JIM: Oh, I know, and of course you were 13 14 acquitted on that. 15 MR. KORESH: No, no, no, but, but how come he didn't drop dead? 16 17 JIM: Yeah. You mean Roden? 18 MR. KORESH: Yeah. 19 I don't know. I don't know. JIM: 20 MR. KORESH: Because nobody fired at him. 21 Yeah. JIM: 22 MR. KORESH: They were, they were, they were standing still in the position that -- of the night 23 before when we originally went into the church to find 24 25 the casket.

If he comes out he can see the doctor. 6 We can't send anyone in, you know. 7 RACHEL: Okay. 8 JIM: Because, you know, they wouldn't go. They'd be afraid, you know. 9 10 RACHEL: Right. Steve wants to talk to you. 11 Okay? 12 JIM: Okay. 13 STEVE: Hello, Jim. 14 Steve, how are you doing? 15 STEVE: Not too bad. Yeah. I was listening to that on the radio. I didn't see it actually on T.V. 16 about the, the press conference that was given and --17 18 JIM: Yeah. STEVE: -- it's always entertaining to see 19 what some of the ATF agents or the FBI agents are going 20 to say, how they say it, the implication of it, the 21 22 connotations used. JIM: It's not very accurate, I know. 23 24 Number one, you know, I don't -- like STEVE: yesterday, I mean, like we were talking, how they gave 25 the information out that guys here had a gun battle

with the Sheriff's Department in '87. I mean --2 JIM: Well, that's not right. 3 Well, you mean to tell me these agencies with all the evidences, all the different equipment at hand and everything else, they can't get 5 the facts together before they go on national, 6 international? 7 8 JIM: Well, they should. 9 I mean, yeah. Well, that sounds nice, you telling me that they should, but you're in a 10 position where you -- you know, I'm cut off. I can't 11 talk to anybody but yourself, so you can sympathize 12 with me and say nice things to me like this, but when 13 it keeps on coming out on the T.V. and like what was 14 said about David in this conference earlier today, 15 "Well, he's miraculously recovering," and then, of 16 course, all the laughter. If you got to see what you 17 guys did to him -- I did. I thought -- he thought I 18 thought he would have been dead within hours of that. 19 He was laying on the floor. We dragged him along. 20 He's never moved from that place. 21 22 JIM: Well, I know that. 23 STEVE: That's the truth. 24 I know that. JIM: 25 And when -- you showed concern STEVE: because you thought like yourself as there may be Gary

and Henry that he would die and I tell you the truth, we thought more than likely originally he would. 2 3 JIM: I'm glad he's better. 4 STEVE: Well, yeah, I am too, but, you know, it's the way it was stated even to the press like, you 5 know, it's a, it's a sarcasm to his -- you know, the 6 lamb and the seven seals. Only the lamb can open up 7 the seven seals. And then he's never claimed to be Jesus Christ. He never said he was. 9 10 I agree. He's never said that. JIM: 11 He did state that only the lamb can STEVE: open the seven seals and he offers to show people all 12 throughout the scriptures the seven seals. 13 JIM: Right. Steven, I know that and the 14 only thing that they --15 16 STEVE: That way -- see, that way, Jim, God says who this person is. You see what I'm saying? 17 18 JIM: I understand. STEVE: But, I mean, well, what -- do you 19 have any kind of -- probably no influence, but you 20 probably can at least communicate. Can't -- what about 21 22 these conferences? I promise that I will and let me tell 23 you that what we have communicated up there, Henry and 24 I, is that -- and I'm sorry and I apologize for that 25

