tolerated, step by step, your
15 | kindness, and I've been telling you about this policy.
16 | Lamblike, but speaking as a dragon. They project that
17 | I have lied to you. No. I did not lie to you. You
18 | will learn that I also have chief of command too. And
19 | that there is a God in Heaven. You will learn that the
20 | hard way.

21 | You could learn it if you would open your
22 | eyes and open your ears, and open your heart and
23 | consider. Now, your (Indiscernible) said no one's on
24 | the perimeter, I mean everyone's on -- no, whoa. They
25 | have been running around there all along and you know
 | it, Jim. If you don't, you need to ask your commanders

1 | in charge, and say hey, honestly, you know, you are
2 | giving me a bad bat to bat with. Because, you know,
3 | these lies are not making you look very good to anybody
4 | here. Now, didn't you say that the helicopters had
5 | guns but they didn't fire. Well, you are wrong. You
6 | are dead wrong. That may be what you want the media to
7 | believe, you know, but there's other people that saw,
8 | too. Now tell me, Jim, again. You're honestly going
9 | to say those helicopters didn't fire on any of us?

10 | JIM: David?

11 | DAVID: I'm here.

12 | JIM: Yeah, what I'm saying is -- now, I
13 | listened to you, now you listen to me, okay?

14 | DAVID: I'm listening.

15 | JIM: Okay, what I'm saying is, that those
16 | helicopters did not have mounted guns, okay? Now
17 | listen, let me explain, because you cut me off and you
18 | never get my idea, okay, what I'm trying to express to
19 | you. Steve gets a little hot at me and, and you're a
20 | little calmer and we can explain it to each other and
21 | then work out the facts, okay.

22 | DAVID: Well, I want to listen to you, go
23 | ahead.

24 | JIM: Okay. What I'm saying is, I'm not
25 | disputing the fact that there might have been fire from
the helicopters. If you say there was fire from the

1 | helicopters and you were there, that's okay with me.
2 | What I'm telling you is, there was no mounted guns, you
3 | know, outside mounted guns on those helicopters.

4 | DAVID: I agree with you on that.

5 | JIM: All right, then that's, that's the only
6 | thing I'm saying. Now, the agents on the helicopters
7 | had guns.

8 | DAVID: I agree with you on that.

9 | JIM: Okay? You understand what I'm saying?

10 | DAVID: I agree with you.

11 | JIM: Okay. Okay, so see? We're not even in
12 | dispute, and Steve is getting all worked up over it.

13 | DAVID: Well, no, what the dispute was over,
14 | I believe, Jim, is that you said that they didn't fire
15 | on us from the helicopters.

16 | DAVID: Well, what I mean is, a mounted gun.
17 | A mounted -- you know, like a mounted machine gun.

18 | DAVID: Yeah, but beside the point, what they
19 | did have was machine guns.

20 | JIM: Okay, I don't, I don't know what they
21 | had. They were armed. The people inside had pistols
22 | or rifles.

23 | DAVID: We agree, then.

24 | JIM: Okay. All right, that's good. That's
25 | good, we agree, okay? Let's just leave it at that.

Okay?

1 DAVID: All right.

2 JIM: How you doing otherwise?

3 DAVID: Like I said. We're, we're sitting
4 here, we're waiting, we're praying for you all.

5 JIM: Yeah, okay.

6 DAVID: And we're trying to, hopefully, that
7 as this nation, as the, as what I stated is being heard
8 and people are asking, you know, for copies of that
9 tape, 'cause some people, you know, want to, they want
10 to hear what it said. Others are --

11 JIM: Did you get our phone? Did you get our
12 phone?

13 DAVID: Yeah, we got it.

14 JIM: Okay. Does it work okay?

15 DAVID: Oh, it works fine.

16 JIM: Are you on it? Are you using it?

17 DAVID: Yeah, we're using it.

18 JIM: Oh, okay. Good.

19 DAVID: And others are scoffing.

20 JIM: What do you mean?

21 DAVID: Well, you know, people are scoffing.
22 You know, Psalms 1. You remember Psalms 1.

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 DAVID: I mean, the situation that's at hand
25 is a situation to where, you know, it appears as a
maniac and there's an arms charge and this, that.

1 JIM: Unless --

2 DAVID: There's a lot of, a lot of different
3 lines and details to it and, you know. Any time
4 anybody judges a picture before he sees the whole thing
5 is kind of a fool, isn't he?

6 JIM: Well, I think -- you know, there's a
7 lot of people like that, skeptics, but you can't, I
8 mean, you've got to deal with one person at a time, you
9 know. It's hard to deal with the masses sometimes.

10 DAVID: Right. Okay.

11 JIM: You know how inaccurate the media's
12 been, so.

13 DAVID: Right.

14 JIM: I saw them on there today and talked
15 about, they talked about more negotiators than's
16 anywhere around here. You know, I mean.

17 DAVID: They said what now?

18 JIM: They said there's three teams of
19 negotiators talking to David, you know. That's not
20 true.

21 DAVID: No, well, no, that's not true, 'cause
22 I wanted, I wanted one negotiator, and you, I talked
23 with you because first of all, you have your, your
24 proficiency down.

25 JIM: Yeah.

DAVID: You know, you have an intelligence

1 | behind your ability to talk.

2 | JIM: Right.

3 | DAVID: You know, you don't just have a radio
4 | disk jockey's voice, you've also --

5 | JIM: Well, you're a, you're a bright guy
6 | yourself, and we've been able to communicate, and I
7 | think that's --

8 | DAVID: Well --

9 | JIM: That's real good, you know. So --

10 | DAVID: And then the, then the second guy
11 | that came, what was his name, Gary?

12 | JIM: Gar? Yeah.

13 | DAVID: Oh, boy. That guy needs to go back
14 | to school, Jim.

15 | JIM: Yeah, I know it.

16 | DAVID: Oh, talking about pushy, I mean, you
17 | know.

18 | JIM: I agree with you.

19 | DAVID: By right of, by right of trade, you
20 | know --

21 | JIM: I don't like him either, really.

22 | DAVID: We're the ones that are supposed to
23 | be hot-headed, you know.

24 | JIM: Yeah.

25 | DAVID: We're the ones supposed to be, you
know -- I want the \$5,000 and I want the airplane

1 (Indiscernible) or I'll not come -- you know, we're the
2 ones supposed to be like that, you know?

3 JIM: I think he needs a different line of
4 work.

5 DAVID: What do you mean?

6 JIM: Don't you?

7 DAVID: Who, Gary?

8 JIM: Yeah.

9 DAVID: Yeah, he's very --

10 JIM: Abrupt, I would say.

11 DAVID: Real tough guy, you know, and being a
12 tough guy just makes the crazy guys tougher.

13 JIM: Well you don't, we don't need no John
14 Waynes, you know?

15 DAVID: Yeah.

16 JIM: We just need --

17 DAVID: Well anyway, I told Gary, I said,
18 look Gary, I said I made a deal with somebody, you got
19 to respect it. Oh, no, he wouldn't listen.

20 JIM: Um-hum.

21 DAVID: Now, the reason why we've talked to
22 Henry is because Henry, like yourself --

23 JIM: Right.

24 DAVID: -- you know, knows how to, he knows
25 how to be a waitress.

JIM: Right.

1 DAVID: And that's what you people are,
2 you're professional waitresses, and you know
3 professional waitresses --

4 JIM: (Laughs.) That's a good analogy.

5 DAVID: -- that are really good get tipped
6 good.

7 JIM: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: And we have really been happy with
9 you, you first, and secondarily Henry. So, you know,
10 we commend you all.

11 JIM: Well, I appreciate your say -- I
12 appreciate your saying that, and frankly, I appreciate
13 the way you've been, and I really do, and --

14 DAVID: Check on, check on the baby. What's
15 she crying about?

16 JIM: Everything okay?

17 DAVID: 'Cause some-- could be -- could
18 someone go check on her, please? I don't want to hear
19 them cry, kind of rips my heart.

20 JIM: Is that Bobby?

21 DAVID: No, I think it's, it's one of the
22 other ones. Let me look at my list here, so I can see
23 which names I gave you; otherwise, I might let another
24 name slip.

25 JIM: Okay.

 DAVID: Okay.

1 DAVID: Okay?

2 JIM: How about ages, David?

3 DAVID: Huh?

4 JIM: Ages.

5 DAVID: No, that's Dayland and Pages.

6 JIM: Oh, Damon --

7 DAVID: Dayland, D-A-Y-L-A-N-D.

8 JIM: D-A-Y-L-A-N-D. Pages.

9 DAVID: And Pages, right.

10 JIM: And Cyrus.

11 DAVID: Yeah, Dayland, Pages, Star, Cyrus,

12 and Bobby.

13 JIM: Star --

14 DAVID: And I'll give you some more names

15 later.

16 JIM: Okay. How about giving me their ages?

17 DAVID: Okay. Dayland's three.

18 JIM: Okay.

19 DAVID: Pages is eight, what, eight months?

20 Nine? She's a year old now, okay.

21 JIM: Okay.

22 DAVID: She's a year old. Star is three.

23 JIM: Um-hum.

24 DAVID: Five, oh, boy, time has passed.

25 JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Star is five. Cyrus is seven.

1 JIM: Okay.

2 DAVID: Cyrus is seven, and Bobby's what,
3 eight months?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKERS: A year.