comment on the T.V. that was made that way. If that

man made it, it shouldn't have been done that way, but, 2 but we have passed up, okay. I want you to know. 3 STEVE: Okay. 4 And that was that Sunday David was hurting. 5 Okay? 6 STEVE: Um-hum. 7 JIM: That was Sunday evening. You remember? 8 STEVE: Oh, yeah, for sure. 9 JIM: And --10 But it's these kind of sarcastic STEVE: comments, the way they're, you know, put out. 11 12 JIM: I think, I think that was very inappropriate for them to do that and I will pass that 13 up and I think it is inappropriate. 14 15 I mean, this is really -- I really -to tell you the truth, I'm really teed off. I hate to 16 see how this country of America has digressed and your 17 type of agencies are one of the biggest causes for it. 18 You -- some of you young guys like yourselves, you have 19 a job. You've become a professional in an area. At 20 the same time there is getting to be a Big Brother. 21 You're part of it. You do your job right and you may 22 have a family and so forth, but there's still a 23 vigilance of freedom that needs to be kept up. Read 24 the writings on the statements of people like Abraham 25 Lincoln or Jefferson or Madison, the great principles

laid down, so things that are happening now that -- which you are more a part of than anybody, would never take place. Like I can't talk to the 3 outside world. You've taken care of that, your kind of 4 5 people. 6 I understand. JIM: STEVE: The press are so far back that you 7 guys could come and blow us away and they wouldn't --8 and you could write -- give any kind of a story you 9 10 wanted. 11 JIM: We're not going to blow you away. STEVE: I don't care if you -- let me tell 12 you something, Jim. I really don't care if you did or 13 didn't. In the first place, the point being, there is 14 a God that you and I stand before whether you and I 15 believe it or not and on one day all of us give an 16 account. So taxed to death that you 5 never have a choice with the hard earned money you make 6 7 to choose to where it should be paid. 8 JIM: Yeah. 9 I mean, think of this whole thing. 10 JIM: I understand. 11 STEVE: But here you're a part of an agency, a part of the government, that has done some of the 12 most -- I saw that Gun Owners of America, that video. 13 14 JIM: Um-hum. 15 STEVE: I don't know if you ever got to view that one that talks about your agency, how you're law 16 breakers and what you did to those two policeman that 17 were good cops all their li-- all those 20 years out in 18 19 New Jersey. 20 JIM: Right. 21 I mean, that -- I mean, if that doesn't tee off an American that's into freedom, and 22 I'm for your freedom also, for your freedoms of choice. 23 24 JIM: Right.

me, what you did with the Weaver case, I mean, that

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already bothered me and here now I'm involved in something like this.

JIM: Yeah.

STEVE: Whatever happens to me I hope that you have yourself right with God, that you're not part of an organization or part of something that -- I mean, God condemns that kind of thing. You might think he condemns a lot of things we're doing and from what you've heard about us, but you've gotten to hear a lot of things out of the mouth of David here.

JIM: Yeah.

STEVE: And you go find your greatest theologian in the world. If there -- if there's some truth to that Bible -- I think you said your background was Catholic?

JIM: Well, when I was a little boy and then now I'm a Christian.

steve: Whatever that means. You know, I mean, I'm not a Christian. I've always wanted to be a Christian, but a Christian is something I have not seen in my whole lifetime. But, anyway, aside from that —but, you know, I'm again concerned about what's going on. All my years in this country of American I've always loved the Constitution and the statements of men like Abraham Lincoln and Jefferson, some of these men, but this country is no longer what it was then. Now

there's men that have -- very powerful men that, that
-- those guys that do get into office. I mean, when
you look at someone like Bush and Clinton, both
associated with the Trilateral Commission, who are you
voting for? Just like in '80 you had what's his name,
Anderson and Carter, Carter being the first member, the
first one to become President in '76, handpicked by
Rockefeller in '73. Every cabinet member belonged to

It talks about a man that comes in the final days that can open up and show information of the future pertaining to one's salvation, and they can't controvert it. That's what all these prophets talk about. Yet you've got all these theologians, ministers, priests that are totally unaware of it, totally unaware.

JIM: Yeah.

STEVE: Because I've met with them myself and

1 they're quiet. They don't know how to answer you.
2 They can't.

JIM: Well, you know, it's hard to get into a debate, Steve, with you for those ministers. I mean, you're a pretty bright guy and you know your -STEVE: No. I'm a person that has always

JIM: Right.

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loved truth.