5 DAVID: A year!

6 JIM: Year?

7 DAVID: Uh-huh. You know how, you know how
8 --

9 JIM: Okay, so Cyrus is the oldest then.

10 DAVID: Yeah.

11 JIM: Yeah, okay. Well, you want to send --

12 DAVID: And then there's, then there's
13 Chanel.

14 JIM: Spell it.

15 DAVID: C-H-A-N-E-L.

16 JIM: Okay.

17 DAVID: And she's what, one?

18 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE VOICE: One --

19 JIM: Okay.

20 DAVID: Okay, and there's Startle (phonetic
21 sp.), how old is, she's one.

22 UNIDENTIFIED MALE VOICE: Yeah, yeah.

23 UNIDENTIFIED FEMALE VOICE: She's older.

24 JIM: Okay.

25 DAVID: Okay.

JIM: Um-hum.

1 DAVID: Minah is one. She's just now two
2 now, right? Okay, she's two.

3 JIM: Um-hum.

4 DAVID: And I'll, I'll give you some more
5 names later.

6 JIM: Okay. Are any of them ready to go, or
7 can you get some ready to go?

8 DAVID: No, I'm not gonna send them out yet.

9 JIM: Okay.

10 DAVID: We're going to get some things
11 straightened out first.

12 JIM: Okay. Well, get that telephone.

13 DAVID: Yeah, we can, we need a decent phone
14 and a lot of the stuff's going click, click, click.

15 JIM: Oh, well, half of that's me.

16 DAVID: And the media, you know, the media is
17 out there and they're getting pretty teed off,
18 especially a lot of these different other stations
19 besides KRLD, where you've got these very -- oh, I
20 don't know.

21 JIM: I agree with you on that.

22 DAVID: They're, they're, they're kind of,
23 they're kind of idiots. They said they'd listen to the
24 tape.

25 JIM: Um-hum.

 DAVID: And, you know, they said that they

1 don't understand what's being said. But of course,
2 the, the smartest men --

3 JIM: You told me that.

4 DAVID: The smartest men of the world two
5 thousand years ago supposedly professedly so, couldn't
6 see the significance of truth though it stood in front
7 of their face.

8 JIM: Well, you told me they wouldn't
9 understand it. You knew that.

10 DAVID: Oh, well, the thing of it is is that
11 why won't they? I mean, is Psalms 45 of the first
12 seal? Is it the first thing God wants you to know
13 about Christ that you don't know.

14 JIM: Um-hum.

15 DAVID: Is it?

16 JIM: You told me it was.

17 DAVID: Well no, did you see it? Is the pr--
18 is the Psalms 45 the prophecy --

19 JIM: Um-hum.

20 DAVID: -- of which the revelation of Jesus
21 Christ reveals?

22 JIM: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: A prophecy about Christ destroying
24 his enemies and getting married.

25 JIM: Right.

DAVID: Yeah. And when he comes he's gonna

1 teach it before he does it, right?

2 JIM: Um-hum.

3 DAVID: So that men might know how to fear
4 God. So Psalms 1 goes along with that seal by saying,
5 you're blessed if you don't sit in the seat of
6 scornful, stand in the way of sinners, or stay with the
7 ungodly, but your delight is in this law of the Lord.

8 JIM: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: Otherwise you won't stand in the
10 judgement, because in the judgement, Psalms 2 says the
11 heathen will rage when they begin to see these things
12 and they'll imagine things, go against the Lord, His
13 anointed, and they'll say, let's break these bands
14 asunder, let, let's, let's, let's, you know, get rid of
15 these seals.

16 JIM: Hey, David?

17 DAVID: Yeah.

18 JIM: I want to -- they've got a 3:30 press
19 conference, okay?

20 DAVID: Okay.

21 JIM: I want you to watch it. Now, Rachel
22 told me today --

23 DAVID: Yeah.

24 JIM: -- and you told me this morning --

25 DAVID: Uh-huh.

JIM: -- that the agent on there had said

1 that you were in a shootout with the sheriff's office.

2 DAVID: Oh, yeah, that was --

3 JIM: And that -- of course, I know it's not
4 true.

5 DAVID: Yeah.

6 JIM: And I went in there and, and told them
7 that. I said, you know, you, you said this, and this
8 wasn't the case, and David and his people were involved
9 in a, a shootout, but there was this guy, crazy Roden
10 guy, right?

11 DAVID: Well, see, no. The thing of it was,
12 the sheriff knows --

13 JIM: But it was no, you weren't shooting at
14 the sheriff, is what I'm saying.

15 DAVID: No.

16 JIM: Right.

17 DAVID: The guys were strictly shooting at
18 the ground.

19 JIM: Yeah, and Roden.

20 DAVID: You know, there's no bullet holes in
21 any vehicles, there's no bullet holes in any houses at
22 that time.

23 JIM: Right.

24 DAVID: You know.

25 JIM: And, yeah, and the sheriff, you weren't
shooting at the sheriff.

1 DAVID: No way.

2 JIM: And I told them, I told them that, and,
3 and hopefully, you know, they, they apologized to me,
4 but I don't know -- I want them to clear it up and I've
5 asked them to, but watch that at 3:30 and see if they
6 do. I hope they will.

7 DAVID: Okay.

8 JIM: Okay? And --

9 DAVID: Now, we only get Channel 2 now.

10 JIM: Channel 2? It'll probably be on all of
11 them.

12 DAVID: Okay.

13 JIM: Just watch it at 3:30. And I'm gonna
14 go back again and double-check and see if I can ensure
15 that they get that right. I was real angry about it,
16 and I'm just trying to make sure it's done, okay.

17 DAVID: Okay, here, here, here's what we're,
18 here's what we'll do. We'll -- you're --

8 DAVID: Okay.

9 JIM: And then, but only two men on the dogs.

10 DAVID: All right, no problem.

13 JIM: All right. And then think about what
14 children you want to send down.

15 DAVID: Okay, we're thinking.

16 JIM: Okay. You know, anything, any time
17 before dark is always safer, so just think about that,
18 okay?

19 DAVID: All right.

20 JIM: But watch that press conference at 3:30
21 and I'll talk to you after that.

22 DAVID: Okay.

23 JIM: And just do me one, one favor.

24 DAVID: Yeah, Jim.

25 JIM: David, I love Steve, but I like to deal
with you.

1 JIM: Let's see, I had Chan--

2 DAVID: You got Dailand --

3 JIM: (Indiscernible)

4 DAVID: -- Pages, Star, Cyrus, Bobby and
5 Chanelle.

6 JIM: Right, I got that. Okay. Are those,
7 any of those child -- oh, let's see Cyrus, Star, and
8 Bobby are your children.

9 DAVID: All these are mine.

10 JIM: Oh, they're all your children, okay.

11 DAVID: Yeah. These are my babies.

12 JIM: Yeah, we'll take good care of them --

13 DAVID: Oh --

14 JIM: -- just like they're my own.

15 DAVID: Well, there's something about those
16 babies and prophecies you all don't know.

17 JIM: Well, I --

18 DAVID: All through the Bible it talks about
19 Messiah, the prince?

20 DAVID: Um-hum.

21 DAVID: Having children?

22 JIM: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: Supposed to be greatest honor to the
24 world to be unitified (phonetic sp.) with the family of
25 the universes?

JIM: Um-hum.

1 DAVID: Of God?

2 JIM: Um-hum.

3 DAVID: Christ died two thousand years ago
4 that you all might receive the knowledge of the holy.

5 JIM: Yeah. Well, there's nothing more
6 beautiful than a child.

7 DAVID: But if you don't understand it, God
8 plainly states what'll happen to the children of the
9 world.

10 JIM: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: You know, that's the message of
12 Malachi, said that before the great and dreadful day of
13 the Lord --

14 JIM: Um-hum.

15 DAVID: -- God will send the spirit of
16 Elijah, messenger of the covenant.

17 JIM: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: And his purpose is to turn the hearts
19 of the fathers to the children and the heart of
20 children to the fathers, lest I come and smite the
21 earth under the curse.

22 JIM: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: But if you don't understand the
24 importance of God and his knowledge of marriage --
25 well, like, like I was saying, Jim. I mean, I know
you're pacifying me, but maybe, just maybe --

1 JIM: Tell you, I'm not.

2 DAVID: Maybe what, some of the things I say
3 might, you know, might enlighten a little question
4 within your own heart. You know, why does God tolerate
5 sin? That's the first question. Why didn't God, when
6 Adam and Eve sinned, why didn't God just wipe them out,
7 and we wouldn't have all this today, would we?

8 JIM: Um-hum. That's right.

9 DAVID: I mean, you know, such suffering and
10 sorrow. What kind of wisdom is applied in all of this?
11 Well, remember the statement. Many people overlook it,
12 but the whole story of creation basically starts like
13 this: Moses wrote the first records of creation.
14 Okay? And in the times of Egypt, when Egypt was the
15 most predominant empire of its day, the Egyptian
16 pharaohs believed that they were gods. You know, you
17 understand that, don't you?