STEVE: Whatever I am or not. You know, some said I can speak and this, that. I -- there's many that can speak ten times better than myself. But, besides that, I don't care about that. I'm a, I'm a being that has awareness, that experienced good things, bad things. We all want to experience the good. We want fulfillment. We want joy, happiness. We all do. There's something wrong with a being that does not want that. So I've always tried to understand what it is that could ensure that you could have it forever. Why do we have to die? Why is there the problems that there are with and between people? So I've always wanted to find a way out of all of this, so my whole life has been one of looking for the truth of my own awareness, my own being and direction and trying to help -- once obtaining as much as I can, always looking for more, trying to help others see the same thing if they have an honesty of heart.

1 JIM: Well --2 STEVE: But, you know, and --3 I know, Steve. You and -- in fact, Henry and I talked about this this morning before he 5 left and you and David have impressed both of us with your, your knowledge and --6 7 STEVE: Well, you know --8 JIM: And I --9 STEVE: But if the knowledge is only air, if it's only words in the air by a little cultic group 10 that's weird and, you know, you listen with one ear and 11 pass it off with the other, I mean so what. You know, 12 I don't want to -- I want to try to be honest with you. 13 I don't want to play any games with you. 14 15 JIM: Well, you have been honest. STEVE: You're right, I have been, but I'll 16 be -- you know, I don't know -- you know, I've seen so 17 many men like Gonzalez come in and listen and I -- to 18 tell you the truth, I was -- right from the beginning I 19 thought that he was just -- I didn't think he was 20 honest, but I hoped that there might be something in 21 22 him where he could be. 23 JIM: Well --

No, that's why I say, that's not, that's not a problem. 8 9 JIM: Yeah. 10 STEVE: But what was a problem -- if you've been listening to the news, I'm glad there's Americans 11 that have good minds, that are raising questions, basic 12 questions, of human freedom and realities with the 13 Constitution like why you guys did what you did, why 14 wasn't the sheriff who we've invited out here --15 they've come out on their own. They've never had harm 16 17 from us. 18 JIM: Yeah. STEVE: But why didn't they come and serve 19 him with a warrant and he said he would have -- but now 20 you -- there is no question. If you were on the 21 grounds or in an airplane watching, you will know for a 22 fact you guys start firing on us. 23 24 JIM: Well, that needs to come out. You need




JIM: Is that right?





DAVID: Whereas you have lied on your part,
in that you have not been honest in regards to keeping
your men off our property. I mean, you know, some -if, if you think some of your men are, are, are, you
know, not vulnerable to, to, to flying, flying lead,
you know --

JIM: Oh, I know that.

DAVID: -- then -- Well, that's, that's what's going on here. But like I say, you know, I also, I also realize that, you know -- I, I can't expect, you know, honesty a hundred percent from your side, because like I say, you're a negotiator, you know.

JIM: Well, David, you, you know --

DAVID: And you do not, you do not honor my God and you don't understand what's going on, and you don't understand what authority I'm under, you know, whereas I do understand what authority you're under.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: You know, you're allowed to philosophically, sociologically, analytically, politically say any and all things rationally, irrationally, to, you know, achieve what you and the system that backs you designs to achieve. Whereas, I have to --

1 JIM: I'm just trying to achieve your safety, is all I'm trying to achieve. 2 3 DAVID: -- tell you -- exactly. And I'm trying to ensure your safety. 4 5 JIM: Um-hum. 6 DAVID: You know. 7 JIM: Um-hum. 8 DAVID: But you just do not fear God. And 9 you do not give glory to Him. 10 JIM: David --11 DAVID: And you do not believe in the hour of His judgement. You, you fail to avail yourself of the 12 13 knowledge --14 JIM: What did you say? Wait, don't, don't do that, no. Wait a minute. I'm talking to David. 15 Hey, David? 16 17 DAVID: -- of the knowledge --18 JIM: Listen, let me, let me run this 19 by you. 20 DAVID: -- of his seals, you see? 21 JIM: Okay, go ahead. DAVID: So, so, so by, by, by denying 22 yourself an opportunity to hear any and all ones that 23 God has chosen to teach you God's word, I mean his 24 seal, by, by procrastinating and being a part of a 25 political system that says, "In God We Trust," --

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- and yet denying the God who has seven seals of which when there's time no longer, you are actually fostering politically a religious reality that is a lie unto God. A nation that, that, that shadows and covers religious observation which, in itself, denies the very reason for the new covenant: the revelation of the seven seals.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: So that's why the Bible calls this kind of system a whore or a harlot. I mean, she, she professes affection and association to Christ, but the thing of it is, is that she claims to be one with Christ, but yet she doesn't even really totally know the man.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: And that's where the seals become a means of judgement for the last phase. And so go ahead, what were you gonna say, Jim?

JIM: Well David, thanks. Listen, just give me a minute, because my, my commanders are wanting me to tell you this, and what they're saying is, these are the rules for your safety, okay, and I want you to know them. They're just telling me no one will be allowed to exit the building, okay, with a weapon. And that's important. Now, I told --

1 DAVID: Oh, we, we, we knew that. 2 JIM: I, I told him, I told him you already know that. I told him you already know that. But they 3 wanted me to ensure that I told you. I said, I've already told David that. Just telling you that for 5 your own protection. They said if any of the agents 6 out there, you know, perceive that their lives or the 8 life of someone else is at risk, that they'll take appropriate action to ensure their own safety. 9 10 DAVID: Okay, so in other words --11 JIM: And I said David knows that, you know -- wait, let, you just give me a minute, and then, and 12 then we'll discuss it. 13 14 DAVID: All right. 15 JIM: And they said that no one will be allowed to aim a weapon from a window, as this may be 16 also perceived by our agents as a threat to their lives 17 18 or safety. 19 JIM: Well, yet they're allowed to aim them 20 at us, right? 21 Well, okay, let me get through -- and JIM: compel them to act accordingly, that's what they say. 22 23 DAVID: Okay. 24 JIM: That any time you exit the building and are approaching our agent, you must fully comply with 25 any verbal instructions to avoid exposing yourself to

Now, I told them you already knew that, but they said, well, we want to make sure that, 6 7 you know, everybody does it. 8 DAVID: So they're that close to do that, 9 huh? 10 JIM: Well, you know, in those, in those vehicles out there, you know. 11 12 DAVID: Yeah. 13 JIM: Listen now, let -- I got to --14 DAVID: So see, so see, all last night, you know, we're telling Henry this and Henry's denying it 15 16 up and down. 17 JIM: Yeah. DAVID: You know, and the thing of it is, you 18 19 know, on one hand, you all are saying we have 20 explosives here --21 JIM: Yeah. You want to have an all-out, right? (Unidentified male 2 voice in background not discernible.) 3 JIM: No, no, no. We're just dropping off a 4 phone. 5 DAVID: No, you, no you're not. What you're doing is, is you're breaking a principle. First of 6 all, we established, when I started releasing some of 7 these children, that you would not be on the property. 8 You lied. You have always been lying. They've been 9 creeping up closer and closer. Now, you, you say 10 you've got all this sophisticated tactical weapons, you 11 know, okay, fine. And you believe that we have 12 somewhat also, to a smaller degree, some also tactical 13 14 weapons. 15 JIM: Um-hum. 16 DAVID: Okay. So, you know, there's on the telephone individuals saying, well, let's go, let's go, 17 let's hit it in the ring, let's go head to head, you 18 know. Okay. So what you're doing is, you're 19 consistently stepping an inch by inch into our 20 perimeter and trying to gain more territory on you, at 21 the same time acting as if you're, you're, you're still 22 abiding by the rules. It's like a Indian contract. 23 24 JIM: But no, no one's taken any shots, 25 aggressive action --