18 JIM: Yeah.

19 DAVID: They were worshipped as gods, and
20 when they died, their whole families -- course you
21 know, all the early --

22 JIM: They built the pyramids, right?

23 DAVID: Oh, well no, actually, Joseph was the
24 one that gave the knowledge of the pyramids.

25 JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: You see, when you, when you read in

1 the scripture about the ark of the covenant, it talks
2 about the covenant having oracles --

3 JIM: Um-hum.

4 DAVID: -- and having chains between the
5 covenant and the oracles?

6 JIM: Um-hum.

7 DAVID: And you know, scholars, they're,
8 they've always had a hard time interpreting certain
9 words of the manuscript 'cause they don't understand
10 what the words are.

11 JIM: Um-hum.

12 DAVID: And that's why get a concordance and
13 it says possibly unknown root word, could be this,
14 that, this, that, and the other. They try to put a
15 word in there in the line of the verse. But really,
16 the way the sanctuary was built is that the ark of the
17 covenant was designed to where it had a -- well, you
18 know, science has already discovered this -- it had a
19 high electrical current through it.

20 JIM: Um-hum.

21 DAVID: Very, very high electrical current.
22 And the purity of its gold and the fashionability of
23 its structure permitted it to be used in a way to where
24 God could communicate with a high priest. Well, what
25 man fails to understand in regards to the records of,
of Deuteronomy, Leviticus, and you know, all these

1 | testimonies or say chronicles and kings in regards to
2 | this mysterious ark of the covenant, is that when men
3 | such as Moses and the prophets were commanded to build
4 | these things, they were also assisted by higher
5 | intelligences. You know, we're talking about, we're
6 | talking about beings from -- well, look, you've got a
7 | sun, don't you?

8 | JIM: Um-hum.

9 | DAVID: Did the sun come up this morning?
10 | Aren't you, aren't you on a ball, aren't you like,
11 | don't you have an atmosphere and everything, and don't
12 | you have certain laws of this nature and realm, to
13 | where you're on this planetary, basic ball and you're
14 | rotating it so much miles per hour, revolving around
15 | the sun, so many days per year. I mean, you are really
16 | on a path, you're traveling through space, aren't you.

17 | JIM: Um-hum.

18 | DAVID: And you keep coming back around to
19 | the same place. Okay. Well, I mean, this is really
20 | unique, to think that we're flying out here, hung in
21 | the abyss of distance.

22 | JIM: Um-hum.

23 | DAVID: You know? Now, the thing of it is,
24 | is that, as I say, it's not theoretical, it's
25 | scientific.

 JIM: Um-hum.

1 DAVID: That from the beginning of time, the
2 ancients, whether it be through poetic or whether it be
3 through scripture, have always -- and this is not just
4 a Judaism, this is, you know, from all your cultures,
5 from all around the world. They talk about visitors
6 from the stars who come here in some form or type of
7 vehicle, right?

8 JIM: All right. Well, what would that be, a
9 spaceship or something, hum? Sounds like.

10 DAVID: Well, remember, the spaceship concept
11 is something that's not really understood until man
12 finally reaches a point of evolution to where he finds
13 out that he can, by wisdom, by the sermon of nature and
14 the principles of construction to the laws of nature,
15 he can fly. He -- the atmosphere is dense enough to be
16 able to lift up the poundage that gravity holds down.
17 You know, when you learn about energy and direction of
18 energy, forces, the things of science, the natural
19 energies, how to harness them, how to utilize them,
20 then yes, man is, man has found the ability to, to
21 strengthen then natural into the supernatural. What I
22 mean is this: I mean that, to a primitive man or a man
23 that's been separated from God, say from Eden, and has
24 been left without the knowledge of the origin of
25 creation, right?

JIM: Right.

1 DAVID: Man would find himself in a base,
2 natural aftermath of nature or creation, such as the
3 animals of the field, the natural source of the, the
4 biological world, the geographical world, the nature of
5 the world, and the natural habitat of nature, such as a
6 man in Africa and a man in South America or a man in
7 Alaska. You know, man will adapt to his nature, won't
8 he.

9 JIM: Um-hum.

10 DAVID: And what nature presents to him will
11 make him natural man. The ability to eat, to survive,
12 to procreate, are all the natural instincts of man. So
13 that's why the Bible says that man, by nature, without
14 the instruction of God, is a beast. He's like the
15 beast of the field. Okay. But, whereas man becomes
16 inspired when his mind is able to all of a sudden
17 perceive a better way --