DAVID: No, we haven't, we --

1 JIM: And we haven't either. 2 DAVID: We maybe should have. 3 JIM: Well, we haven't either. 4 DAVID: We maybe should have. 5 JIM: Look, what's at the --6 DAVID: Because you have lied, Jim. 7 JIM: David --8 DAVID: Your organization in this United States of America is a liar. Oh, yeah, you're acting 9 lamb-like. You're saying peace, but you are lying. 10 But no, no, you won't let me have access to the outside 11 world and tell what we have been observing. 12 13 JIM: When you come out you will 14 DAVID: No, no, no. Here's the thing. What you have been doing is, you have been proving to my God 15 16 17 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: -- and to the people that have heard 18 me speak plainly for seven years, that you are one who 19 20 speaks as a dragon. You're saying peace with your 21 mouth. 22 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: But your words are words of a dragon, 23 24 you know. 25 JIM: Hey --DAVID: So now here you're saying, well,

Dave, let's just bring the Bradley right in there next 2 to the bus, you know, and you know, let's just drop the 3 phone off, and so again, here we go. We see another delineation of the original purpose of our negotiation and now -- what, what do you want do to next? Next 5 thing, you want to bring the cord and maybe drive the 6 7 tank right inside the building here and hand it to us? 8 JIM: Okay, hey, hey, David. It wasn't that big an issue with us. I was just trying to save you 9 from carrying all the wire. We'll drop it out on the 10 driveway. 11 12 DAVID: It's only 150 feet. JIM: Okay. Well, I haven't seen this thing. 13 I'll have them drop it right by the guard shack, okay? 14 15 DAVID: Well, that, that definitely shows 16 more realism on your part of sincerity. 17 JIM: Okay. I mean, it wasn't that big an I was trying to save the guy from, I was trying 18 issue. to save your man from feeling like he had to be exposed 19 20 for 150 yards and carry it back, you know. DAVID: Well, the thing of it is, you, you're 21 not going to fire upon him, you said you weren't. 22 JIM: Obviously, but I know he's, they're 23 somewhat apprehensive. It's not that big an issue with 24 me, I'll do it your way. 25

DAVID: Well --

JIM: Just put it there, and then, and then 1 2 do the dogs, no more than two guys, go ahead and do it, 3 okay? 4 Okay, we'll go ahead and tell Steve DAVID: 5 that so he knows you're not -- 'cause I'm still batting 6 for you guys, too. 7 JIM: Okay, what -- okay. DAVID: You understand, they're --8 9 I thought you were in charge. 10 They're telling me, they're telling all night about all these, you know, things that you 11 12 all guys are doing around here, contrary against what 13 you're saying. 14 I -- Dave, between you and me, between JIM: you and me, now, I think some of the guys are getting 15 16 apprehensive in there, seeing --17 DAVID: Oh, definitely. JIM: -- seeing the bushes and the shadows, 18 because there's nobody been up that close. 19 20 DAVID: (Laughs.) 21 It's not true. I mean, we're, those JIM: 22 23 DAVID: Do you know the tank just, just last night, came right out here and drove right beside us on 24 our, on our, on our power plant side of the building. 25 Maneuvered around and came right down and maneuvered

1 2 JIM: Well, that was a shift change, 3 probably. 4 DAVID: -- by the -- It's not supposed to be on our property. 5 6 JIM: Yeah, well, yeah, I understand what 7 you're saying. 8 DAVID: You know, and they, and right out here, they, they drove over our guard shack on our 9 10 property. 11 JIM: Um-hum. 12 DAVID: They drove over the blue, the blue 13 building. David, while, while they're delivering 14 JIM: that telephone, can we talk about Cyrus for a minute? 15 16 DAVID: Sure we can talk about Cyrus. 17 JIM: Rachel asked about him going with his grandmother. 18 DAVID: Well, that's, that's what, that's 19 20 what they want. But we already know what the law is. JIM: Well, we called Child Protective 21 Services, okay? And we said look, this boy's in here 22 and his grandmother lives in Chandler, Texas. 23 24 DAVID: Um-hum. 25 JIM: And --DAVID: She's a nurse.

1 JIM: Yeah, and said what a, you know, what's 2 the deal here. And they said well, it's, you know, it's their policy to turn the children over to 3 relatives, and, and those -- and that's what they want to do. And we asked them specifically about, is it 5 Mrs. Haldeman? Haldeman or something? 7 DAVID: Um-hum. 8 JIM: And they said yeah, we don't -- they 9 said they didn't think there'd be an objection to that. 10 DAVID: But they haven't done that so far with any of the children. 11 12 JIM: No, no, all the children are kept together, okay. 13 14 DAVID: No, the -- they said they were putting them in foster homes temporarily. 15 16 JIM: No, no, they're still all together. 17 DAVID: Oh, okay. 18 JIM: Yeah. And they said that, you know, they're kind of -- 'cause they know each other and, and 19 what they wanted to do was keep them together. And 20 then when you guys walked out safely, they, they said 21 that, you know, the parents that are released, they 22 want to be able to give their children back to them. 23 And then --24 25 DAVID: Oh, Jim. JIM: Well, no --

1 DAVID: Okay, I'll be good, go ahead. 2 JIM: Hey, everybody -- you and I don't, both 3 know that everybody in there --4 DAVID: No, you're right. 5 JIM: -- is not gonna be charged. You know, 6 you and I both know that. I think --7 DAVID: Yeah, especially with, with the way it's looking right now, especially like the ATF agents 8 and some of the film coverage in regards to actually 9 who shot first and --10 11 JIM: Well, I --12 DAVID: They just said it was actually an accident. I mean, I was standing there in the door. I 13 was telling -- I was standing there in the door, they, 14 they did hear me say, you know, go back, there's women 15 and children here, let's talk about this. And, you 16 know, they, they did see me, you know --17 18 JIM: Yeah, I know. DAVID: They did see me fall back, you know, 19 when, when -- of course there's, all of a sudden 20 21 (Indiscernible) --22 JIM: Right. 23 DAVID: And you all did fire first and 24 everything. 25 JIM: There's some film of that, and, and

that'll get out in the court.

1 DAVID: That's right. 2 JIM: And that'll get out in the courtroom. 3 But --DAVID: But actually there's the agents who, 4 who admitted to it, that's the real important thing. 5 6 JIM: Well, that's, that's good for your, for your side. And the truth needs to come out, I think, 7 don't you? 8 9 DAVID: Oh, it will. 10 JIM: All right. Well, how, how about Cyrus? Now we've taken care of the telephone and the --11 12 DAVID: Well, it's, you know, Cyrus --13 JIM: -- and the dogs. I mean you --DAVID: Cyrus -- look, here's the children 14 that need to go to that, to that side, okay? 15 16 JIM: Okay. Tell me who they are. DAVID: I'm gonna, well, I'm just gonna give 17 you a few names at a time. 18 19 JIM: Okay. That's great. 20 DAVID: Okay? 21 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: Oh, see, you all ain't gonna do this. 22 23 I mean --24 JIM: Yeah, we'll take care of it, come on. 25 DAVID: Okay. Cyrus, Star, and Bobby. JIM: Cyrus, Star, and Bobby, okay.

1 JIM: I want, I want to get you, I want to get you --2 DAVID: -- the, the shrink that he used just, 3 4 with just the parts that I could use without any pain. 5 JIM: Listen, when, when -- and I, and listen, don't get me wrong. Don't get me wrong, I'm 6 7 not pushing you, but when you decide to come out, we're 8 going to make sure you get the best medical care and 9 get your strength back and get that fixed up, okay? 10 DAVID: Well, I'm drinking grape juice now because, like I said, the loss of blood was a lot. 11 12 JIM: I know it. DAVID: So as long as I'm in a prone 13 14 position, you know, my vital signs and all that are 15 good. 16 JIM: Um-hum. 17 DAVID: But it's like, it's just like any, it's like it, it's probably a bit of anemia because of 18 the loss of blood, and I need, I need just to build up 19 20 blood content a little bit. 21 JIM: All right. 22 DAVID: So we're, we're utilizing the proper 23 juices to do that with. 24 JIM: Okay. Well, think about walking out of there and getting some good medical care, and leading 25 all those people out. They need you.







DAVID: Maybe what, some of the things I say might, you know, might enlighten a little question within your own heart. You know, why does God tolerate sin? That's the first question. Why didn't God, when Adam and Eve sinned, why didn't God just wipe them out, and we wouldn't have all this today, would we?

JIM: Um-hum. That's right.

DAVID: I mean, you know, such suffering and sorrow. What kind of wisdom is applied in all of this? Well, remember the statement. Many people overlook it, but the whole story of creation basically starts like this: Moses wrote the first records of creation. Okay? And in the times of Egypt, when Egypt was the most predominant empire of its day, the Egyptian pharaohs believed that they were gods. You know, you understand that, don't you?

JIM: Yeah.

DAVID: They were worshipped as gods, and when they died, their whole families -- course you know, all the early --

JIM: They built the pyramids, right?

DAVID: Oh, well no, actually, Joseph was the one that gave the knowledge of the pyramids.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: You see, when you, when you read in



-

the scripture about the ark of the covenant, it talks about the covenant having oracles --

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: -- and having chains between the covenant and the oracles?

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: And you know, scholars, they're, they've always had a hard time interpreting certain words of the manuscript 'cause they don't understand what the words are.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: And that's why get a concordance and it says possibly unknown root word, could be this, that, this, that, and the other. They try to put a word in there in the line of the verse. But really, the way the sanctuary was built is that the ark of the covenant was designed to where it had a -- well, you know, science has already discovered this -- it had a high electrical current through it.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Very, very high electrical current.

And the purity of its gold and the fashionability of its structure permitted it to be used in a way to where God could communicate with a high priest. Well, what man fails to understand in regards to the records of, of Deuteronomy, Leviticus, and you know, all these



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testimonies or say chronicles and kings in regards to 2 this mysterious ark of the covenant, is that when men 3 such as Moses and the prophets were commanded to build these things, they were also assisted by higher intelligences. You know, we're talking about, we're 5 talking about beings from -- well, look, you've got a 7 sun, don't you? 8

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Did the sun come up this morning? Aren't you, aren't you on a ball, aren't you like, don't you have an atmosphere and everything, and don't you have certain laws of this nature and realm, to where you're on this planetary, basic ball and you're rotating it so much miles per hour, revolving around the sun, so many days per year. I mean, you are really on a path, you're traveling through space, aren't you.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: And you keep coming back around to the same place. Okay. Well, I mean, this is really unique, to think that we're flying out here, hung in the abyss of distance.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: You know? Now, the thing of it is, is that, as I say, it's not theoretical, it's scientific.

> JIM: Um-hum.



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DAVID: That from the beginning of time, the ancients, whether it be through poetic or whether it be through scripture, have always -- and this is not just a Judaism, this is, you know, from all your cultures, from all around the world. They talk about visitors from the stars who come here in some form or type of vehicle, right?

JIM: All right. Well, what would that be, a spaceship or something, hum? Sounds like.

DAVID: Well, remember, the spaceship concept is something that's not really understood until man finally reaches a point of evolution to where he finds out that he can, by wisdom, by the sermon of nature and the principles of construction to the laws of nature, he can fly. He -- the atmosphere is dense enough to be able to lift up the poundage that gravity holds down. You know, when you learn about energy and direction of energy, forces, the things of science, the natural energies, how to harness them, how to utilize them, then yes, man is, man has found the ability to, to strengthen then natural into the supernatural. What I mean is this: I mean that, to a primitive man or a man that's been separated from God, say from Eden, and has been left without the knowledge of the origin of creation, right?

JIM: Right.



DAVID: Man would find himself in a base, natural aftermath of nature or creation, such as the animals of the field, the natural source of the, the biological world, the geographical world, the nature of the world, and the natural habitat of nature, such as a man in Africa and a man in South America or a man in Alaska. You know, man will adapt to his nature, won't he.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: And what nature presents to him will make him natural man. The ability to eat, to survive, to procreate, are all the natural instincts of man. So that's why the Bible says that man, by nature, without the instruction of God, is a beast. He's like the beast of the field. Okay. But, whereas man becomes inspired when his mind is able to all of a sudden perceive a better way —
